

Fifth Sunday Ordinary time 6 February 2022



Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

The call of Jeremiah heard last Sunday had a decidedly earthly tone, and it was not welcomed by the prophet, but that of Isaiah in today's first reading came in a vision of heaven and was eagerly accepted. Isaiah was at first merely a visionary witness to the majesty of the angelic court, but he was overcome with a sense of his unworthiness to see such a thing and to speak of it to others. A seraph remedies this by putting an ember from the altar to his lips saying "your sin is taken away", and, since this is in effect both a sacrament within the vision and has the similar language to our Eucharist, the image is often borrowed in iconography as analogous of the reception of Communion. After this Isaiah overhears the question being put by God to the heavenly court, "Whom shall I send?" Set free from his inhibiting sense of unworthiness he promptly offers himself to be the messenger, saying "send me".

The gospel has leapt from last Sunday's episode over two healings (one of a man, one of a woman) and a reference to Jesus going to preach in the synagogues of Judea, though some important manuscripts say Galilee. Whichever of those possibilities is true, his wandering ministry has been continuing, but with no reference to what is being said and done, and apparently it is being done alone. Today he is in Galilee at a place curiously referred to as the lake of Gennesaret, by which must be meant the shore area of the town of that name by the Sea of Galilee. It is here that he encounters the fishermen he would soon call to follow him, later to be among "the twelve", namely Peter and the brothers James and John. As an aside, this story of the huge haul is not included in Matthew or Mark, but it does have a parallel in the last chapter of John in the last reported post-resurrection appearance. In both the fisherman had been unsuccessful prior to following the Lord's directions, but while Luke says the nets began to tear John states "the net was not torn". In both, Peter then approaches Jesus; in Luke he does so with a declaration akin to Isaiah's first response, saying "I am a sinful man", while in John he approaches with enthusiasm like that of the newly purged Isaiah. It is in Peter's declaration that we find the main link to the first reading, and the first indication that, like Isaiah, Peter would be sent; he will be messenger or apostle of the Good News.

By a serendipitous coincidence we hear in the second reading from Paul (1 Corinthians 15:1-11) as he reflects upon his history and his being an apostle of the Good News. He refers to his own conversion, when the Lord appeared to him too, resulting in his life changing when in a sense Saul died and Paul was born. The Lectionary also offers an abbreviated form of the reading with four verses omitted. However, the second section omitted, verses 9-10, contains both the expression of his prior unworthiness that fits well with the protests of Isaiah and Peter, and the observation that it is God's grace that makes him fitting to be an apostle.

Isaiah, Peter and Paul are all are celebrated messengers of God's Word, albeit with different missions, that is, Isaiah keeping Israel steady in the face of the Assyrian threat, while Peter and Paul are apostles of the new Good News to the Jews and gentiles respectively. All three exhibit awareness of personal unworthiness, and for all three God's grace supplies the want. In some ways this can be seen to pre-empt Lent when the rites seek to assist catechumens to be conscious of personal sin and unworthiness so as to more profoundly understand the rites by which "your sin is taken away, your iniquity is purged".

There will be no Monday morning Masses for the next 3 weeks Monday 7th March Mass will recommence.

1 Corinthians 15:1-11

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

I preach what they preach, and this is what you believe.

Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you - believing anything else will not lead to anything.

Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it.

I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed.



A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

They left everything and followed him.

Jesus was standing one day by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats - it was Simon's - and asked him to put out a little from the shore. SPONSOR A PEW

Dear Parishioners.

As you are aware, we had been planning and discussing for a while to replace our old, broken, damaged and messy pews of different colour, design and shape to make the church look better and sitting and kneeling more comfortable. After many little experiments of a carpenter and our construction students, this did not work out in the way we expected due to COVID and other reasons. We, then, invited a number of pew making companies to submit quotes. We received a number of quotes and finally, at the satisfaction of everyone in the committee, we decided to go with Grandchester Designs to make the new pews. (They are also making pews for our neighbouring parish Our Lady of the Rosary Kellyville).

We will have the pews finished by the end of March 2022. All pews will be coated with quality polyurethane 2 pack in a matt finish with kneelers covered with good quality vinyl and high density foam to make kneeling more comfortable and smooth.

The total cost of the project \$175,000. So far, the total amount received from sponsors is \$55,000. We still need to raise \$120,000.

On this note, we would like to request you to sponsor a pew. It can be in memory of a deceased love one or your family or personal gift to the parish community. Each pew in the size of 4.6 metres will cost \$2500 and pews at the back will be almost double the size to match with the shape of the church. A small memorial or "donated by" plaque will be placed upon request. You can get family and friends to pool together or if you cannot afford to sponsor one full pew, you can donate whatever amount you can to have comfortable pews and be part of the community that care its spiritual home.




