

When some people struggle or fail to live up to an ideal, is it to be abandoned? The simple answer is N_{θ} . So, how do we maintain the ideal yet deal well with failure to reach it? Though not put in those words, that is one of the questions in the ongoing difficult discussions about divorcees who then wish to marry another. The fact that sometimes a husband and wife separate and divorce is not new; it is well testified to throughout history, including in Jewish Law, though the biblical foundation for the actual practice is found only in Deuteronomy 24:1-3 which prohibits marrying a former wife if she had remarried in the meantime. It refers to the practice of issuing a written document of divorce, known by its later Aramaic term as a Get, but there is nowhere in the Law that directly permits divorce. The use of the Get is otherwise only referred to analogously in Isaiah 50:1 and Jeremiah 3:8, and in the New Testament in Mark 10:4 in today's reading (10:2-16) and Matthew 5:31 and 19:7. This all shows that it was accepted, but not the rationale for its acceptance. At least in later Jewish understanding marriage is not merely an arrangement or contract between a man and woman but a uniting of souls. However, it allows that just as they entered into the union freely, so can they can dissolve it when the husband officially gives, and the wife officially receives, the Get. This is not done lightly. The difficulty for us is that the teaching of Jesus in today's gospel (and Matthew 19:3-12, supported in Luke 16:18) seems very clear in closing this off since he teaches that only God can unbind what God has bound (or literally yoked together). It is this teaching and not inventive rule-making by the Church that causes our difficulty. But notice also this language of joining and separating is linguistically related to binding and unbinding (or loosening, remitting and forgiving) in the disciples' commission in Matthew 18:18. Those who would more readily accept divorce and remarriage do not adequately explain how we are to observe faithfully Christ's own teaching; at the same time, literal readers of these passages should ask if we have properly or fully understood his meaning and intent.

Rather than dwell on the difficulties of some cases, we should also note the positives. The text that Jesus alludes to is provided as our first reading (Gen 2:18-24) and it is positive, except when misused by too a literal reading that assigns primacy to the man and inferiority to the woman. The story is typically mythological and so is rich with poetic insight. At one level it conveys the human awareness of the kindred nature of animals, which here are made and presented as "friends, not food" (borrowing from Bruce, the vegetarian shark who says this of fish in Finding Nemo). It also acknowledges that while we find companionship with other animal species, nothing can equal that with another human, especially that which is shared between a husband and wife. An element too often overlooked is the place from which something was taken to be built into the woman: his side. An insightful rabbinic interpretation emerges after asking: Why did God take the rib and not a part from the foot or the head? Answer: To show that she is not under him, nor above him, but beside him as his equal. The story itself enshrines the equality between Adam and Eve, husband and wife; much would have been gained, and much misery averted, if that equality, and the respect it demands, had been upheld and practised by society throughout the ages. Our Lord's teachings were not given so as to inflict injustice and harm, but to uphold those ideals that are right and good for all human relationships.

The NSW Government has recently published its pathway out of the pandemic and lockdowns, with the "roadmap" to easing various restrictions at the 70% and 80% double dose target for those who are vaccinated. There is a further lifting of restrictions to all citizens of NSW regardless of vaccination status from 1 December 2021.

It is envisaged that NSW will achieve its double dose vaccination target of 70% sometime this week and from next Monday 11 October, restrictions will start lifting for places of worship. Although we would be entitled to open our churches for public Masses from this date, we have decided that we will instead wait the estimated two further weeks until we reach the 80% target before conducting public Masses.

In consideration of the roadmap and its implications to the faithful of the Diocese of Parramatta, a staged process should be applied towards full reopening.

Stage 1: When 70% of the double dose vaccination target is achieved by the state

Our churches can be reopened for **private prayer and devotion only.** Parishes and parishioners will need to be mindful of the NSW Government requirements for this stage of the roadmap.

Stage 2: When 80% of the double dose vaccination target is achieved by the state

The full details of the 80% roadmap can be found here: <u>https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/easing-covid19-restrictions/80-percent</u>.

At this stage of the roadmap, our churches are to open to our entire community. There is no requirement from the Government to check the vaccination status of people attending our churches.

Stage 3: From 1 December 2021

- Density limits will move to one person per 2 square metres for both indoor and outdoor settings.
- Congregational singing can resume at our liturgies and services.
- Mask wearing will be encouraged but will no longer be mandatory for places of worship.

The updated 70% roadmap will allow:

- □ 10 visitors to a home (not counting children 12 and under)
- \Box 30 people to gather outdoors
- \Box 100 people to attend weddings and funerals
- $\hfill\square$ Indoor pools to reopen for lessons, training and rehab activities.

Re: COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Update

The NSW Government has recently updated its pathway out of COVID-19 lockdowns.

Wedding and Funerals

As the 70% double vaccination rate has now been achieved, from Monday, 11 October 2021, up to 100 fully vaccinated people can attend funerals and weddings (previously it was 50 people).

At weddings with those who are unvaccinated, a maximum of 5 people may attend.

For funerals with those who are unvaccinated, a maximum of 10 people may attend.

At the 80% double vaccination rate, choirs of up to 10 people can perform in places of worship but all performers must be vaccinated.

COVID-19 Safety Plan and ventilation

For parish priests and parishes, now would be a good time to review and update your COVID-19 Safety Plan ahead of the reopening of churches for public Masses once the 80% double vaccination rate is achieved.


