

Fourth Sunday Ordinary time 30 January 2022



Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

Today's gospel continues the episode begun last Sunday in the synagogue in Nazareth when Jesus read from Isaiah to announce the Jubilee, the Lord's year of favour. It begins with a contextual adaptation of last Sunday's last line. The people were impressed with Jesus, and approving. Then things turn sour. By mentioning their having "heard all that happened in Capernaum" Luke indicates that Jesus had already begun his public ministry, and where his focus had been. The two verses before last Sunday's reading indicate that he had returned from Judea (where John was baptising) to Galilee, and had been preaching in the synagogues, but without telling us what he had been saying. Matthew and Mark both say he began with proclaiming that "the kingdom of heaven/God is near", but both place this scene at Nazareth (without the Isaiah text) much later in the ministry. By placing this scene at the beginning, Luke identifies Jesus from the outset with the outcast and marginalised; his home town casts him out, and takes him to the very margin, the cliff, to throw him over. It is also a summary, a foretaste, of what is to follow, his ministry beginning with approval and ending with rejection and death. He will similarly be taken out of a city, Jerusalem, and killed on a hill. The Nazareth townspeople's reaction is surprisingly extreme, moving irrationally quickly from approval to violent rejection. The parallel in Matthew and Mark simply say Jesus could do little there because of their unbelief. It thus appears that Luke has exaggerated the event specifically to prime the reader for what will unfold throughout the ministry. Within the material unique to Luke, in the provocation we will turn to shortly, we find one of Luke's characteristic features; many of his stories come in pairs, one about a man with one about a woman. Women appear to be marginalised in various ways, either in fact or simply in their silence in historical the records, but Luke carefully presents a balance between

The story is also a reminder that people are not killed for being nice, but for upsetting things and annoying others. As Luke tells it, Jesus did provoke the Nazareth folk. He did so in a manner consistent with the non-exclusive mission to all people that I referred to last week. The provocation arises as he draws on episodes from their heroic past; it was with no Jewish woman that the prophet Elijah found refuge and in whose home he worked miracles, but rather it was a Sidonian widow at Zarephath, presumed gentile; it was no Jewish man who was cleansed of leprosy in the time of the prophet Elisha, but rather it was gentile Naaman from Syria. Provocatively, Jesus reminds his compatriots that the Jews have no exclusive claim on God's favour, and that gentiles are also suitable subjects of the Kingdom and are also the objects of God's merciful work. The Lord's year of favour and its mercies are for all.

The Lectionary appears to strengthen this connection by its choice of the first reading from Jeremiah with its reference to him having been appointed "as prophet to the nations". This is an abbreviated version of the call, to which he protested with good reason if the aim in life is to be left in peace. As the pericope continues we find that he was appointed "to confront all this land... its country people; they will fight against you", and it is in this that we hear fore echoes of Christ as presented in Luke's story. Jeremiah was indeed ill-treated: he was rejected by his own kin, beaten and put in stocks by a priest, imprisoned by the king, threatened with death, and dropped in the muddy cistern. Ultimately, the line "but they shall not overcome you" proved true and Jeremiah was freed from the miry pit and he outlived the fall of Jerusalem. The mission of Jesus did, however, end in death, and yet even death did not overcome.

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

There are three things that last: faith, hope and love; and the greatest of these is love.

Be ambitious for the higher gifts. And I am going to show you a way that is better than any of them.

If I have all the eloquence of men or of angels, but speak without love, I am simply a gong booming or a cymbal clashing. If I have the gift of prophecy, understanding all the mysteries there are, and knowing everything, and if I have faith in all its fullness, to move mountains, but without love, then I am nothing at all. If I give away all that I possess, piece by piece, and if I even let them take my body to burn it, but am without love, it will do me no good whatever.

Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offence, and is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people's sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes.

Love does not come to an end. But if there are gifts of prophecy, the time will come when they must fail; or the gift of languages, it will not continue for ever; and knowledge - for this, too, the time will come when it must fail. For our knowledge is imperfect and our prophesying is imperfect; but once perfection comes, all imperfect things will disappear. When I was a child, I used to talk like a child, and think like a child, and argue like a child, but now I am a man, all childish ways are put behind me. Now we are seeing a dim reflection in a mirror; but then we shall be seeing face to face. The knowledge that I have now is imperfect; but then I shall know as fully as I am known.

In short, there are three things that last: faith, hope and love; and the greatest of these is love.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus, like Elijah and Elisha, was not sent only to the Jews.

Jesus began to speak in the synagogue, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.' And he won the approval of all, and they were astonished by the gracious words that came from his lips.

They said, 'This is Joseph's son surely?' But he replied, 'No doubt you will quote me the saying, "Physician, heal yourself" and tell me, "We have heard all that happened in Capernaum, do the same here in your own countryside." And he went on, 'I tell you solemnly, no prophet is ever accepted in his own country.

'There were many widows in Israel, I can assure you, in Elijah's day, when heaven remained shut for three years and six months and a great famine raged throughout the land, but Elijah was not sent to any one of these: he was sent to the widow at Zarephath, a Sidonian town. And in the prophet Elisha's time there were many lepers in Israel, but none of these was cured, except the Syrian, Naaman.'

When they heard this everyone in the synagogue was enraged. They sprang to their feet and hustled him out of the town; and they took him up to the brow of the hill their town was built on, intending to throw him down the cliff, but he slipped through the crowd and walked away.

SPONSOR A PEW

Dear Parishioners.

As you are aware, we had been planning and discussing for a while to replace our old, broken, damaged and messy pews of different colour, design and shape to make the church look better and sitting and kneeling more comfortable. After many little experiments of a carpenter and our construction students, this did not work out in the way we expected due to COVID and other reasons. We, then, invited a number of pew making companies to submit quotes. We received a number of quotes and finally, at the satisfaction of everyone in the committee, we decided to go with Grandchester Designs to make the new pews. (They are also making pews for our neighbouring parish Our Lady of the Rosary Kellyville).

We will have the pews finished by the end of March 2022. All pews will be coated with quality polyurethane 2 pack in a matt finish with kneelers covered with good quality vinyl and high density foam to make kneeling more comfortable and smooth.

The total cost of the project \$175,000. So far, the total amount received from sponsors is \$55,000. We still need to raise \$120,000.

On this note, we would like to request you to sponsor a pew. It can be in memory of a deceased love one or your family or personal gift to the parish community. Each pew in the size of 4.6 metres will cost \$2500 and pews at the back will be almost double the size to match with the shape of the church. A small memorial or "donated by" plaque will be placed upon request. You can get family and friends to pool together or if you cannot afford to sponsor one full pew, you can donate whatever amount you can to have comfortable pews and be part of the community that care its spiritual home.






