We are a team dedicated to looking after the pastoral needs of the parishioners. Our services include:

1. **Bereavement support group:** A sub-group of volunteers carefully selected for their ability to give moral support to the grieving family and any minor funeral planning tasks.
2. **Communion to the sick/home visits:** For any enquiries, please contact Dita at bgbanez@bigpond.com
3. **Vinnies Group** (Working together with Social Justice)
4. **Seasons for Growth:** Started by the Sisters of St Joseph, Seasons for Growth is an education program focused on building emotional resilience during times of significant life changes such as loss, death, divorce and other major loss experiences. This program is facilitated by trained Seasons for Growth companions from our Parish.
5. **Suicide Intervention:** A small support group of trained volunteers with a specific skill set to help those feeling depressed and/or suicidal. This is NOT a counselling service
6. **Pastoral Care in Schools** (TBC)

Gospel Reflection

Jesus has kept on giving his instructions on the meaning of true faith on his way to Jerusalem. The ten lepers are aware that Jesus alone can give them the wholeness of body. In turning to Jesus, and asking for his mercy, they make their first steps towards true faith. In their brokenness of body, they look to Jesus as their hope for salvation.

Out of the ten, nine went on their journey to see the priest to fulfill the Law so that they can become part of the people. They were cured but they were moving away from Jesus, towards the priest and the fulfilment of the Law.

One man does not complete that journey into the heart of Israel. He has come to realize that the true source of the wholeness of body he has received is the person of Jesus himself. It is to Jesus that he must return.

Only one of these ten lepers has been made clean through his faith. It is not enough to recognize that Jesus is the answer to our needs. It is not even enough to respond obediently to everything that he asks from us. The other nine lepers had done that. For true faith there is a need to place all one's trust and confidence in Jesus alone as the one who performs the works of God in our lives. As we accept the good things that come our way, let us not fail to recognize and to thank God for his healing and saving power, given to us in our Church through the presence of Jesus Christ.

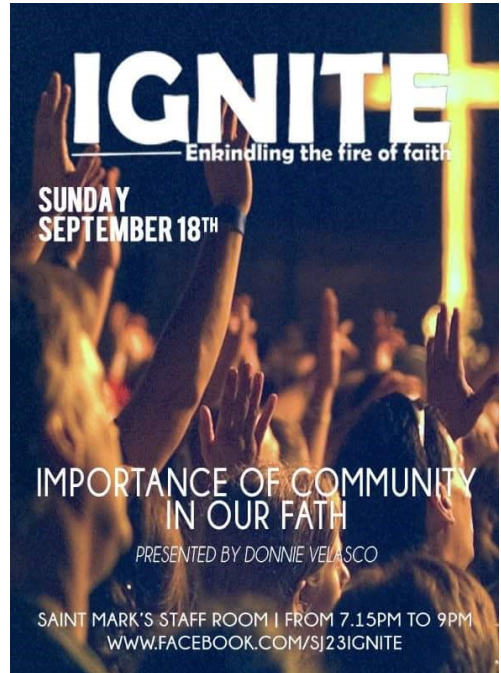
Altar Server Training

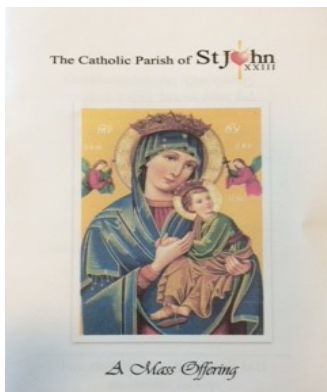

Why we do what we do...

Why have Parish Pastoral Councils?

Parish Pastoral Councils are one of the structures that were strongly recommended by the Bishops of the Second Vatican Council. The purpose of the councils was seen as furthering the work of the Church by fostering the spiritual growth of parishioners and leading them to respond actively to their universal call to mission.

– *Handbook for Parish Pastoral Councils*

In dioceses, as far as possible, councils should be set up to assist the Church's apostolic work, whether in the field of making the gospel known and people holy or in charitable, social or other spheres. – *Vatican II, Decree on the Apostolate of Lay People, 26.*

Role of a Pastoral Council

The Pastoral Council's role is to promote the Church's mission to live and communicate the love and values of Christ in our world. The Pastoral Council shares in the responsibility for the ongoing life and development of the faith community, working together with parishioners to provide support for their efforts to live as followers of Christ.

In order to fulfil its role, the Pastoral Council will:

- ⇒ search out and respond to the hopes, ideas, needs and concerns of parishioners
- ⇒ grow in knowledge and awareness of what is already happening in the parish
- ⇒ encourage and support the good work of existing groups with the parish
- ⇒ set long-term and short-term pastoral goals for the parish
- ⇒ provide opportunities for parishioners to grow in their relationship with God and with each other
- ⇒ develop, implement and improve parish initiatives that assist parishioners in their continuing efforts to live as effective Christians in society

– *Handbook for Parish Pastoral Councils*

Pastoral Council Composition

The “refreshed” SJ23 PPC will be comprised of 4 elected and 3 appointed parishioners and will start on 1 January 2017. Every two years thereafter, there will be elections to determine the composition of the PPC.

In addition, it may include ex-officio members who have been invited to participate because of their role in the community, for example, the School Principals, a Parish Finance Committee member and the Parish Business Manager.

Nomination and election dates – November 2016, to be confirmed.

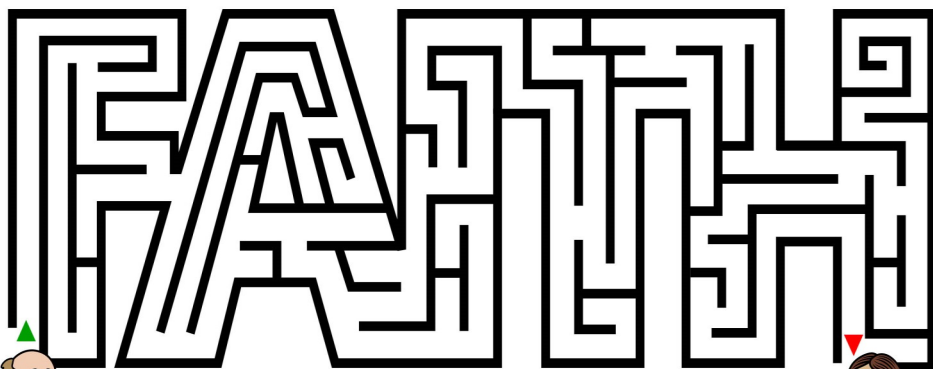
