ROME, February 17, 2015 (Zenit.org) - This morning, the Vatican announced the appointment of Archbishop Tito Yllana as Apostolic Nuncio to Australia. Archbishop Yllana, until now, has served as the Apostolic Nuncio to the Democratic Republic of Congo. Archbishop Yllana replaced Archbishop Paul Gallagher, who now serves at the Vatican's Secretary for Relations with States.

The Filipino Prelate studied international diplomacy at the Pontifical Ecclesiastical Academy in Rome and was named to his first post in 2001, as the Nuncio to Papua New Guinea. He has also served as the diplomatic representative to the Holy See in the Solomon Islands, Pakistan and the Congo. Following the announcement by the Holy See, Archbishop Denis Hart, president of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference expressed his gratitude to the Holy Father for the appointment and welcomed Archbishop Yllana.

"Archbishop Yllana brings wide and diverse experience, great faith and priestly gifts. We assure him of a warm and enthusiastic welcome upon his arrival and service here in Australia," said in a statement.

Pope Francis has told young people to have the courage to be happy, and to realize that God is always waiting for them with open arms. In his message for the 30th World Youth Day released today by the Vatican, the Pope said, "In Christ, you find fulfilled your every desire for goodness and happiness."

"He alone can satisfy your deepest longings," Francis continued, "which are so often clouded by deceptive worldly promises." While celebrated annually on Palm Sunday at the diocesan level, the next international World Youth Day will take place in Krakow, Poland in July 2016. In this year's message, the Holy Father reflected on the Beatitudes as a guide to the journey to Krakow. This year, specifically focuses on the 6th Beatitude, "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God" (Mt 5: 8).

While saying that the search for happiness is shared by people of all times and ages, he added that God has placed in the heart of every man and woman an irrepressible desire for happiness and for fulfillment.

"Have you not noticed that your hearts are restless, always searching for a treasure which can satisfy their thirst for the infinite?" he asked. "It is Jesus," the Pope reaffirmed, "who stirs in you the desire to do something great with your lives."

Through purity of heart, Francis said, this blessedness comes. He then pondered: In what, then, does the happiness born of a pure heart consist? The Pontiff warned against relationships which impurify and "defile" our hearts.

He stressed we must form our consciences rightly and sensibly, in order to discern what is good and acceptable and perfect. "My question to you is this: 'Are you praying?'" he asked. "Do you know that you can speak with Jesus, with the Father, with the Holy Spirit, as you speak to a friend? And not just any friend, but the greatest and most trusted of your friends."

Gospel Reflection

"Repent, and believe the Good News".

With these words Jesus begins his Public Ministry. And these words are now said to each person on Ash Wednesday as the ashes are placed on their forehead.

What does 'repent' really mean? It comes from the Greek word **metanoieo** which invites us to feel remorse, be converted, and turn our life around so that we are going in the opposite direction.

And 'believe', coming from the Greek word **pisteuo** is really about being convinced of the veracity (truthfulness) of something.

And what is it that turns our life around and convinces us about its truthfulness? The 'Good News' or euangellion in Greek. Originally meaning a reward given to a messenger who brought good tidings to the king, this word became synonymous with any good news. And in time it came to receive a specific Christian sense of the 'good news about God's love for humankind in His sending of His Son for the salvation of the world'.

So, this is what our Lenten season is all about, my friends: "Repent, and believe the Good News"!

Let's try to make these 40 days of preparation for Easter a time of conversion in our lives. Let's reflect on what blocks us from a closer relationship with Jesus, and then try to do something about turning ourselves around to face fully the road that leads to Him. In so doing, let's utilise the great Christian traditions of penance and sacrifice.

Furthermore, let's commit ourselves to seeking the healing touch of the Lord in Reconciliation, and of making amends in practical and concrete ways for past hurts. "Repent, and believe the Good News"!

Why we do what we do......

Why do Roman Catholics make the Sign of the Cross when they say, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit"?

Making the Sign of the Cross may be the most common of all actions that Catholics do. We make it when we begin and end our prayers; we make it when we enter and leave a church; we start each Mass with it; we may even make it when we hear the Holy Name taken in vain and when we pass a church where the Blessed Sacrament is reserved.

But do you know why we make the Sign of the Cross? The answer is both simple and profound.

In the Sign of the Cross, we profess the deepest mysteries of the Christian Faith: the Trinity - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - and the saving work of Christ on the Cross. The combination of the words and the action are a creed - a statement of belief. We mark ourselves as Christians through the Sign of the Cross.

And yet, because we make the Sign of the Cross so often, we may be tempted to rush through it, to say the words without listening to them, to ignore the symbolism of tracing the shape of the Cross on our own bodies. A creed is not simply a statement of belief--it is a vow to defend that belief, even if it means following Our Lord and Savior to our own cross.

One further note about the reader's question: Roman Catholics aren't the only Christians to make the Sign of the Cross. All Eastern Catholics and Eastern Orthodox do as well, along with many high-church Anglicans and Lutherans (and a smattering of other Mainline Protestants). Because it is a creed that all Christians can assent to, it shouldn't be thought of as just "a Catholic thing."


