Fifth Sunday of Lent 29 March 2020

Message from Father John

Last week we heard about the Healing of the Man Born Blind, and how Jesus led him from the darkness of unbelief to the Light of Faith.

Today's Text from St John - concerning the Raising of Lazarus - is the final moment in the Fourth Gospel's Seven Signs of Jesus which occur during his Public Ministry.

In raising his close friend, Jesus foreshadows his own Resurrection; and he demonstrates that the Son has power over everything, including death.

In these dark times of Pandemic, we have to trust that the Light of Christ will burn brightly, leading us forward to New Life.

- Although our Church buildings may be closed
- Although our Liturgies may be suspended

Although we cannot receive the Sacraments as we did Christ is still present in each one of us! The Light of Christ burns within us, gifting us with hope. Christ lives within each of us in his resurrected and eternal state. And so, as the living Body of Christ, we, the Church, will continue living our Faith... And even in separation and self-isolation, we are not alone... we remain together in spirit. And the Lord is with us!

During these difficult times - and during what may lie ahead.....

- Let's continue faithful to the Lord in word and practice;
- Let's pray for each other as often as we can;
- Let's pray for the sick and dying throughout our world;

And let's remain full of hope... for the Lord who raised Lazarus from death will raise us up from any disaster that may lie ahead!

While we cannot celebrate mass or the sacraments while our church is closed, we realise many people have health conditions or need help in some other way, such as shopping.

To enable us to improve and extend our communication to members of our parish we are updating the parish database.

In the next day or say you will receive a brief survey form which we would ask you to complete and return to us as soon as possible. All information will be treated in confidence and only used for parish pastoral activities.

I know these times will be difficult for some, but let's try and see the weeks and months to come as a type of extended Lenten Penance for us all. We must continue as best we can during this time of darkness until the Light of the Risen Christ shines upon us once again in the future.

Let's continue to pray for each other, and especially for those who are ill.

Let us read the scriptures every day, pray the rosary as a family where possible, and call upon the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes during the days ahead.

⇒ New Mass and church building guidelines

The Diocese of Parramatta issued new guidelines to clergy and parishes based on the new government directives around social and religious space, that came into effect at midday Monday, 23 March 2020. These new Diocesan guidelines have also been made available to the general public at https://parracatholic.org/covid19/

Church buildings are closed and Masses (both indoors and outdoors) are to cease. Funerals and weddings are allowed to take place with strict social distancing required by the government. Only emergency baptisms will continue at this point, with each priest/deacon to use their own discretion on how to handle these as long as social distancing rules are observed.

\Rightarrow Confessions

While the church is closed, there will be time for confessions in the Garden of Remembrance from 9.00-10.00am and 5.00-6.00pm every Saturday (weather permitting), or upon request.





During this time when we are no longer able to gather to celebrate the Eucharist, Liturgy Help has enabled free access to all parishioners in the Diocese of Parramatta. We hope that Catholics in social isolation can gain a sense of prayerful solidarity with their local faith communities and the whole Body of Christ.

The sisters Martha and Mary sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'

Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judaea.' On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said:

'I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?'

Yes, Lord,' she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.' Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said, 'See how much he loved him!' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?' Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening. Jesus said, 'Take the stone away.' Martha said to him, 'Lord, by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.' Jesus replied, 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said:

'Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer. I knew indeed that you always hear me, but I speak for the sake of all these who stand round me, so that they may believe it was you who sent me.'



Pastoral letter to the clergy, religious and people of Parramatta during the coronavirus crisis

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Many of us feel powerless in the face of this corona virus pandemic. We see in a devastating way how widely a virus spreads person to person and the immense damage it is doing to our community.

We are indeed living in a time of great crisis locally and globally. So, it is only human that we will experience considerable fear and anxiety.

However, as people of faith in Jesus of Nazareth, we are called to place our trust in our God who promises to be present with us even in these times of great suffering and sickness.

Even in his seeming absence, we still place our hope in the One who loves us tenderly and with great mercy. And so, as responsible citizens and faithful Catholics, in solidarity with our wonderful doctors and health professionals, our first rule must be: "**Do no harm**."

That means not doing anything that might spread the virus to others with whom we live in community. We need to listen to our medical experts and not to conspiracy theorists who use any crisis to profiteer or stir up hatred and division.

