Gospel Reflection

Jesus tells the parable of the wise and foolish virgins, teaching his disciples the importance of being prepared to receive the Kingdom of Heaven.

In this week's Gospel, Jesus talks about what it means to be prepared to receive the Kingdom of Heaven. This week's reading follows a series of warnings and predictions by Jesus about the coming of the Son of Man. Jesus wants his disciples to understand that the exact day and time cannot be predicted. He teaches the disciples that they must remain vigilant so that they will not be caught unprepared.

When thinking about the parable of the wise and foolish virgins, it is important to consider the first-century wedding traditions of Palestine. Scholars tell us that it was the custom of the day for young maidens—friends and family members of the bride—to meet the bridegroom when he came to bring his bride to her new home.

As with many of Jesus' parables, several levels of interpretation are possible. In last week's Gospel, we heard Jesus warn against following the example of the Pharisees and scribes. If read in the context of early Christianity's struggle to define itself against Pharisaic Judaism, this parable is a continuing critique of Judaism. It suggests that the Jewish leaders were like the foolish virgins, unprepared to meet Jesus, the bridegroom of Israel.

In the chapter preceding this parable, however, Jesus warns about the destruction of Jerusalem, the tribulation of the end times, and the coming of the Son of Man. When read in this context, today's parable is a warning to the Christian community to remain vigilant and prepared to receive Jesus, the Son of Man who will return at the end of time. This interpretation is supported by the reference to the delay of the bridegroom. The Christian community for whom Matthew wrote this Gospel was coming to terms with the realization that the promise of Jesus' return would not be fulfilled within their lifetimes. The question remains for us to ask ourselves, Are we ready to receive Jesus? Will we be prepared to receive him?


G o s p e 1 *Matthew 25:1-13*



Why we do what we do

The Meaning Of Feast Days In Our Lives

In our Church Christ is the central figure of our faith and lives. The Church throughout the year has numerous feastdays in order to celebrate the events that relate to the earthly life of our Lord, our Lady Theotokos and the Saints of the Church.

These Feastdays are called Despotic, Theometoric or Feastdays of Saints.

We call Despotic Feastdays, those which are related to the person of our Lord Jesus Christ. Some of these feastdays are movable and some are fixed. When we refer to fixed feastdays we mean those that occur on the same month and date each year. Some of these are:

- Christmas on the 25th December
- The Circumcision of our Lord on the 1st of January
- Theophany on the 6th January (the day of our Lord's Baptism)
- The Churching of Lord, where He was received into the Temple by Simeon the Prophet and also the churching of Panagia - the 40 day blessing on the 2nd February
- The Transfiguration of our Lord, this is celebrated on the 6th August.
- The elevation of the Holy Cross is celebrated on the 14th September.

We also have the movable Despotic feasts which are:

- Palm Sunday
- Holy Week
- Pascha or Easter (The Resurrection of our Lord)
- The Ascension of our Lord
- The Pentecost.

These Despotic feast days are all depend on Easter. Just as Easter is not celebrated on the same day each year neither are these feasts. These feast days that occur before or after Easter depend on the date that Easter is celebrated. The date for Easter is calculated by a set formula and then the other dates fall into place.

For example Palm Sunday is always one week before Easter Day, the Ascension marks the end of the 40 days that The Resurrected Christ spent with His disciples and others before ascending to the Father in Heaven.

The Pentecost as its very name suggests, occurs 50 days after Easter or 10 days after the Ascension - here Jesus' promise that He will send the Comfortor to guide the disciples and the Church in His earthly absence is fulfilled.

FEASTS OF THE MOTHER OF GOD

Apart from the Despotic feasts, we also have the Feasts of the Mother of God. They are given this name because they relate to some event that we celebrate from the life of the Mother of God. These are:

- The birthday of Maria the Theotokos on the 8th of September.
- The Entrance of the Theotokos on the 21st of November, when her parents fulfilled their promise to dedicate Mary to the service of God. Mary was taken to the Temple at the age of 3.
- The Annunciation of the Theotokos on the 25th of March - when the angel Gabriel brought Mary the news that she was to give birth to a child by the Holy Spirit as part of God's plan to bring the Messiah or Saviour Jesus Christ into the world.

The Dormition of the Theotokos celebrated on the 15th August.



and bishops of our Church) the Holy Fathers of our Church; the prophets; the angels and archangels.

THE PURPOSE OF THE FEASTS

The purpose of all the Feasts of our Church is to help us feel and understand the importance of the Despotic, Theomitoric and other Feast Days.

When we celebrate the Saints of our Church we are inspired by their examples and we ask them to intercede on our behalf to God for our spiritual welfare.

HOW SHOULD WE CELEBRATE THESE IMPORTANT FEAST DAYS OF OUR FAITH

To deepen our understanding of Feast Days by:-

- regularly attending the Holy Eucharist Services.
- studying the particular Despotic or Theomitoric event or studying the Saint's life whose feast we celebrate.

 honouring and imitating the Saint's life or event that we celebrate in a spirit consistent with the life and Holy example of those events or Saints.

At times there is great misunderstanding in the way that these Holy events are celebrated. It is disrespectful and a grave sin to celebrate such Holy events in ways that are not consistent with our Christian identity. Let young and old ensure that they celebrate these feasts of our Church in a proper manner.

These feasts give us excellent opportunities to participate in the Life of Worship in our Church.
