#### Sixteenth Sunday in **Ordinary Time** 18th July 2021

Notwithstanding the joyous and hopeful message in the second reading both last week and this week, the first reading today begins with the heavy word that presages bad news, "Doom", or more accurately the onomatopoeic wail, "Woe". Perhaps especially in the wake of the scandals in our times this passage from Jeremiah should be given to priests and bishops at their ordinations to be used for regular reflection, and to be read at each meeting of Episcopal Conference and Council of Priests. We move from this salutary warning into the uplifting and much cherished shepherd psalm. Liturgy planners should ensure that Psalm 23(22) is not substituted by Boniwell's very pleasant hymn that borrows only its opening line, "The Lord is my shepherd". Psalm 23(22) may be a good counter to the first reading's criticism of poor shepherding by describing the behaviour of the good shepherd, but it is the perfect match for the gospel pericope (and indeed for the feeding story that follows it) for it influences all six accounts of the feedings in the four gospels. In today's prelude to that feeding, Jesus leads his twelve disciples by water to a quiet place that they might rest. They are thwarted by the earnest desire of the people who beat them there, and Jesus is moved on seeing them for they were like shepherdless sheep, so he sets himself to teach them, and later he will prepare a meal for them.

This Psalm was read in the early Church as a prophecy of Christ: they saw in it the feeding of the crowds reclining on green grass near the freshwater sea in a place of rest; they saw in it the journey through the waters of baptism that brings revival, and the anointing oil; they saw in it comfort in time of persecution, Christ with them, with his crook and staff understood to be the shaft and crossbeam of his own cross; and they saw in it the Eucharist, the feast laid for them with the overflowing or intoxicating cup, the sign of remission of sins. It was Cyprian of Carthage (d. 258) who most famously developed this understanding, teaching that the intoxicating wine of the eucharistic cup sacramentally bestows noble oblivion upon the communicant so as to forget sin, just like profane wine makes the drinker forget worldly worries. For these reasons it was sung in some places as the neophytes were led from the baptistery into the church for their first celebration of the Eucharist.

That baptismal theme of unification as members of the body of Christ, sacramentally celebrated in reception of his Body and Blood, is key also in the second reading, but the contextual elements from the earlier part of this chapter are lacking. It is addressing Gentiles, and it speaks of the unity now found in the Church of Christ between Jew and Gentile; Jesus is not shepherd of Israel only, but of all peoples, and in him all have the same way to the Father. But this letter is not confined to being read and understood as advice to a people of long ago, nor to a unity between one nation and all others; it is read as addressed to us, here and now. With the eucharistic theme that may be implicit in the letter's reference to the single Body, strengthened by the Lectionary's associating it with the shepherd Psalm and the feeding of the multitude which the early Church understood to have eucharistic meaning, it is not out of place to dwell on the role of the sign of peace before Communion. The exchange or kiss of peace between the members about to receive Communion in the Roman Rite is integral to the rite of peace and an indispensable part of the Communion rites. By it the members acknowledge one another and their peaceful union in Christ. In this way they fittingly discern first the Body so as to receive the sacrament worthily.

The Diocese of Parramatta has communicated revised regulations to clergy, parishes, staff and the general public via a letter and online communication channels. #### Dispensation from Mass

The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation remains in place (Canon 1247, Canons 85 and 87, and Catechism of the Catholic Church 2180-2188). Once the dispensation is lifted it will be communicated to your parishes, agencies and ministries.

#### Face masks

Effective from Tuesday 22 June 2021, face masks were made **mandatory** at all indoor venues (including places of worship and workplaces) for the next seven days across Greater Sydney and the Blue Mountains. This applies to the Chancery and parish offices.

#### Singing during Mass and liturgies

Indoor singing by the congregation is not permitted at this time during Masses and liturgies.

Singing by choirs is permissible, provided members of the choir wear masks.

#### COVID-19 Safety Plan

COVID-19 Safety Plans are still required at all religious venues. Parishes will need to comply with their COVID-19 Safety Plans.

The number of people allowed at places of worship and religious services will continue to only be limited by the 2 square metre rule.

The Diocese of Parramatta is co-hosting a series of talks on euthanasia with the Diocese of Broken Bay, ahead of the expected introduction of a draft Bill in the NSW Parliament to legalise euthanasia in September.

Due to the expected timing of the introduction of the bill, the talks have been organised for the beginning of August.

The free talks will be conducted via Zoom over three Monday nights starting 2 August at 7.30pm. There will be opportunities for questions following the talks.

Vicar General of the Diocese of Broken Bay, Fr David Ranson, will give the first talk on the theology of suffering and death on Monday, 2 August. The following Monday, 9 August, speakers from the medical profession will explain palliative care, and common 'myths' around this type of care. On Monday, 16 August Monica Doumit, Director Public Affairs and Engagement from the Archdiocese of Sydney will discuss "How to speak about euthanasia with friends and family".




