

### **First Sunday of Lent** 6 March 2022



Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

The tempting of Jesus that unfolds in the post-baptismal retreat into the wilderness is the focus of the first Sunday in Lent every year. The accounts in Matthew, Mark and Luke all mention the Spirit, the wilderness, forty days, the tempter and temptations. Mark has no specifics concerning the temptations, while Matthew and Luke have the same three in variant orders. The reference to the forty days influenced the development of our Lent, and hence the account always marks its beginning. How exactly we may count the forty days has always been a quirky affair - and it still varies between the three major traditions of the Ambrosian, Roman and Byzantine rites. Examining the various calculation methods may prove for many people more effective in inducing sleep than mentally counting sheep. Suffice it say Lent is a significant penitential period marked by practices informed by excerpts from the Sermon on the Mount that were read on Ash Wednesday: fasting, praying, and almsgiving.

Another relevant count of forty is the post-Exodus number of years in the wilderness before the Hebrews entered the Promised Land. Our first reading (Deuteronomy 26:4-10) does not mention that period, but it stipulates the rite for offering the first fruits once the land was entered and cultivated. It recalls the history of oppression in Egypt, and the rescue by God; it acknowledges the presence of God with them in time of trouble. The response in the attached psalm picks up that idea, but the second and third stanzas contain the reference to the angels being charged with guarding and bearing that is misappropriated by the devil in Luke's third temptation. The changing voice in the psalm is a little confusing; the first stanza speaks about one who abides with God, the second and third speak to that person, and in the fourth God speaks, declaring the intention to save that person.

In the second reading Paul freely cites Deuteronomy 30:14, from Moses' exhortation shortly before the people are to cross the Jordan into Canaan to which they had journeyed for forty years; he urged them to keep the Law so as to live. This citation is therefore associated with the first reading which is also from Deuteronomy, the whole of which work is placed at the end of the forty year journey and on the verge of entry to the Promised Land. Paul's citation closely follows the Hebrew, but it is also close to the proclamation of Jesus that Matthew and Mark report soon after his baptism as he begins his public ministry, "The Kingdom of Heaven/God is near". Paul, however, goes on to point out that "the word" is the faith we proclaim, the confession of Christ Jesus as Lord, crucified and risen. In this way Paul is surprisingly close to John acclaiming that Jesus is "the Word" amongst us in the flesh. But Paul is making another point; the full realisation of the utterance of Moses, "The word is very near to you", comes not by Hebrew descent and the reception of the Covenant's Law but with confession of Christ. In this way Jews and Gentiles are united in Jesus as they could not be under the Law.

Those who now begin the final journey to baptism, the catechumens, are preparing to confess Christ publicly, ritualised in the handing on of the Creed and in the act of baptism itself. The rites that accompanying them, the Scrutinies, are to strengthen them against the temptations that may lead them astray before completing that journey. The language of the prayers (sometimes lost in translation) recalls both the forces pursuing the people in their flight to the Red Sea, and the accompanying protective deeds of God. For those already baptised, it becomes a time to examine our own hearts and deeds, to better understand the temptations to which we fall prey. And we should take solace in the realisation that a temptation is not a sin; Jesus too was tempted, but he did not sin. Temptations are properly the subject of spiritual direction, the spiritual director in his or her wisdom drawing forth lessons from them; sins are properly the subject of the Sacrament of Penance and the recollection of God's mercy.
