From the Pastor's desk

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

As many of you are aware, I suffered a stroke in January 2014 while I was Dean of St Patrick's Cathedral. After some rehabilitation and rest I was (happily) transferred to this parish after the untimely death of Fr Dave Hume. And so, since July 1st, 2014, I have been blessed to be Parish Priest of St John XXIII Parish, Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens.

Since arriving I have had a number of health issues that have been resolved to a certain extent. However, there is another result of my stroke that needs attention. And so, as a result, the Bishop has agreed that I have 4-6 weeks Sick Leave from Sunday 24th February to deal with these further physical and emotional issues.

Accordingly, Fr Thomas will be 'in charge' in my absence - similar to when I'm on Annual Leave. Supply priests will cover the Sunday morning masses during this period and I thank Fathers Robert Anderson and Michael O'Callaghan in advance for their generosity.

Later in the year I will be on Sabbatical - from mid-August until the first week of December. During that period the Bishop will appoint an Administrator to our Parish. I have been blessed with approval to attend the Tantur Institute in Jerusalem for the 13-week Biblical and Spiritual Sabbatical Programme. It will be good to receive some input once again, it's been nearly 30 years since I completed my post-Graduate Studies.

So, as it turns out, I will have a number of absences from you this coming year: but all with the express aim of rest, rehabilitation and renewal so that I can serve you to the best of my ability in the years ahead.

Please keep me in your prayers, as I keep you in mine.

PLENARY COUNCIL 2020

Pope Francis has spoken of the need to engage in the world and respond in faith. He said:

"The defining aspect of this change of epoch is that things are no longer in their place. Our previous ways of explaining the world and relationships, good and bad, no longer appears to work. The way in which we locate ourselves in history has changed. Things we thought would never happen, or that we never thought we would see, we are experiencing now, and we dare not even imagine the future. That which appeared normal to us — family, the Church, society and the world — will probably no longer seem that way. We cannot simply wait for what we are experiencing to pass, under the illusion that things will return to being how they were before."

The journey toward the Plenary Council will help us to prepare to listen to God by listening to one another. We invite all people to engage, to be a part of the listening and dialogue encounter in the next two years.

WHAT IS A PLENARY COUNCIL

A Plenary Council is the highest formal gathering of all local churches in a country. Our Plenary Council 2020 is being held so that we can dialogue about the future of the Catholic Church in Australia.

Plenary Council will be held in two sessions. The first will be held in late 2020 (possibly October) and the second session will be held in mid-2021 (possibly in May).




