ECCLESIAL REFLECTIONS

Chapter seven: “Towards a better education of children” (259-290)

The seventh chapter is dedicated to the education of children: their ethical formation, the learning of discipline which can include punishment, patient realism, sex education, passing on the faith and, more generally, family life as an educational context. The practical wisdom present in each paragraph is remarkable, above all the attention given to those gradual, small steps “that can be understood, accepted and appreciated” (AL 271).

There is a particularly interesting and pedagogically fundamental paragraph in which Francis clearly states that “obsession, however, is not education. We cannot control every situation that a child may experience... If parents are obsessed with always knowing where their children are and controlling all their movements, they will seek only to dominate space. But this is no way to educate, strengthen and prepare their children to face challenges. What is most important is the ability lovingly to help them grow in freedom, maturity, overall discipline and real autonomy” (AL 260).

The notable section on education in sexuality is very expressively entitled: “Yes to sex education”. The need is there, and we have to ask “if our educational institutions have taken up this challenge ... in an age when sexuality tends to be trivialized and impoverished”. Sound education needs to be carried out “within the broader framework of an education for love, for mutual self-giving” (AL 280). The text warns that the expression ‘safe sex’ conveys “a negative attitude towards the natural procreative finality of sexuality, as if an eventual child were an enemy to be protected against. This way of thinking promotes narcissism and aggressivity in place of acceptance” (AL 283).

Chapter eight: “Guiding, discerning and integrating weakness” (291-312)

The eighth chapter is an invitation to mercy and pastoral discernment in situations that do not fully match what the Lord proposes. The Pope uses three very important verbs: guiding, discerning and integrating, which are fundamental in addressing fragile, complex or irregular situations. The chapter has sections on the need for gradualness in pastoral care; the importance of discernment; norms and mitigating circumstances in pastoral discernment; and finally what the Pope calls the “logic of pastoral mercy”. Chapter eight is very sensitive. In reading it one must remember that “the Church’s task is often like that of a field hospital” (AL 291). Here the Holy Father grapples with the findings of the Synods on controversial issues. He reaffirms what Christian marriage is and adds that “some forms of union radically contradict this ideal, while others realize it in at least a partial and analogous way”. The Church therefore “does not disregard the constructive elements in those situations which do not yet or no longer correspond to her teaching on marriage” (AL 292). ***(To be continued)***

Gospel Reflection

We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity today. The readings speak to us of the various way that the infinite God is understood by us finite human beings.

In the first reading from the Book of Proverbs, "Wisdom "is personified and said to be the helping– companion of God. The texts concerning wisdom in the OT paved the way for later Christian understanding of the Trinity. Indeed, in the NT Jesus is spoken of as the “wisdom that became incarnate”, and the Holy Spirit is called “the wisdom of God”,

The excerpt from St Paul’s letter to the Romans (our Second Reading) mentions in one pericope what later came to be called the three persons of the Trinity: Jesus is the peacemaker, trying to set in motion the love of the Father for everyone; and the Holy Spirit pours God’s love into our hearts.

And John’s Gospel (written after 60 years of reflection on the person of Christ and his Teaching) speaks a language that expresses the unity of action of the Spirit, the Son and Father. Indeed, as our text for Trinity Sunday reminds, us the Spirit’s role is to remind people what Jesus taught and to enlighten generations to come. And what Jesus taught was given to him by the Father.

So our texts today all speak of the mystery of the Trinity, expressing the loving roles of the Father Son and Spirit within God.

Unless we imitate God’s unconditional love then we fail to be truly followers of Jesus Christ. Indeed, Christian life is all about imitating the love of the Trinity: it is a total love for others; a willingness to be loved by others; and a readiness to spread love to all. Let’s pray this week that we may allow the unconditional love of the Trinity to be a reality in our lives, so that we will mirror God’s triune love to all!

Why we do what we do.....

We enjoy singing. It's fun. Music plays a big part in our lives and we take satisfaction in using it to express our hearts and as a tool to explore our relationships with God. It's good for us. But that's not why we sing.

Singing connects us to one another. It's an activity we do together that is an important part of the glue of what we do when we gather. It's an expression of our identity and our relationship with one another. But that's not why we sing.

