#### From the Pastor's Desk

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

Happy Easter! Together with Fr. Robert, Deacon Tan and the whole Parish Team, may I wish each and every one of you a Happy and Blessed Easter, as we all celebrate the great gift of New Life in Jesus Christ which is ours through His Death and Resurrection! May Easter 2016 be a time of blessings for you and, indeed for all in our world, especially for those who have little to celebrate in these days due to war, conflict, or famine. As we enjoy our Easter Eggs (and so we should after 40 days of Lent!!), let us spare a thought and a prayer for all those who still suffer the pain of the Cross.

Could I also take this opportunity, once again on behalf of the Parish Team, to thank all those generous parishioners who have given so much time and effort in the preparations and celebration of our Holy Week and Easter liturgies. Unless you are 'behind the scenes' you don't realise how much work is done. So, a great big Thank You to all of you - you know who you are!

And to all those who come to Mass at this time of year, may I congratulate you on maintaining your Faith in Jesus Christ. It is never easy to live a Christian lifestyle, because God in Christ asks us to be counter-cultural; that is, to resist the *mores* (ethics) of the contemporary world. From the earliest days of Christianity followers of Jesus have been invited the embrace the Cross - and we have, so that we and others can experience also the joys of the Resurrection - and the New Life it brings. Part of the Cross in this contemporary age is to remain steadfast in our Faith and its ethical practice, even when the media and so many of our friends and relatives condemn Christ and/or His Church in so many ways. Despite the foibles and sins of members of the Church, we who have been gifted with Faith look beyond the very human side of the Christian Community and see the Divine Presence at work in the midst of the messiness of humankind. Let us never lose sight of the Truth which sets us free!

#### Evangelicum

"God's way of acting may seem so far removed from our own, that he was annihilated for our sake, while it seems difficult for us to even forget ourselves a little." Exactly one week before Easter Sunday, Pope Francis made this point and reminded the faithful that Jesus humbled and emptied Himself for us, and we are to start living as He taught us to. In his homily



in St. Peter's Square, Francis stressed that Jesus comes to save us and we are not to follow 'our way,' but choose His, namely "the way of service, of giving, of forgetfulness of ourselves." "Let us walk this path," the Pope encouraged, "pausing in these days to gaze upon the Crucifix, the 'royal seat of God,' to learn about the humble love which saves and gives life, so that we may give up all selfishness, and the seeking of power and fame." By humbling himself, the Pope explained, Jesus invited us to walk on his path. "Let us turn our faces to him, let us ask for the grace to understand something of the mystery of his obliteration for our sake; and then, in silence, let us contemplate the mystery of this Week." Just as Jesus entered Jerusalem, He desires to enter our cities and our lives, the Pope said. Through the power of His divine love, the Holy Father highlighted, the Lord forgives our sins and reconciles us to the Father and with ourselves. "May nothing prevent us from finding in Him the source of our joy, true joy, which abides and brings peace; for it is Jesus alone who saves us from the snares of sin, death, fear and sadness." The Holy Week and Easter Liturgy, the Pope recalled, teaches us that the Lord has not saved us by 'His triumphal entry or by means of powerful miracles,' but by humbling and emptying himself.

These two verbs, the Jesuit Pope pointed out, show the boundlessness of God's love for us. "Jesus emptied himself: He did not cling to the glory that was His as the Son of God, but became the Son of Man in order to be in solidarity with us sinners in all things; yet He was without sin." Even more, Francis said, Jesus lived in the condition "not of a king or a prince," but "of a servant." Experiencing utmost humility, and resisting temptations, Jesus forgives those who are crucifying Him. "If the mystery of evil is unfathomable, then the reality of Love poured out through Him is infinite, reaching even to the tomb and to hell," the Pope said, noting He took upon Himself all our pain. Stressing how Jesus' self sacrifice brought light to darkness, life to death, love to hatred, Francis called on faithful to examine how they can better live 'God's way' in their lives.

Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

#### Reflection on Easter Celebrations

Many of us return to our Faith and its practice at Christmas and Easter. Why? I would venture to suggest that it is more than simply custom or family celebrations that bring us together in the Father's House at this time. Rather, it is because these two celebrations have to do with Life: New Life at Christmas, celebrating the Birth of Jesus; New Life at Easter, celebrating the Rebirth of Christ. And all of us want to celebrated this greatest of all gifts: Life!

Furthermore, Easter is a time of Renewal for many of us.

Firstly, after the Lenten penances caused us to reflect on the practice of our Faith, we find ourselves ready to renew our commitment to the Lord. Having asked ourselves where Christ is in our daily lives, we find that we need to turn back to the One who is all good, and resolve to live our Christianity in conjunction with other Christians - through our participation in the Eucharist (Mass) each week, and through our faithful celebration of the Sacraments.

Secondly, Easter is not only a time of renewal for the practice of our Faith, it is also a time of renewal for our relationship with God. We know that the pressures of contemporary living can weigh heavily upon us; we are all so 'busy'! Yet, our celebration of Easter allows us a few moments to open ourselves up to the Resurrection Experience which does indeed transform our lives. Celebrating the

Rebirth of the Lord reminds us that the old life of neglecting the spiritual dimension can also be transformed, if we but surrender to the Holy Spirit's action.

And Thirdly, Easter is a time of renewing our baptismal commitments to be "Christ" to others. We are the ones who have to stand up and be counted in an increasingly secular and sometimes violent world. We are the ones who attempt to bring peace and healing to those who suffer and are broken. We are the ones who are commissioned from the day of our Baptism to care for the weak and defenceless, the poor and oppressed.

And so, we gather at Easter and celebrate!

Let's ask ourselves three questions: Have I been the source of New Life for others? Have I maintained my relationship of love with God? Have I done all I can to be part of the Christian Community, the Church, and serve my neighbour?

We are an Easter People and our song is Alleluia = Praise the Lord!

Let's strive to make the Lord's Resurrection a reality in our daily lives, so that we live each moment filled with the Holy Spirit and faithful to the New Life given to the world that first Easter day!



#### Why we do what we do......

#### Why Do We Celebrate Easter?

We celebrate Easter because it commemorates the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Christians believe that Jesus was killed by crucifixion on a Friday and then actually came back to life on the following Sunday.

Some may ask, "So what?" Why is it important that Jesus rose from the dead?

There are many answers to that question, including the fact that Jesus predicted this miracle ahead of time as proof that he is the Son of God. But today I want to highlight a passage from 1 Cor. 15 where the apostle Paul explains why the resurrection is important to believers in a very practical way.

But if it is preached that Christ has been raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God, for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either. And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men (1 Cor. 15:12-19).

Christ's resurrection is the central teaching of Christianity. According to Paul, if he wasn't resurrected, then Christianity is a complete sham; all who believe in Christ for salvation are still in their sins and to be pitied if Christ was not raised.

For those of us who are believers, the resurrection is extremely important. If Christ was not raised, we have no hope.

But Paul does not leave us hanging. In verse 20, he makes clear what really occurred: "But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Cor. 15:20).

Paul concludes his treatment of the resurrection with these words: "Death has been swallowed up in victory" (1 Cor. 15:54).