We must also comply with the directives of our government authorities for the sake of the common good. The gospel calls us to practice such solidarity in these difficult days.

As many of you already know I have <u>issued a statement</u> which involves the closure of churches and the curtailment of our regular worship practices until this crisis abates.

Please adhere strictly to these directives that I have given. Further updates can be found here: www.parracatholic.org/covid19 as the situation we are in is so fast changing and complex.

All of us in the Diocese of Parramatta must follow these guidelines without exception, so that we can be like St Joseph: 'Protectors of Life'.

Becoming 'Protectors of Life' will certainly demand of us sacrifices. Let's especially not forget the suffering in our midst: the elderly, the weak, the disabled, the homeless, the unemployed et cetera. Let us not forget vulnerable groups and communities: the indigenous, the asylum seekers in detention, prisoners et cetera.

Then there are also those whom the Catholic Church through the traditional Lenten Project Compassion supports.

In previous ages before germs and viruses were understood, people blamed strangers, Jews and 'outsider's' for sickness. Anyone who was different could be the target of people's fear.

So, let us in these days be especially mindful of caring with compassion and charity for any persons in community who are on the 'margins': be they the aged, the chronically ill and all those living in poverty and isolation. Let our love for them be real and concrete.

May we also use these days to deepen our prayer and spiritual lives. Even as we mourn our losses, Pope Francis encourages us, "Let us call upon him today, firmly rooted in prayer, for without prayer all our activity risks being fruitless and our message empty." (Evangelii Gaudium, no. 259)

So please visit our diocesan website at www.parracatholic.org/covid19 for some good and helpful information about how we can follow this path of deeper prayer. It includes online liturgy resources for personal and family prayer and various options for viewing Mass on-line and meditating on the daily scripture readings.

The coronavirus crisis strikes fear and anxiety into people across the globe. It also reveals deep cultural prejudices and divisions against the elderly, the weak and even those of certain race and ethnicity.

Our faith makes us step beyond these human boundaries. It expands our horizons and pushes the limits of our capacity to love.

Through the example of Jesus, we are called to embrace those vulnerable in our society and reach out to them. It is not the time to look after ourselves only but to care for others, through our prayers, acts of kindness and deep communion with them.


May these days of suffering and fear draw us ever close to Christ and let's all pray with Pope Francis to Mary, our mother: (page 7)

Important update COVID-19

The Catholic Diocese of Parramatta has issued the following directive. Please note:

From 20 March 'Catholics from the diocese of Parramatta are... dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice (*Canon 1248.2 and Catechism 2181*)'.

This means that no one is required to attend Sunday Mass for the foreseeable future!

FURTHER TO FRIDAY'S GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCEMENT ABOUT SOCIAL DISTANCING, ALL SUNDAY AND WEEKDAY MASSES ARE CANCELLED at St John XXIII.

- Marriages and Baptisms may proceed but must be limited to those directly involved: Bridal Party and immediate family of the Bride and Groom - for weddings; parents and godparents only - for Baptisms. No friends or relatives beyond the immediate family may attend. This is a Diocesan rule. Given this, I would strongly suggest that those affected consider postponing their Ceremony where possible.
- 2. Funerals may go ahead, but only the immediate family may attend.
- 3. For all these ceremonies, including weekday mass, the social distancing requirement of 1.5m applies. People may have spread out in our Church!
- 4. All meetings relating to parish life are to be suspended forthwith
- 5. Reconciliation and Anointing are still available when requested, but all social distancing and hygiene norms will need to be maintained. Communion to the sick will be available when requested, but only the priests and deacon may take communion to the sick.
- 6. The parish office will remain open next week, but with limited hours yet to be advised. We may have to close the Office in the future with personnel working from Home, but this is not the case as yet.
- 7. Of course, the priests and Deacon are still available for any urgent pastoral care in the days and weeks ahead.

Stay tuned for further updates!

I know these decisions will be difficult for some, but let's try and see the weeks and months to come as a type of extended Lenten Penance for us all. We must continue as best we can during this time of darkness until the Light of the Risen Christ shines upon us once again in the future.

Let's continue to pray for each other, and especially for those who are ill.

Let us read the scriptures every day, pray the rosary as a family where possible, and call upon the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes during the days ahead.