Singing is a way of serving the Lord. We honor Him by doing our part in providing the congregation with an environment, an opportunity, and an invitation to worship our King. We honor Him by setting aside our pride and trying to model worship and to be willing to make ourselves vulnerable by showing others our hearts as we interact with Him publicly. But that's not why we sing.

Singing impacts my mind. The lyrics of songs teach profound truths about God. Songs reinforce biblical values and are part of transforming our minds by moving our thoughts beyond ourselves to focus upon Jesus. But that's not why we sing.

Singing is a way of our giving back to God. It's part of our sacrifice of praise that we prepare and offer to the Lord. Through it we express recognition and thanksgiving to our Creator and Redeemer. Preparing an offering of music is like raising the sacrificial lamb to present at the altar as a special gift that each of us give

personally to the Lord. But that's not why we sing.

Singing is a form of prayer. The songs provide us with a vocabulary to express and explore who God is and to declare what He is doing in our lives. Moments during a song when we are not singing provide little pauses to pray our own thoughts to the Lord and to listen to what He has to say. But that's not why we sing.

Singing is tied to the promises of God. God promises to show up in a special way when we gather in His name according to His purposes. He literally "indwells" the praises of His people. He promises to draw near to us as we draw near to Him. Scripture ties music to spiritual and physical freedom from bondage, to healing, miracles, repentance, and other holy actions by the Lord. But that's not why we sing.

Singing impacts my body. It forces us to become physically involved when we express worship. This reminder of our own weakness and flesh is another part of giving ourselves as living sacrifices to the Lord. But that's not why we sing.

Singing is something the Bible commands us to do. We are far more often commanded to sing that almost anything else in the Bible. God built us to sing; we are designed for it. He invented music before He even created us, and we are specially crafted so that it powerfully impacts us as well as the spiritual realm. When we sing, we obey God's command. But that's not why we sing.

Why we do.....

Singing affects our emotions. Music bypasses our mental filters and stirs our passion. It challenges us to arise from the depths of our emotional slumber and coldness, fanning the flames of our hearts to burn brightly for the Lord. But that's not why we sing.

Worship is one of the few things that we know goes on in Heaven. It's powerful enough to shake Heaven's very gates. Music accompanied many major events in the Bible. It led God's people forward in battle. Even Jesus' birth was announced through song, as will be His triumphant return. But that's not why we sing.

Why do we sing? One simple reason. **God deserves our praise.** This is good and right and true. But worshipping the Lord is something that we each must decide to do for ourselves. We choose to sing. How dare we arrogantly decide that He should not receive something that He declares He wants? Do we know better than He does whether the noise we make is good enough when He says it is? Who are we to judge our worship – when that right belongs only to Him.

We must not withhold from the Lord the glory that is due to Him from ourselves.

That's why we sing.

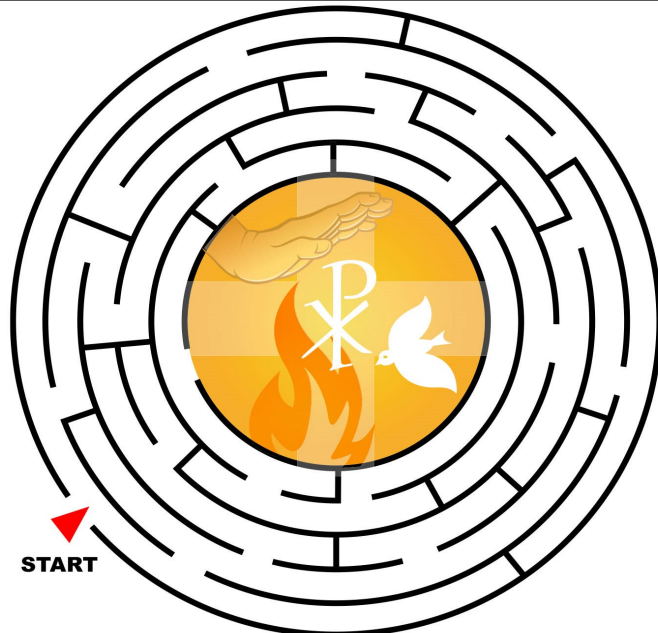
