From the Pastor's desk

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

Today's texts from the Word invite us to Rejoice! Christian Joy is not a passing enthusiasm which is aroused by the Word and quickly withers when the going gets rough (cf. Mark 4:16). Rather, it is an abiding quality that allows the followers of the Lord to endure with equanimity the ups and downs of life.

It is something deeper than the intense pleasure of the moment; it is something deeper than transitory happiness. It is that quality (a gift or grace from God) which allows the Christian believer to rejoice and be glad even in the midst of trials and tribulations. Hence the saints could speak of the 'joy of the Cross'!

And so, let's ask the Lord to gift us this day and for the coming Christmas Season with that Christian Joy which lasts forever!

- The traditional **'rooster masses'** commence this *Wednesday at 6am* followed by breakfast. All welcome. These masses are in addition to the regular timetable. Masses at Holy Cross are now suspended until Ash Wednesday (10/2/16).
- Please note the *Christmas Mass times in the Bulletin*: all masses are at the Church this year.
- There will also be a Midnight Mass (at 12:00am) on New Year's Eve; and a Midday Mass on New Year's Day.
- There will be *two Deanery Second Rites of Reconciliation* (Community celebrations with individual Confession) before Christmas. They are *Kellyville on Friday 18/12/15 at 7:30pm and at Richmond on Monday 21/12/15 also at 7:30pm*. I invite everyone to attend these, as there will only be our First (individual) Rites on Saturday afternoons (albeit starting earlier at 4:30) for the next two Saturdays. So, if you wish to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, I encourage you to attend one of the Deanery Second Rites!
- You may have noticed that the **Wise Men** are over near the Wall of Remembrance. They are not yet at the Manger. They are making a journey and will arrive for the Feast of the Epiphany in January. The Baby is missing, and will be placed in the Crib after the Midnight Mass!!
- Don't forget the *St. Vincent de Paul Christmas Hampers* and the delivery day of 14th December. See the Bulletin for more details.
- World Youth Day (WYD) are tickets still on sale after Masses. This weekend Krispy Kreme donuts for sale to help raise funds for those going to WYD.

Let us continue to pray for one another – especially in this busy time! God bless you all. Fr. John

Where does Jubilee come from? What does it mean?

The ancient prophet Isaiah heard the call to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour; to bring radical mercy into the lives of the broken-hearted, the captive, the imprisoned and the oppressed. (Isaiah 61)

Later, Jesus himself was anointed for and moved by this same mission of mercy! (Luke 4:18-19)

And today, all of us men, women and young people who form the Church, are again being called to make this mission real, as Pope Francis reminds us:

"Mercy is the very foundation of the Church's life. All of her pastoral activity should be caught up in the tenderness she makes present to believers: Nothing in her preaching and in her witness to the world can be lacking in mercy. The Church's very credibility is seen in how she shows merciful and compassionate love."

(Pope Francis – Misericordiae Vultus #10)

The old testament text from Leviticus Chapter 5 can help us to understand the meaning of a *jubilee* for the ancient people of Israel. Every fifty years a trumpet or jobel was sounded, calling them to a holy year. It was to be a time of reconciliation, of renewing good relations with God, with each other and with creation. It was to be done gratuitously .. hence spontaneously, without particular reason or judgement, but because it was good and wholesome. Both then and now, to act that way is to image the nature and abundance of God! Many things could be enabled by this special focus of gratuitousness, including the freeing of slaves, restoring of relations, newness of hope where poverty had struck as well as the forgiveness of debt.

The following words from Pope Francis' message ahead of the Krakow World Youth Day 2016 summarise something of what we are called both to receive and to be in this holy year: "Jesus Christ came to proclaim and bring about the Lord's everlasting time of grace. He brought good news to the poor, freedom to prisoners, sight to the blind and freedom to the oppressed (cf. Lk 4:18-19). In Jesus, and particularly in his Paschal Mystery, the deeper meaning of the jubilee is fully realized. When the Church proclaims a jubilee in the name of Christ, we are all invited to experience a wonderful time of grace. The Church must offer abundant signs of God's presence and closeness, and reawaken in people's hearts the ability to look to the essentials. In particular, this Holy Year of Mercy is a time for the Church to rediscover the meaning of the mission entrusted to her by the Lord on the day of Easter: to be a sign and an instrument of the Father's mercy."


What, then, must we do?

Gospel Reflection

Today is Gaudete Sunday, a day of rejoicing as we reach the half-way point in our Advent preparation for Christmas.

The First Reading from the Prophet Zephaniah is all about the joy that will exist in the hearts of God People when the days of Exile and Oppression are over.

The Gospel from Luke has the preaching of John the Baptism about

Jesus baptizing with the Holy Spirit and fire – burning away all evil so that all that remains is the joy of the Holy Spirit.

And St. Paul tells the Philippians that "the Lord is very near", and thus there is "no need to worry". The joy of believing in Christ and living the Gospel is at the heart of the Message.

So, ultimately, today we are invited to "rejoice! Again, I say, Rejoice!"

Prayer of Pope Francis for the Jubilee

Lord Jesus Christ,

you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him.

Show us your face and we will be saved.

Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured Paradise to the repentant thief.



Let us hear, as if addressed to each one of us, the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman: "If you knew the gift of God!"

