

In the first reading (Job 38:1,8-11) God speaks to Job from the storm (and cloud, according to the Greek). This is a little odd since no storm had been mentioned beforehand, but it fits with the language of other theophanies. In this context we are then presented with an excerpt from the section recounting the creative power of God; the chosen excerpt concerns the confining of the seas. This is echoed then in the Psalm, where God stills the storm and hushes the waves, and sets the limits of the tide (a possible influence in Britain's legend of King Canute and the tide). It is readily apparent that these texts were chosen for the thematic link to the gospel story of the storm-tossed boat and the stilling of the wind and the sea. Having been primed by this language of theophany, we then appear to have it reinforced in the gospel by our Lectionary's Jerusalem Bible translation that says the disciples "were filled with awe", which is similar to the New Revised Standard Version, which adds "great" to the description of the storm. There is no doubt that Mark does present this account as a theophanic device leading to the rhetorical question, literally, "Who, therefore, is he that both the wind and the sea obey him?" The only scriptural precedent to answer this question is God. We may therefore understand this story to present the Christian claim that Jesus is God.

Since John's Gospel is the most consistently clear in proposing the divine status of Jesus, it is surprising that it does not include this story, versions of which are also found in Matthew (8:23-27) and Luke (8:22-25). However, closer examination of the phrase "they were filled with awe" reveals Mark alone to have an expression that is more literally translated "they were greatly afraid" or "were terrified", and that is taken directly from Jonah 1:10. In fact, Mark 4:36-41 has several direct links with Jonah 1:3-15, in which Jonah flees by boat from God's presence (1:3), who sends so severe a tempest upon the sea that the boat comes near to breaking (v.4). Meanwhile, incredibly in such dire circumstances, Jonah is in the hold, fast asleep (v.5, and snoring, according to the Greek). The sailors each call upon their gods, and Jonah is roused by the captain to do the same so that they might not perish (v.6). Jonah eventually admits his fault and confesses his God to be the maker of the sea and dry land (v.9). Then the men were greatly afraid or terrified, and Jonah offers a solution: he must be thrown overboard. Echoes of this part of Jonah are heard also in another gospel story of the crossing of the sea (Matthew 14:22-33, Mark 6:45-52 and John 6:16-21), but in each case the other evangelists, and John most thoroughly, carefully strip out the direct links to Jonah that Mark's has. Perhaps the possibility of contamination from the key point in the Jonah passage, that he flees God's presence and refuses to do what he was sent to do, simply makes it too unfavourable for John to use. Nonetheless, Mark sufficiently upends the story to show that while Jesus parallels Jonah, he is most definitely not fleeing God, nor his mission, and furthermore, while the gospel's storm is an entirely natural one, unlike Jonah's divine chastisement, Jesus manifests God's presence and wields the creative power to calm the wind and seas.

Mark's story is a creedal testimony from the nascent Church, but features within it also indicate that its members had grave fears for their wellbeing. Mark assures them that Christ is still present, and the forces of the world do obey him. While we might not expect miraculous intervention in the chaotic events of our lives, this story still has a power to refocus the mind and calm the heart to know that, come what may, Christ is present even in catastrophe.

NSW Health has eased the restrictions that were put in place for indoor venues (including places of worship) regarding singing and face masks. The below relaxed restrictions will apply from today, Monday 17 May 2021.

# Singing

There will be no restrictions on choirs and congregational singing at places of worship.

# Face Masks

Wearing of face masks at places of worship continues to be **strongly recommended**, especially indoors and where physical distancing is not possible. However, it will no longer be compulsory to wear a face mask at places of worship.

# Weddings and Funerals

There will be no caps on the number of people allowed to attend weddings and funerals.

# **COVID-19 Safety Plan**

COVID-19 Safety Plans are still required at all religious venues. Parishes will need to comply with their COVID-19 Safety Plans.

The number of people allowed at places of worship and religious services will continue to only be limited by the 2 square metre rule.




