Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

In our second reading for the 18th Sunday in Ordinary time (B), the author of Ephesians encourages us "not to go on living the aimless kind of life that pagans live."

And in our Gospel Jesus invites his hearers in Capernaum to be committed to Him as the one sent by the Father.

Both realize the danger that exists for all of us if we don't have God as the centre and goal of our existence.

So our friends, if we continually strive to follow Christ, we are also accepting the life he offers. We no longer live an aimless kind of life that unbelievers can fall victim to. We are no longer slaves to fad and fashion, to the pressure of the peer-group or a cynical post-modern society.

Commitment to Christ leads to real freedom for he tells us:

"I am the Bread of life. The one who comes to me will never be hungry; the one who believes in me will never thirst."

Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15

I will rain bread from heaven upon you.

The whole community of the sons of Israel began to complain against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness and said to them, 'Why did we not die at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, when we were able to sit down to pans of meat and could eat bread to our heart's content! As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death!'

Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Now I will rain down bread for you from the heavens. Each day the people are to go out and gather the day's portion; I propose to test them in this way to see whether they will follow my law or not.'

'I have heard the complaints of the sons of Israel. Say this to them, "Between the two evenings you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have bread to your heart's content. Then you will learn that I, the Lord, am your God."' And so it came about: quails flew up in the evening, and they covered the camp; in the morning there was a coating of dew all round the camp. When the coating of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was a thing delicate, powdery, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When they saw this, the sons of Israel said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That' said Moses to them 'is the bread the Lord gives you to eat.'

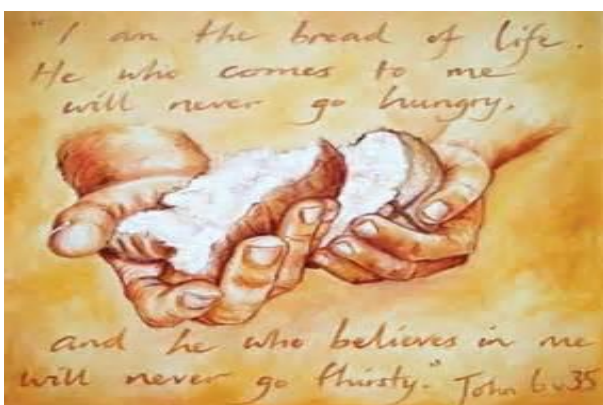
Ps 77:3-4, 23-25, 54

SUGGESTION BOX RESPONSES

Our suggestion box in the foyer gathers a number of comments and suggestions from parishioners. As most are anonymous we aren't able to respond directly, so in this new column we will endeavour to address many of those contributions.

Q. On First Fridays when benediction is scheduled after mass, the gap between the end of mass and the commencement of benediction should be curtailed to the minimum. On a recent occasion this exceeded 15 minutes or more. If the desire is to spend time in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, this can be done after the benediction. Is the exposure of the Blessed Sacrament really necessary for such adoration?

A. Shorter expositions of the Eucharist are to be arranged in such a way that the blessing with the Eucharist is preceded by a suitable period for readings of the word of God, songs, prayers, and sufficient time for silent prayer. Exposition which is held exclusively for the giving of benediction is prohibited.

The ordinary minister for exposition of the Eucharist is a priest or deacon. In the absence of a priest or deacon, an acolyte or special minister of communion or member of a religious community or of a lay association which is devoted to Eucharistic adoration, upon appointment by the local Ordinary (parish priest), may expose the Eucharist.

(Decree – Sacred Congregation for Divine Worship)

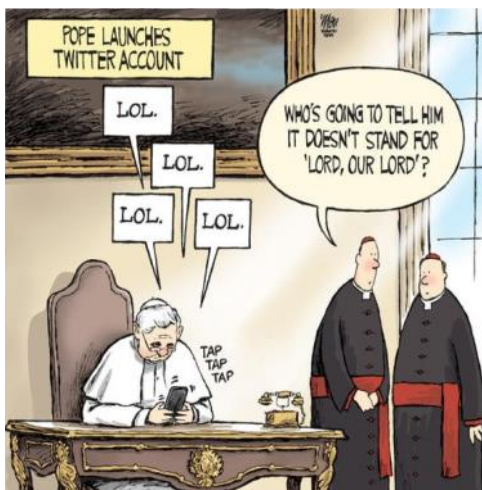

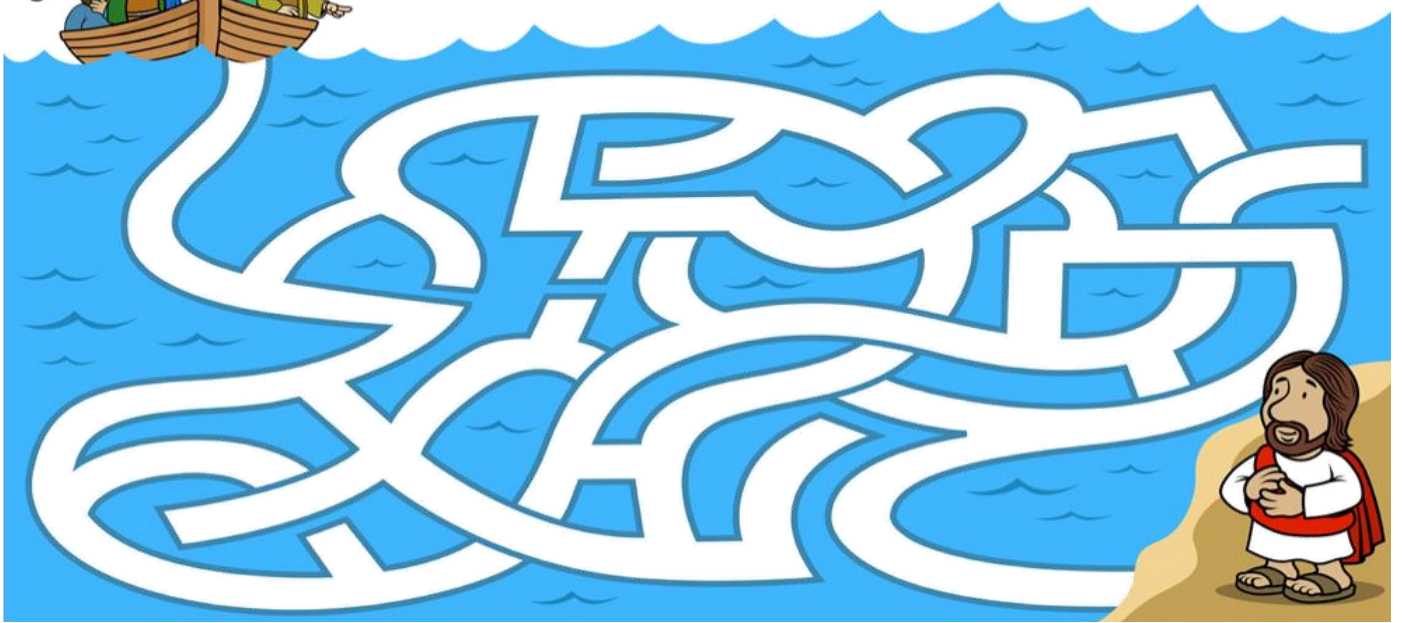
