

Stipulations that something not be done are evidence the author believes some actually do it. The author of today's first reading (Deut 4:1-2,6-8) has Moses prohibit adding or taking away from the Law. The dispute in the opening section of today's Gospel pericope (Mark 7:1-8,14-15,21-23) is cued by Pharisees noting that Jesus' disciples eat without first washing their hands. Yet washing one's hands is good hygienic practice and important for social etiquette, as memories of motherly scolding enforce. It is a source of contention in the Gospel, however, because it appears to have gained the status of a religious duty. Having a major argument over it would seem silly to most outsiders. The Talmud testifies to Pharisaic obsession with purification exasperating other Jews too, specifically because many Pharisaic rules were not prescribed in the Law. The Law's commands for hand-washing were directed only at priests performing sacrificial duties. The Pharisees have opened themselves to the charge of adding to the Law in contravention of the Deuteronomic command; they hold their oral tradition equal to or more noteworthy than the written Law-an idea anathema to the Sadducees and others too. But today's gospel does not elucidate how they have taken the other step and "put aside the commandment of God" since it omits the section (v.9-13) that names a dodgy practice profiting from a loophole in the Law. The next omission (v.16-20) further simplifies it by avoiding the other side of the problem-the evangelist's interpretation, widely shared in the early Church, that Jesus "declared all foods clean", which takes away from the Law.

Deciding how rules remain binding over time, or how things may change in new circumstances, is often fraught. Once people have invested particular significance in any concept, however irrational it seems to others or even demonstrably mistaken, it is hard to move them from it. The dynamics are the same as for those who rebel against prophets, as seen back on the Fourteenth Sunday this year. Unless motivated by a more captivating idea that triggers an emotional response enabling them to let go of the former and embrace the new (also called conversion), change will be opposed or resented. People are rarely converted by being argued into it.

A similar example is still playing out in our Church. Having cultivated a sense that the Mass was unchangeable, the liturgical reforms emerging in the 1960s disturbed many. Some find support to their opposition in the four-hundred-year-old prohibition against changes in the apostolic constitution (Quo primum) published in the 1570 newly revised Roman Missal (which also suppressed the special setting for the feast of the Immaculate Conception). They take it to be, like the Deuteronomist's pronouncement, absolute and binding, even though they happily accept the many revisions made by various popes in the editions of 1604, 1634 (which established a new rite of distribution of Communion that supplanted existing local forms), 1884 (which instituted a revised setting for the Immaculate Conception), 1920, and 1962, as well as many significant changes to its calendar along the way. But many of those changes were less obvious than the recent ones and so went largely unnoticed. The modern reform was not helped at times by the enthusiastically enacted misinterpretations and experimentation beyond what was authorised. Permission to use the so-called "extraordinary form" was finally granted in concern for those who have struggled to accept the reform. But it is interesting to note how oddities never stipulated in the previous Missals have been incorporated as if essential; it is a form of oral tradition that often guides the resumed use more than the previous liturgical regulations. At the same time, some of these new enthusiasts are reluctant to acknowledge that for many priests who embraced or were raised in the reform the expectation that they should now equally happily accept the old form is also intolerable.

Perhaps it is impossible to avert controversy around major changes, but careful preparation oriented to conversion rather than imposition would be helpful. Above all, we should note that the early Church's ability to accept change even to the Mosaic commands was based in acknowledgement of Jesus as Lord. Similarly for us, all changes and grappling with what is needed in current circumstances should begin with seeking him from the heart to know his mission better.



A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark You forget the commandments of God and hold on to human tradition.

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me. The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations. You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.'

He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these things come from within and make a man unclean.'

- a person conducting the service
- other people who are necessary for the preparation and conduct of the service.


