Message from Father Jolly

Dear and beloved parishioners

If you or someone you know does not have computer access or require assistance, please call Tanya, our Parish Secretary, on 8883 5981, Tuesday to Friday, 10.00am-12. noon and she will be able to book for you.

Please arrive 15mins before the mass times to give time for registration confirmation and ensure safety sitting inside the church.

Arriving early will also give you time for reflection and prayer, quiet your thoughts before we start our communion with God.

Doors will close at start of Mass.

If you are not feeling well, DO NOT come into church.

ARRIVING AT CHURCH FOR SUNDAY MASSES

It is highly recommended to wear face mask at church.

Entry is via the front door. Distancing is to be observed.

- Wash your hands with soap and water before leaving home.
- Provide social space in entering the building, at least 1.5m apart.
- Use the hand sanitiser provided after signing in.
- If you have not registered through our **Eventbrite**, please sign in on the register sheet at the entrance.
- Sit at pews that are not taped off (every other one will be closed). There is a limit of one individual or family unit at each end of the pew.

COMMUNION PROCEDURE

- Communion, only under the form of the host, will only be offered in the hand.
- Remember to keep your distance, watching the markings on the floor.
- Follow the signs on the floor.

DEPARTURE PROCEDURE

Exit is via the front and rear doors.

- Ensure to wipe your seats with supplied sanitizer wipes before leaving and dispose the same in the bin located at the entrance/exit areas.
- Priests and staff will not be able to talk with you as you leave, but please know we truly care about you and offer you our greeting.
- There will be no hospitality after any Mass.
- Please do not stop and visit others.
 Once in the parking lot and, maintaining distance of a car width between you, you may visit with friends and others. Just because we are being cautious does not mean people cannot be friendly.

We encourage everyone to contribute financially as you leave by using the *TapnGo* machines or online via BPoint. We have *TapnGo* at both the doors. We also have collection boxes at the front door.

Paying our debt together

First Collection – for the diocese. This is used for the support of priests and deacons of the Diocese.

The Parish Finance Committee encourages all parishioners to register for direct debit or credit card deductions or use our **Tap &Go** machines instead of the envelop system. This will be very helpful for Budgeting.

TEMPORARILY HELP NEEDED FOR A SCHOOL PICK UP FOR A CHILD WHO IS UNWELL

There is an Iranian Asylum seeker family who is living in Rouse Hill. The boy who is in Year 9 and attends Kellyville High school has been suffering from headaches and dizzy spells and gets very tired. The doctors are conducting further test to find out the cause of his illness.

In the past the boy has been catching a school bus and gets off at the Rouse Hill town centre and then does about a 15-minute walk to his home. But due to his illness the parents are not keen for him to travel on public transport and having to cross the busy Windsor Road.

His father has just secured a cleaning job in the city and is unable to come by 3pm to pick up the son. The boy cannot stay in the school library (due to school COVID rules) for one hour till the father comes from the city and pick him.

If anyone can offer 20 minutes of time to pick up the boy from Kellyville High school (school finishes at 3pm) and drop the boy at his home at Demeter Street in Rouse Hill (unit in front of KFC).


