Parish Pastoral Council

The new Parish Pastoral Council (elections in November) will coordinate 6 ministry and administration groups. Each week we will outline one of these groups and how you can contribute your time and talents. This week we cover the Evangelisation Group -

EVANGELISATION

Coordinator – Helen Zammit

This group has a number of ministries:

Sacramental preparation - This ministry is responsible for the training and implementation of the sacraments throughout the year. The sacraments include Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

Baptism preparation - This program is for families wishing to have their children receive the sacrament of Baptism and be embraced in the Catholic faith.

SRE (Special Religious Education) - Otherwise known as scripture, this ministry allows catholic parishioners to go into state schools in the local area to teach the Catholic children about the Catholic faith. We go into the State schools once a week for half an hour each week.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) - This is a program for adults and/or young people who wish to join the Catholic faith or for Catholics who just wish to learn more about their faith.

Marriage preparation - In the future the parish will be offering its own series of evenings for engaged couples who will be taking the next step to their relationship. This will be led by generous married couples from our parish.

Social Justice - This ministry will be reformed. It's role is to involve the whole parish in the mission of social services.

Jesus,' he said 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.' 'Indeed, I promise you,' he replied 'today you will be with me in paradise.'

Gospel Reflection

As a Christian, don't you find the strangeness in the liturgical celebration of our king? Instead of a celebration of some glorious enthronement, we read about a man on a cross. We could also see a proclamation of the strangeness of God's ways when the truth is nailed above his head: 'This is the King of the Jews'.

Once these truths have been subtly proclaimed through the abuse of those who have crucified him and the title nailed above his head, Jesus begins to exercise his kingship. Throughout the entire Gospel we have seen Jesus seeking out and saving the lost one. Sunday after Sunday our readings have reminded us of Jesus' mission to the lost one. Now that Jesus has been lifted up on his cross as King, a further 'lost one' comes to life. Recognizing Jesus' innocence, a criminal asks of his new-found King: 'Remember me when you come into your kingdom', and he is told: 'Today you will be with me in paradise'.

The kingship of Jesus, alive today in the Church, is not a kingship which exercises itself through absolute authority and power. It is a kingship which is universal in its loving search for the lost one. 'Today you will be with me in paradise' is a word that the Church of all times must proclaim to all who look in hope towards the crucified Jesus as their king.




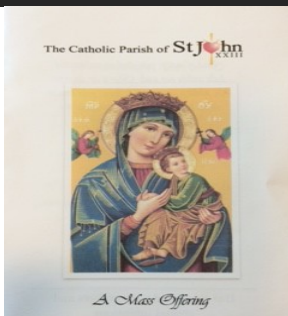

Why we do what we do...

Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

The Feast of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as an antidote to secularism, a way of life which leaves God out of man's thinking and living and organizes his life as if God did not exist. The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.

Today's Mass establishes the titles for Christ's royalty over men: 1) Christ is God, the Creator of the universe and hence wields a supreme power over all things; "All things were created by Him"; 2) Christ is our Redeemer, He purchased us by His precious Blood, and made us His property and possession; 3) Christ is Head of the Church, "holding in all things the primacy"; 4) God bestowed upon Christ the nations of the world as His special possession and dominion.

Today's Mass also describes the qualities of Christ's kingdom. This kingdom is: 1) supreme, extending not only to all people but also to their princes and kings; 2) universal, extending to all nations and to all places; 3) eternal, for "The Lord shall sit a King forever"; 4) spiritual, Christ's "kingdom is not of this world". — Rt. Rev. Msgr. Rudolph G. Gandas

Before the reform of the Roman Calendar in 1969, this feast was celebrated on the last Sunday of October.
