Evangelicum

On November 15 Pope Francis reiterated his "profound sorrow" at the terrorist attacks in France.

After praying the midday Angelus with those gathered in St. Peter's Square, the Holy Father said, "To the president of the Republic of France and all of its citizens, I express my deepest sorrow. I feel particularly close to the families of those who lost their lives and the wounded."

"Such barbarity," the Pontiff continued, "leaves us stunned and makes us question how the heart of man could come up with and carry out such horrific acts, which have shattered not only France, but the whole world."

He condemned the "intolerable acts," as an "unspeakable attack on the dignity of the human person."

"I want to vigorously reaffirm that the path of violence and hate does not resolve the problems of humanity," the Pope declared. "And that to use the name of God to justify this path is blasphemy."

Francis invited those in the Square and those listening around the world to join in his own prayer for France: "Let us entrust the defenceless victims of this tragedy to the mercy of God. Virgin Mary, Mother of mercy, plant in the hearts of all thoughts of wisdom and resolutions of peace.

"We ask her to protect us and to watch over the beloved French nation, the eldest daughter of the Church, all of Europe and the whole world."

Gospel Reflection

Last Sunday we celebrated the end of the Church's Liturgical Year. Today, the First Sunday of Advent, is our liturgical "New Year's Day"! And the Liturgy for both Sundays has to do with the End of Time, that moment when we will encounter the Lord, the moment of Judgement, when all our deeds are weighed and a decision about future life *with* God or otherwise is made.

So, Jesus encourages us to "stay awake", to make ourselves ready for the End, the Judgement. Indeed, our *active waiting* on the Lord's Coming is emphasised in the Gospel from Luke: "Stay awake, praying at all times for the strength to survive all that is going to happen, and to stand with confidence before the Son of Man".

How do we do that? By being a person of moral integrity, someone who seeks after peace and justice, who is at all times ready to do what is right.

Paul says something similar in our Second reading: "...we are to be holy and blameless in the sight of God. This is the way God wants the faithful to live; this is our charter for living as we *wait patiently* for the End."

So, as we begin our Advent we are encouraged to be PATIENT. Indeed, when we look at life, WAITING is a major part of our human existence: we wait to be born, to go to school, to grow up, to be independent, to get a job, to find the right person for marriage; and we wait for a family, a home; we wait to retire; indeed, we wait to die!

Waiting is a necessary and integral part of our journey with the Lord! And our Advent Season, our preparation for Christmas, encourages us to reflect on the necessity of waiting as we wait for the Birth of the Saviour.

But what is important in all of this is the kind of waiting in which we engage: PATIENT EXPECTANT WAITING, IN READINESS FOR THE LORD'S ARRIVAL. This is our goal in life, something that should permeate our spiritual life.

Let's pray in the coming week that the Lord might gift us with PATIENCE as we WAIT for the Coming of Jesus Christ once again this year!


