Sixth Sunday of Easter 9 May 2021

# Reflection of the Gospel

Today's gospel reading (John 15:9-17) continues where last Sunday's ended. When read in two sections like this, and if the references are ignored, it is not obvious that they form one unit within the farewell discourses given between the departure of Judas from the meal (13:29-31, read on Holy Tuesday) and his re-appearance in the garden (18:2-5, read on Good Friday); there is no mention of the vine here. However, there are common threads connecting the two, one being that of bearing fruit, which does belong to the vine image, but the "much fruit" phrase links back to the single grain that must die to yield more (John 12:24, Fifth Sunday of Lent, B). Here in the midst of the discourse at the Last Supper that famously has no mention of bread or wine we find the thematic threads of wheat and grapes, and talk of self-giving in the face of rejection, and of unity of the members. The interpretation of the eucharistic symbols of loaf and cup as Christ's self-giving (my Body given up) and forgiveness (my Blood for forgiveness of sins), and as the members' unity in him (a loaf from many grains; wine from many grapes) is much developed by the liturgical traditions. John, in his unique and poetic way, has woven these together before they were highly developed in more explicit ways in later Eucharistic Prayers.

Another thread is the phrase "love one another" (v.12 and 17). This command was given in 13:34 (Fifth Sunday of Easter, C), and is featured in a reported form last Sunday (1 John 3:23, not that letter's first instance) as well as in v.7 of today's second reading (1 John 4:7-10), and which would be repeated in v.11-12 on the Seventh Sunday of Easter (B) except that the Ascension is celebrated instead. It is also found in John's second letter.

A third thread is manifest in the expression "to lay down one's life", a variant of which had been said concerning the Good Shepherd (John 10:15,17, Fourth Sunday of Easter, B). It also has an inverted echo where Peter promises to lay his life down for Jesus (John 13:37-38) but failed to do so, at least at that time.

The first reading (Acts 10:25-26,34-35,44-48) returns to the house of Cornelius and to parts of the same scene and speech read on Easter Sunday. On that day the excerpts summarised the "recent happenings" concerning the crucifixion and resurrection, and highlighted the role of the apostles as witnesses. It also concluded on a note of universality for "all who believe in Jesus" would have forgiveness of sins. That is made clearer in today's excerpts, for Cornelius was not Jewish; he was a Gentile, the first reported to receive baptism. Since the Spirit had been received baptism could not be denied—perhaps implying that some considered it to be for Jews alone. Peter's few words emphasise that people of all nationalities are acceptable to God.

For any who equate the outpouring of the Spirit with Pentecost and our Rite of Confirmation, this story presents a difficulty for it appears to support the possibility of Confirmation before Baptism, or perhaps it points to variant initiation rites in the most primitive years Christian initiation, one being by anointing the other being by baptism. Perhaps our double rite of washing and anointing evolved from a merging of the two practices, and early Syriac sources do witness to a pre-baptismal anointing as the bestowal of the Holy Spirit. Leaving aside the practice of infant baptism, we too presume that the Spirit is at work in those adults coming to faith in Jesus, the Spirit leading them to profess Jesus' name and receive his baptism. Clearly we must conclude that the giving of the Spirit is not restricted to Confirmation. The mistake we make is in trying to make Confirmation conform to the Pentecost story though the contexts are quite different. It is time we emphasised Confirmation as the post-baptism anointing sealing Baptism, consecrating neophytes as priests to participate in the common priesthood's offering of the Eucharistic praise and receiving the Eucharist in Communion.

NSW Health has revised the COVID-19 guidelines for indoor venues (including places of worship), effective from 5pm, today 6 May 2021 to 12am Monday (10 May 2021). The following rule changes apply for venues across Greater Sydney and the Blue Mountains.

#### Face Masks






