Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel, Jesus states that the door that leads to life is narrow while the one that leads to ruin is wide and many are those who take the wide door. The narrow door indicates a life of difficulties, inconveniences, sufferings while the wide door stands for a life of ease, comfort and enjoyment. In the light of Jesus' teaching and in the light of the history of man we see that the modern man's quest to make life more and more comfortable is not a healthy sign. The sins of greed, dishonesty, extortion, violence, bribery and immorality and so on that man is tempted to commit in his blind rush for a comfortable life and this quest is never satisfied. But the way of salvation is a life of simplicity, hard work and concern for fellow beings. This is the kind of life Jesus lived and we shall do well to follow his example.

Whether we as Catholics follow through on that opportunity and let the life of the Church transform us is another question. The Lord says that to claim a right to enter through the door because we ate and drank with Him, because we bear His name, because we are in His Church, because we have heard His words are not enough. People can say that they went to a Catholic school, sang in the choir, said many prayers every day, sat through many tedious sermons, but the question is whether we were changed by all that. If not, the Lord will say, "I don't know you".

This Gospel reading about the door carries some searching challenges for each of us. Rather than considering how many will enter the door of the Kingdom, are we entering through the door? Are we using the opportunities and graces given us in the Church or are we only multiplying the motions of religion as a substitute for the very real conversion that must take place?

God speaks in some way to the life of every person. To some people it is a haunting and distant echo. For us in the Church God's word is loud and clear. Salvation is not a matter of hearing God's word but of following it. Through following that word, we will pass through the door that, although narrow, is the portal to the wide open spaces of God's life forever.

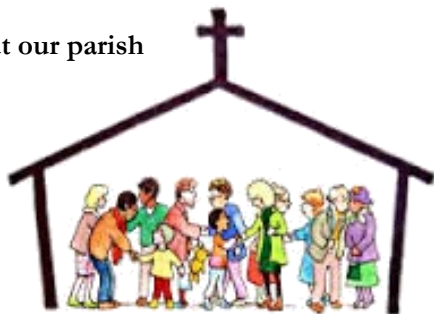

Why we do what we do...

Can you explain how solemnities, feasts, and memorials differ?

What is the difference between a memorial and a feast on the Church calendar? The key says solemnities, feast days, and memorials are capitalized. How do you know which are feasts and which are memorials and what is the difference?

A solemnity is the highest rank of celebration and is identified in the calendar with an S. Easter, Christmas, All Saints Day, the Ascension, Corpus Christi, and other celebrations of events in our Lord's life on earth and certain saints are solemnities. The Gloria and Creed are always said on such days. Solemnities are like Sundays, though most of them are not days of obligation.

Feasts are the next rank down and are identified with an F. They consist of the celebration of certain saints like the feast of the Archangels or most of the Apostles. The Gloria is required on these days, but not the Creed.

Memorials are the lowest rank and are simply the celebrations of most of the saints. The Gloria is not said on these days. Obligatory memorials, identified with a capital M, must be observed. Optional memorials, identified with an m, may be observed but such observation is not required.
