Sixteenth Sunday Ordinary Time 19 July 2020

Reflection

Jesus employs the use of parables often to speak about the Kingdom of God. Through parables, particularly in this Sunday's reading, Jesus invites us to become a part of the Kingdom by allowing the word of God to take root in our lives; by nurturing it to its maturity, the word of God continues to be spread.

In the parable of the sower, once God's word has taken root in the life of a believer, the true disciple is recognized by the fruits of the maturing seed. Because God gifted human beings with free will at Creation, each person can choose to be a part of the Kingdom or not. The parables Jesus tells are to help us reflect on our lives and discern whether we are examples of Christ in the world. Being a follower of Jesus means we choose to enter into the Kingdom, allowing the word of God to be transformed into good deeds in our lives. For Jesus's disciples, a life of good deeds must be coupled with a life that makes time for prayer. Through prayer, the disciple becomes aware of the movement of the Spirit of God in her or his life—rooting the word of God more deeply in the fertile soil of her or his life.

The word of God, which is compiled in the Bible, serves as a source of God's Revelation. Therefore, it is essential that every believer know and read the Scriptures, because they are the source of divine inspiration. The reading of the Scriptures, in turn, will help the disciple pray more easily.



Please arrive at least 15mins before the mass times to give time for registration confirmation.

ARRIVING AT CHURCH

If you are not feeling well, DO NOT come into church.

Entry is via the side door next to the kitchen. Exit is via the front door.

- Wash your hands with soap and water before leaving home.
- Provide social space in entering the building, at least 1.5m apart.
- Use the hand sanitiser provided after signing in.
- Sit at pews that are not taped off (every other one will be closed). There is a limit of one individual or family unit at each end of the pew.

COMMUNION PROCEDURES

- Communion, only under the form of the host, will only be offered in the hand.
- Remember to keep your distance, watching the markings on the floor.
- Follow the signs on the floor.

MASS DEPARTURE PROCEDURES Exit is via the front door.

- Priests and staff will not be able to talk with you as you leave, but please know we truly care about you and offer you our greeting.
- There will be no hospitality after any Mass. Please do not stop and visit others. Once in the parking lot and, maintaining distance of a car width between you, you may visit with friends and others. Just because we are being cautious does not mean people cannot be friendly.

Let them grow together until the harvest.

Jesus put a parable before the crowds, "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn."

He put another parable before them, 'The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the biggest shrub of all and becomes a tree so that the birds of the air come and shelter in its branches.'

He told them another parable, 'The kingdom of heaven is like the yeast a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour till it was leavened all through.'

In all this Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables; indeed he would never speak to them except in parables. This was to fulfil the prophecy:

I will speak to you in parables and expound things hidden since the foundation of the world.

Then, leaving the crowds, he went to the house; and his disciples came to him and said, 'Explain the parable about the darnel in the field to us.' He said in reply, 'The sower of the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world; the good seed is the subjects of the kingdom; the darnel, the subjects of the evil one; the enemy who sowed them, the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; the reapers are the angels. Well then, just as the darnel is gathered up and burnt in the fire, so it will be at the end of time. The Son of Man will send his angels and they will gather out of his kingdom all things that provoke offences and all who do evil, and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth. Then the virtuous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Listen, anyone who has ears!'
