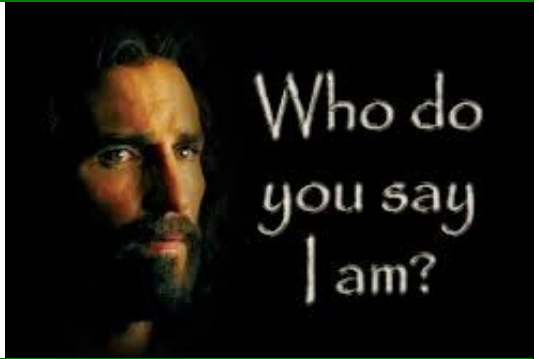

Dear Sisters and brothers in Christ

Jesus invites us to take up our cross daily and follow him to calvary. This is never comfortable but it is our Christian calling. In the week ahead, let's reflect on today's Gospel text from Luke and determine whether or not we need to recommit ourselves to their fundamental step in Christian discipleship.

Mary Magdalene Will Be Celebrated With Liturgical Feast

Pope Francis has raised the celebration of the memorial of St. Mary Magdalene to the dignity of a liturgical Feast, recognizing the importance of her role as the “apostle to the apostles.”

In the modern Church calendar, saints may be commemorated with a memorial (optional or obligatory), feast, or solemnity. By making the commemoration of Mary Magdalene a feast, it is elevated to the same grade as that of the apostles.

In a letter announcing the change, made in a decree signed 3 June 2016, the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart, the Secretary of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, Archbishop Arthur Roche, writes the decision means one “should reflect more deeply on the dignity of women, the New Evangelization, and the greatness of the mystery of Divine Mercy.”

Mary Magdalene was the first witness to the Resurrection, and is the one who announced the event to the Apostles.

“Saint Mary Magdalene is an example of true and authentic evangelization; she is an evangelist who announces the joyful central message of Easter,” he writes.

“The Holy Father Francis took this decision precisely in the context of the Jubilee of Mercy to signify the importance of this woman who showed a great love for Christ and was much loved by Christ,” writes Archbishop Roche.

He also notes Saint Mary Magdalene was referred to as the “Apostle of the Apostles” (Apostolorum Apostola) by Thomas Aquinas, since she announced to them the Resurrection, and they, in turn, announced it to the whole world.

“Therefore it is right that the liturgical celebration of this woman has the same grade of feast given to the celebration of the apostles in the General Roman Calendar, and shines a light on the special mission of this woman, who is an example and model for every woman in the Church.”

Gospel

Luke 9:18-24

You are the Messiah sent by God. It is necessary for the Son of Man to suffer much.

One day when Jesus was praying alone in the presence of his disciples he put this question to them, 'Who do the crowds say I am?' And they answered, 'John the Baptist; others Elijah; and others say one of the ancient prophets come back to life.' 'But you,' he said, 'who do you say I am?' It was Peter who spoke up. 'The Christ of God,' he said. But he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone anything about this.

'The Son of Man', he said, 'is destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes and to be put to death, and to be raised up on the third day.'

Then to all he said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross every day and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, that man will save it.'

The Gospel of the Lord.

Gospel Reflection

If you need to hear good music, you need to have a good sound system. A basic sound system needs two types of elements namely a tweeter and a woofer. A tweeter captures the high frequency transmissions and accounts for the brilliance of the sound. On the other hand, the woofer captures the low frequency sounds and accounts for the basic rhythm of a piece. We need both to be able to hear the full sound of a piece of music as the composer intended.

The Jews had grand and glorious hopes for the Messiah. The prophets said that the Messiah would set everything right, restore Israel's glory and transform the people. Those prophecies can be considered the 'tweeter' prophecies of the Old Testament tradition. Today's first reading from the prophet Zechariah shows us one of those references. "They will look on him whom they have pierced and from him will come a fountain to purify sin." These were the 'woofer' prophecies of the Jewish tradition.

This 'tweeter' and the 'woofer' prophecies, the Messiah of power and glory and that of the mysterious suffering savior, existed side by side for centuries until the moment in today's Gospel reading. Here for the first time, Jesus connects them. He says that the Messiah would be the one to suffer and through His death will rise to a new life that would be released into the lives of all who follow Him. So we have the combined sound of all Hebrew prophecy about the Messiah, that is tweeter and woofer together. Jesus says further that we follow Him by carrying our cross. Everyone has a cross. We don't have to hunt for symbolic crosses to carry. These crosses come into our life sometimes occasionally and sometimes in bunches. Jesus states that we must carry our cross every day to be the faithful disciple.

