Fourth Sunday of Advent 19 December 2021

The use of Micah's "And you, Bethlehem..." (Micah 5:1) in Matthew 2:6, which we read on the feast of Epiphany, emerges from a first-century fascination with this prophecy, especially in Christian circles. In other Jewish circles the full prophecy (Micah 5:1-14) was read as applying to the Roman occupation of Israel and a hoped-for liberation from such dominion, rather than from that of the historical Assyrians mentioned in the verses omitted by our Lectionary. The Israeli interpretation expected a warrior king who would forcibly evict the invaders. In Christian circles, however, already informed by their recognition of Jesus as Messiah and by the events around his death, it concerned neither the past Assyrian nor the current Roman occupations, but the powers of sin and death. At least three of its elements readily suggest Jesus and hence confirm the sense that it foretells him: being born in Bethlehem, the phrase "she who is to give birth" (which reminds us of Isaiah 7:14 even though the similarity was not intended), and the shepherd who feeds his flock. There are other connections too that are not so obvious to us now. For example, the last word of our pericope, shalom (peace), equally translates as well-being or salvation, which is most apt for Christ. Furthermore, the word translated here as the remnant does not refer only to a small number of survivors but legitimately reads as all the rest, and then together with the rich range of meaning brothers was understood to mean all other people, that is, the Gentiles. Christians also invested more meaning in the humble birth of Micah's messiah, such that rather than prophesying a powerful warrior arising from humble origins it points to God choosing the weak to shame the powerful and to clothe himself in glory, consistent both with the humble birth of Jesus and the folly of the Cross (1 Corinthians 1:18-28).

A phrase in the second reading suggests itself as appropriate for this liturgical period of preparation for Christ's birth: "You... prepared a body for me". The original line in the Hebrew Psalm 40:6 (LXX 39:7), with which some Greek texts agree, reads "you opened/prepared my ears", a reference to hearing and obeying. Most Septuagint manuscripts have the same reading as Hebrews, in which ōtia [ears] appears by scribal error, adding the final S from the preceding word, to have been read as soma [body]. However, study across ancient Jewish and Christian texts reveals that this verse was an object of much interpretation, including interactions with other passages, such that the Greek form cannot be dismissed as a simple error. One interaction is with a phrase two verses later in the same psalm, literally, "Your law is within my abdomen", usually translated as heart. The rich history of interpretation around the ears/body complex includes the sense of one wholly, bodily honouring God's commands, as in one in whom the Law is written on the heart—and this appears to have already emerged in Jewish, not Christian, circles. Even if the substitution of body were simply a scribal error, then it is a happy fault that would later accord with the Christian understanding of the incarnation. Hebrews' author used the psalm as a proof text for rejecting the efficacy of holocausts and their being replaced by the perfect submission to the Father of Jesus, who in being perfectly obedient accomplishes in himself what no other

The gospel's account of the visitation continues the theme of the preparation of Christ's body, for he is in utero as Mary journeys from Galilee to Judah to visit her cousin Elizabeth, then six months pregnant. There John the future Baptist, key character of the previous two Sundays and himself now in formation in the womb, already jumps for joy, perhaps we may say in anticipation of seeing the Lord face to face. But there is more to this preparing of a body. In Christian faith, recollection of the reality of the human body of Jesus is always accompanied by awareness of the mystical body of Christ, represented in Church members who joyfully anticipate that day when they will see his face and truly know him as their salvation.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Re: COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Update

The NSW Government has announced some changes to the reopening roadmap for the COVID-19 restrictions. Based on the announcement, the restrictions will ease further when NSW reaches 95% double vaccination or on 15 December 2021, whichever comes first. For places of worship the following will apply from when the state hits the milestone:

Density Limits

There will no longer be any square meter rules applicable for Parishes. This includes the Church and other buildings within the Parish.

Weddings and Funerals

Proof of vaccination will no longer be mandatory. All will be able to attend regardless of vaccination status.

Choir and Singing

Singing will be permitted for everyone in attendance. Social Events Parish social events can resume with no person limit.

Masks

Masks will no longer be mandatory at places of worship. However, this is still strongly encouraged in venues where social distancing is not possible.

COVID-19 Safe Check-in and Record Keeping

Check in using the NSW QR Code and record keeping of all attendees are still required for places of worship.

COVID-19 Safety Plans

COVID-19 Safety Plans will no longer be mandatory.

SPONSOR A PEW

Dear Parishioners.

As you are aware, we had been planning and discussing for a while to change and replace our old, broken, damaged and messy pews of different colour, design and shape to make the church look better and sitting and kneeling more comfortable. After many little experiments of a carpenter and our construction students, this did not work out in the way we expected due to COVID and other reasons. We, then, invited a number of pew making companies to submit quotes. We received a number of quotes and finally, at the satisfaction of everyone in the committee, we decided to go with Grandchester Designs to make the new pews. (They are also making pews for our neighbouring parish Our Lady of the Rosary Kellyville).

We will have the pews finished by the end of March 2022. All pews will be coated with quality polyurethane 2 pack in a matt finish with kneelers covered with good quality vinyl and high density foam to make kneeling more comfortable and smooth.

The total cost of the project \$175,000. So far, the total amount received from sponsors is \$55,000. We still need to raise \$120,000.

On this note, we would like to request you to sponsor a pew. It can be in memory of a deceased love one or your family or personal gift to the parish community. Each pew in the size of 4.6 metres will cost \$2500 and pews at the back will be almost double the size to match with the shape of the church. A small memorial or "donated by" plaque will be placed upon request. You can get family and friends to pool together or if you cannot afford to sponsor one full pew, you can donate whatever amount you can to have comfortable pews and be part of the community that care its spiritual home.




