Thirty Third Sunday in ordinary time **14 November 2021**

Gospel images about the eschaton draw from the few apocalyptic sections of the Old Testament, especially Daniel, and various apocryphal works. Even outside classically religious circles fascination abounds with this topic, or at least with some of the common images. Some of these images have been figuring repeatedly over the last few years exploring ideas about what it would be life if people returned to life. But the Zombie genre is really quite different. End of the world scenarios are common, even though they usually are depicted as resulting from natural causes. Perhaps these all do point to less-than-clear fears simmering in the collective imagination, or to some intangible concerns. But even science's mathematically deductive cosmologies generally have a cataclysmic end in mind for the universe in the conjectured Big Bang's putative opposite Big Crunch. Since that will ever remain unverifiable, as also will our own Earth's end (unless there is to be a Doctor Who type witness by its descendants living elsewhere), such events are an item of a form of scientific faith. Our own end-time materials have entirely different layers to them that point to something other than a cataclysmic world's end, although that will always remain an obsession in fanatical circles of fundamental literalists. Our end-time materials remind us that our own end will come, perhaps when we least expect it. In the Gospels they overlap references to what we recognise as past historical events, such as the persecutions of Christians in the early centuries, or the siege of Jerusalem and destruction of the temple in AD 70, or the later wars between 117 and 136 when Israel and Judah were extinguished. When those historical elements are filtered out of the Gospels' apocalyptic material, we find a layer concerned with each one's own personal end, featuring judgement and each one being held responsible for one's own life. The end was more nigh than the disciples realised, and despite the following advice to "Be on your guard" and to "Stay awake"-which immediately precedes the beginning of the passion account, with the hatching of the plot against Jesus—the disciples will be caught sleeping in the garden when Jesus is arrested.

In the Southern Hemisphere we are indeed in the early stages of summer, the season of mangoes and other fruits, and of storms. For those in its tropical regions it is the time to prepare for the most feared of storms, cyclones. In many southern areas in Australia awareness turns to the threat of bushfires. Even in those areas not threatened by the mere possibility of natural catastrophes, it is the time to wind up some of the year's works, perhaps to evaluate matters in preparation for the next year. All these link with our readings in easy ways as we hear the various ways of saying "Be ready" in our liturgies and in our media, though each has a different danger or need in view. This convergence may nonetheless be useful to us, but always with the reminder that, rather than being rendered anxious by the destructive image, the focus should be as the Psalm 16(15) has it, as it sounds the hope of those who go even to death knowing this must be, but trusting in the allpowerful love of God.



Doors to swing open as NSW continues to get the jab done

In response to the faster-than-expected rate of vaccination, the NSW Government will further **ease rules for those who are <u>fully vaccinated</u>** by bringing forward many of the roadmap changes scheduled for 1 December to Monday 8 November.

These freedoms will only be available for people who are <u>fully</u> <u>vaccinated</u>, including those who have medical exemptions and children under the age of 16. <u>COVID Safe check-ins and proof of vaccination will still be required.</u>

Those who are not fully vaccinated must still abide by pre-roadmap restrictions until the State reaches the 95 per cent double vaccination target, or 15 December, whichever happens first.

The current settings for masks, which apply to everyone, will remain in place until the State reaches the 95 per cent double vaccination target, or 15 December, whichever happens first.

Weddings

Weddings in NSW may have up to:

- 1 person per 2 square metres of space for indoor and outdoor areas.
- All people attending a wedding must be fully vaccinated (except for small wedding services).

Do not attend a wedding that exceeds the capacity limits.

People who are fully vaccinated do not have to be seated while consuming food and drink.

Dancing is permitted.

You can attend a wedding anywhere in NSW.

- If you are fully vaccinated you can attend a wedding, so long as the capacity limit is not exceeded. You must:
- carry vaccination evidence with you and produce it for inspection to a police officer or authorised officer if requested;
- check in with the Service.NSW app or provide your contact details to the occupier
- follow the face mask rules.

Funerals and memorial services

Funerals and memorial services in NSW may have up to:

- 1 person per 2 square metres of space for indoor and outdoor areas.
- All people attending the funeral service must be fully vaccinated, (except for small funeral or memorial services).
- Do not attend a funeral or memorial service that exceeds the capacity limits.
- People who are fully vaccinated do not have to be seated while consuming food and drink.

You can attend a funeral or memorial service anywhere in NSW.

If you are fully vaccinated you can attend a funeral or memorial service, so long as the capacity limit is not exceeded. You must carry vaccination evidence with you and produce it for inspection to a police officer or authorised officer if requested; check in with the Service NSW app or provide your contact details to the occupier follow the face mask rules.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Re: COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Update

As you are aware, we communicated to you last week that the NSW Government has shifted density limits from 1 person per 4 sqm to 1 person per 2 sqms.

For places of worship, all can attend regardless of vaccination status. However, we have now received further advice from NSW Health that there are some exceptions to the rule in relation to weddings and funerals which were not previously clarified. According to the new information sent to us, "the number of unvaccinated at a <u>funeral</u> or <u>wedding</u> is the lower number allowed based on the venue type OR the activity type".

This means that a wedding or funeral will have capped numbers if there are people who are not fully vaccinated in attendance even when held inside a place of worship. The following will apply:

Weddings:

- If all attending are fully vaccinated: Weddings in the church are permitted capped only by the 2sqm rule.
- If there are attendees who are not fully vaccinated: 5 guests can attend. This does not include the couple getting married, the priest celebrating the wedding, two witnesses and a camera operator recording the ceremony. This means a total of 11 people can be present.

Funerals:

- If all attending are fully vaccinated: Funerals in the church are permitted capped only by the 2sqm rule.
- If there are attendees who are not fully vaccinated: a 10-person limit will apply if people who are not fully vaccinated are in attendance. This does not include the priest and funeral company representatives.

A person is considered "fully vaccinated" if they have had two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine, or has a medical contraindication certificate, or a medical contraindication recorded on the Australian Immunisation Register.