You are the visible face of the invisible Father, of the God who manifests his power above all by forgiveness and mercy: let the Church be your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and glorified. You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error:

let everyone who approaches them feel sought after, loved, and forgiven by God.

Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind.

We ask this of you, Lord Jesus, through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy; you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever.

The coming of Jesus at Christmas established, in flesh and blood, the first contact of divinity with humanity, and effected the first transfusion between the two. Through this, humanity received new life and was lifted up towards its final and eternal glorification. — St. John XXIII, 25 July 1957

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary Mass on Tuesday, Dec. 8 heralded the start of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy proclaimed by Pope Francis last April 11 – "Dear brothers and sisters, I have often thought of how the Church may render more clear her mission to be a witness to mercy; and we have to make this journey. It is a journey which begins with spiritual conversion. Therefore, I have decided to announce an Extraordinary Jubilee which has at its centre the mercy of God. It will be a Holy Year of Mercy. We want to live in the light of the word of the Lord: "Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful" (cf. Lk 6:36). And this especially applies to confessors! So much mercy!".

Jubilee years are important as they allow the faithful to receive special indulgences, the highest form of forgiveness. Indulgences grant a full pardon from the temporal punishment for sins that have already been forgiven in confession. That translates as a shorter penance for the faithful to atone or a shorter time his or her soul will have to spend in purgatory. This Extraordinary Jubilee concludes on Sunday, 20 November 2016, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

We ask everyone to participate in the daily Novena Mass of the Rooster from Dec. 16 to 24 at 6 am. We also need host families for the Rosary statue for January and February 2016, so please contact me if you are interested to host our Mother in your home then.

The Institute for Mission (IFM) of the Parramatta Diocese is now accepting enrolments for the 2016 Certificate in Pastoral Formation course as well as the 2016 Beginning Theology (BT) program. Those who would like more information on these courses may go to ifm.org.au for online queries. Also, the IFM Liturgical Ministry Formation Courses commence on 22 February 2016, so you may contact the Parish Office, Bob Agbulos or myself for enrolment forms.

Why we do what we do.....

ABOUT MISA DE GALLO:

- Spanish for "rooster's mass", also Misa de los Pastores, "shepherd's mass"; Portuguese: Missa do Galo - is the Roman Catholic name for the Mass celebrated around midnight of Christmas Eve.

Misa de Gallo in different countries:

SPAIN - Spain, locals begin Christmas Eve by lighting small oil lamps in every home, then proceed to church to hear Midnight Mass. The most popular of these holy services is in the Basilica de Montserrat also known as Santa Maria de Montserrat, a Benedictine monastery built on the steep cliffs of the Montserrat mountain range. The Escolania de Montserrat, Europe's oldest boys' choir known for their angelic voices, graces the celebration.

BOLIVIA - Bolivians attend Christmas Eve mass, and the celebration is followed by a sit-down meal featuring a traditional bowl of picana del pollo. It is a stew made of chicken with peas, carrots, and potatoes.

PHILIPPINES - Simbáng Gabi (Tagalog for "night Mass"), is the Filipino version of the Misa de Aguinaldo and traditionally begins on December 16 and ends on December 24. The celebration is held at around four o'clock in the morning. Pope Sixtus V ordered that Mass be heard before sunrise since it was the harvest season, and the farmers needed to be in the fields right after the celebration. White is the liturgical

colour authorised solely for Masses celebrated within the context of the novena: violet is used for any other Masses said during the day, as these are still considered part of the Advent season. A well-known folk belief among Filipinos is that if a devotee completed all nine days of the Simbáng Gabi, a request made as part of the novena may be granted. Similar to the Spanish tradition of lighting small oil lamps on Christmas Eve, Filipinos adorn their homes with paról, which are colourful star-shaped lantern. This is believed to have originally been used by worshippers to light their way to church in the early morning, as well as to symbolise the Star of Bethlehem. Paróls continue to be popular yuletide decorations in the Philippines, as iconic and emblematic as Christmas trees are in the West. After Mass, Filipinos buy and eat holiday delicacies sold in the churchyard for breakfast. Bibingka, (rice cakes cooked above and below) and puto bumbong (steamed purple rice pastries, seasoned with butter, grated coconut, and brown sugar) are popular, often paired with tsokolate (hot chocolate from local cacao) or salabát (ginger tisane).

PUERTO RICO - In Puerto Rico, the Misa de Gallo is only one of a series of masses during dawn called "Misa de Aguinaldo". The name comes from the Spanish word for "Christmas box". The masses are held for nine days and culminate on Christmas Eve. Puerto Ricans celebrate the mass by singing Christmas songs, which

Children's

Working with Children Check

For anyone who is volunteering to work in a child related area in our Parish, please ensure that you have done your Working with Children Check. Once you have received your confirmation letter from Services NSW, please submit this to the Parish Office.

This is a government legislation we need to follow and will be submitted as well to Parramatta Guardian Diocese. Thank you.

What is a Working With Children Check?

A Working With Children Check is a requirement for people who work or volunteer in child-related work. It involves a national criminal history check and a review of findings of workplace misconduct.

The result of a Working With Children Check is either a clearance to work with children for five years, or a bar against working with children. Cleared applicants are subject to ongoing monitoring and relevant new records may lead to the clearance being revoked.

The Working With Children Check is fully portable so it can be used for any paid or unpaid child-related work in NSW for as long as the worker remains cleared.


