# Twenty Sixth Sunday in ordinary time 26 September 2021

Today's Gospel reading (Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48) seems an eclectic assemblage. The apparently omitted verses were later insertions found in only one branch of the manuscript tradition, and they clearly do not fit. They repeat the final comment, "where their worm does not die nor their fire go out", which does not fit there either; it is a quote from Isaiah 66:24, which refers to the bodies of those who had turned away from God and were slain at the end. That whole final section of Isaiah is a haphazard collection of apocalyptic items, but that some early Christians valued parts is evident in the borrowing of the now well-known "new heavens and new earth" phrase in 2 Peter 3:13 and Revelation 21:1, and perhaps because parts resonated with their experiences of persecution. The passage's first reference to hell and fire has such inconsistencies in the tradition as to appear dubious too. All these elements intensify the apocalyptic flavour of the last section of the reading, which seems ill-suited to the first two elements. But if we set aside the apocalyptic elements, we are left with something that applies more to the community of disciples as a whole than to individuals. If aimed at individuals, its application would result in a noticeably maimed population, and even the most literalminded of Christian fundamentalists do not practise it. Rather, it makes more sense when read of the community considered as a body; and it is sometimes necessary to cut off wayward members. Our communities have always had to contend with members who do not behave in accord with Christ's teachings and Christian expectations, and indeed the advice seems most apt in the face of clergy scandals in our own days. However, this may seem to emphasise the community of Christians exclusively, whereas the first two parts of our reading—on the "non-member" casting out devils in Christ's name and on those who give a cup of water to one of Christ's flock-indicate an openness to others. Such inclusiveness is found in Isaiah 66 too, for not only are the dead rebels composed of both Jews and Gentiles, but so too will both Jews and Gentiles worship God on the Holy Mountain, and priests and Levites will be chosen even from the ranks of the Gentiles (Isa 66:20-21). Today's Gospel reading and Isaiah 66 both testify to an inclusive mission, and to the fact that it is doing God's work that fits one for eternal reward, and not membership of a particular group. The first reading (Num 11:25-29) echoes something of this, but its vision is restricted to the Hebrews. It was chosen as the first reading because Joshua's telling Moses to stop the two from prophesying who had not gathered at the tent of meeting, together with Moses' response, is the closest biblical parallel to John's telling Jesus about their stopping a man who was "not one of us casting out devils in your name". The response of Jesus fits with the preceding pericope so that Mark gives us a series of sayings: "Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me... Anyone who is not against us is for us... No one who works a miracle in my name will soon speak evil of me... If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink [in (the) name] because you [are of Christ... he will not lose his reward." Our translation of the last elides the linking thread in (the) name because the text is faulty and needs some correction to make it readable; others correct it by adding "my" or by rendering it as "because you bear the name of Christ". To these loosely associated four positive statements Mark attaches four negative ones concerning any who scandalise the little ones and sin against the body in hand, or foot, or eye. From the perspective of the community of disciples, the four positives are outward looking, and the four negatives mainly inward. Perhaps one way of reading this is to say that unless the body retains health and integrity it cannot engage properly in its mission to others. If so, a question for our parishes and religious communities is: How do we attend to our ecclesial body in all its members with a view to fulfilling its inclusive mission of reconciliation and redemption?

# NSW Government announces targets for easing of COVID-19 restrictions

The NSW government has announced a target for the easing of restrictions on churches for all of Greater Sydney, including the Blue Mountains and Wollongong regions.

Churches will be closed to the public until the Monday after NSW passes the 70 percent target of residents having had two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Funerals may proceed at this time, with a maximum of ten members of the congregation, following a four square metre rule.




