Reflection

Today's readings invite us to look at Elijah and Peter; both have an important personal encounter with God. Meeting God does not come without its difficulties.

After a long walk, on the holy mountain, Elijah waits until God walks past. Elijah has to understand that God is not in the big demonstrations, but in the stillness. It takes faith to wait through big events to meet and experience God in silence.

In the gospel, Peter and the apostles are struggling against the rough seas when Jesus approaches their boat, walking on water. Does Peter really trust that it is Jesus out there on the waters, when he asks permission to step out on the stormy seas? Does he really expect to be able to walk on water on Jesus' bidding? Peter gets out of the boat and starts walking towards Jesus, but then doubt comes in and he starts to sink. Jesus reprimands Peter: "Man of little faith, why did you doubt?"

- ◆ Fr Zvonimir will return towards the end of this coming week, so there will still be a Liturgy of the Word on Monday and Tuesday this week.
- ◆ The Solemnity of the Assumption is Saturday 15th August. Vigil Mass Friday 7.30pm; Saturday morning at 9am. Saturday evening is the Vigil Mass for Sunday.
- ◆ We are back to our normal Sunday morning Mass times – 7.30am, 9.00am & 10.30am.
- ◆ Please arrive 15mins before the mass times to give time for registration confirmation. Doors will close at start of Mass, as we cannot risk more than 95 people being in the church.
- ◆ Our Diocese has strongly recommended the wearing of face masks in church – and we have come to the rescue! We will soon be taking orders for these triple-layer, washable masks, with the SJ23 logo for \$20.00. It is recommended that you have at least two masks, one to wear and one in the wash. The price is dependent on us getting at least 200 orders, so stand by to place your order in the coming days.

ARRIVING AT CHURCH

If you are not feeling well, DO NOT come into church.

Entry is via the front door. Distancing is to be observed. Follow the white dots on the ground to maintain distance.

- Wash your hands with soap and water before leaving home.
- Provide social space in entering the building, at least 1.5m apart.
- Use the hand sanitiser provided after signing in.
- Sit at pews that are not taped off (*every other one will be closed*). There is a limit of one individual or family unit at each end of the pew.

COMMUNION PROCEDURES

- Communion, only under the form of the host, will only be offered in the hand.
- Remember to keep your distance, watching the markings on the floor.
- Follow the signs on the floor.

MASS DEPARTURE PROCEDURES

Exit is via the front and rear doors.

- Priests and staff will not be able to talk with you as you leave, but please know we truly care about you and offer you our greeting.
- There will be no hospitality after any Mass. Please do not stop and visit others. Once in the parking lot and, maintaining distance of a car width between you, you may visit with friends and others. Just because we are being cautious does not mean people cannot be friendly.
- We encourage everyone to contribute financially as you leave by using the **TapnGo** machines or online via **BPoint**. We have **TapnGo** at both the doors. We also have collection boxes at the front door.
