Twenty Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time 22 September 2019

Reflection on the Readings

Jesus, surprisingly, found something appealing about this steward who was in the rapacious lending business. What was it? Faced with the news that he was about to lose his position, his catastrophic reversal of fortune, he cut a deal with his debtors to help secure his future. Jesus gave him full marks for being astute and shrewd.

Jesus laments the fact that many of his followers, 'children of the light,' are not as smart in the face of the Great Reversal – which He is inaugurating in which 'the hungry will be filled with good things and the rich sent empty away' (Mary's Magnificat).

We should be using our money ('mammon') to alleviate the myriad hungers of the world, not to buy our way into Heaven, but so that we become the sort of person who will be able to enjoy the heavenly companionship of those who hungered.

We could take a moment to pause and take stock of the use of our resources which are *passing*, so that we may be received into the *eternal* habitation.

For there is only one God, and there is only one mediator between God and mankind, himself a man, Christ Jesus, who sacrificed himself as a ransom for them all. He is the evidence of this, sent at the appointed time, and I have been named a herald and apostle of it and - I am telling the truth and no lie - a teacher of the faith and the truth to the pagans.

In every place, then, I want the men to lift their hands up reverently in prayer, with no anger or argument.

2019 Vinnies Community Sleepout Western Sydney

Rose Franco, Ana Perez, Debra Pitre, Margaret Harrison and Roger Perera who are members of Stanhope St Vincent de Paul conference took part in Vinnies Community Sleepout on Friday the 30 August. The objective of the night was to experience what if feels to be homeless sleeping rough in the cold windy weather.

Do you know that there are more than 116,000 Australians experiencing homelessness each night? Alarmingly, approximately 60,000 of these are under the age of 35, and more than 17,000 children under the age of 12 don't have a stable place to call home. Mental health, Depression, Abuse, Family breakdown, High cost of living, unsteady jobs can push anyone falling into homelessness.

We were given soup and one bread roll for dinner and a cardboard box as bedding. Participants had the opportunity to listen to a father and son sharing their experiences of homelessness due to drug and alcohol issues who have now been reformed due to the support of the good work done by Vinnies. It was a great experience to taste what it's like to sleep rough for the night and getting a chance to meet and chat with other like-minded individuals before bedding down within the Western Sydney University campus.

The sleepout was targeted to raise \$80,000 and so far \$75,709.86 have been raised. Donations are accepted until end of this month. With your generous support our Stanhope conference raised \$2,368.75.

These funds will be used to support people experiencing homelessness and those at risk of homelessness so that their lives can be rebuilt and reconnected again with the community.