Whether our cross burdens us like the cross of physical suffering or emotional pain or whether our cross deepens us like the cross of fidelity, commitment or vocation, the cross is the place where we touch the hand of Christ in our life. Our cross opens us to the truth not only about the world but also about our self.

Our readings today remind us of the 'tweeter' and 'woofer' of Christian discipleship. We are earthen vessels, vulnerable and fragile in every part. But we are also called to indestructible life and glory. What binds the two in our life is Christ. Our fragile self is clothed with His grace and power so that in Christ we can carry any cross and fight any temptation.

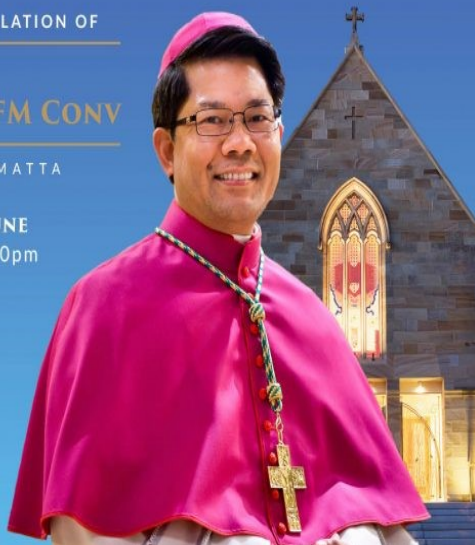

GTK meets every second and fourth Sunday of the month, starting at 4.30pm with some afternoon tea and games in St Mark's staff room – rain, hail or shine! We then share the Gospel, engaging in interesting discussions and activities based on the day's Gospel reading.

Something to look forward to is our involvement in the 6.00pm mass.

Ignite is our new contemporary young adult's group in the parish, for those aged between 18 and 35. We meet once a month to explore and delve deeper into understanding our Catholic faith especially in relation to modern society. Each month, we have prominent members within the faith joining us as guest speakers to share their knowledge and understanding of the Church's teachings on subjects that directly relate to young adults.

Ignite meetings are held every third Sunday of each month at St Mark's staffroom from 7.15pm to 9:00pm. 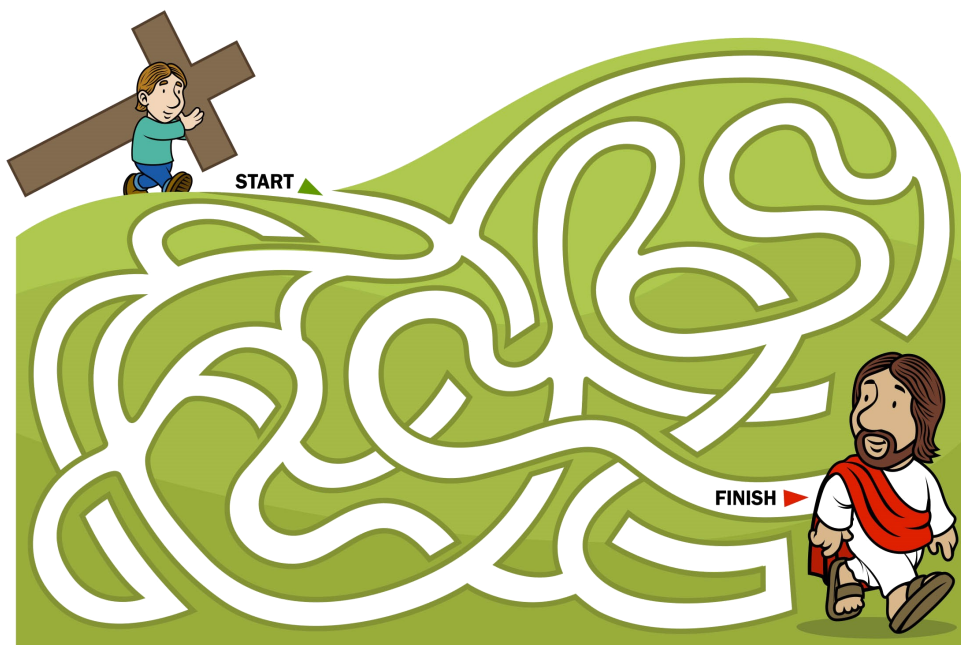
