

# **Third Sunday of Easter** 1st May 2022



Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

Today's readings are rather disparate. The gospel passage (John 21:1-19) has John's greatest number of disciples being named or specified and is the last of John's post-resurrection accounts yet it appears related to 1:35-51 in which Jesus gains his first disciples, Andrew and Philip who promptly introduce Peter and Nathanael. The other gospels say that at least four of the twelve, including Andrew and Peter, were fishermen, but John has no mention of fishing until this final scene. Luke's gospel is the only other one to have an extraordinary haul of fish at the Lord's direction after a fruitless night of fishing, but he sets it early in the gospel alongside the call of the first disciples, three of whom are named as Peter and the sons of Zebedee. This is the only time John mentions the sons of Zebedee. It all suggests that John's telling loops back to the beginning. But unique to John is the attached commission of Peter to "pasture my lambs... tend my sheep... pasture my sheep", each following Christ's question, "Do you love me?" and Peter's response "You know I love you". Some make much of the fact that two words translated "love" are used, changing in the third question from the claimed more excellent agapaō to the supposed lesser fileō. However, it is consistent with the pattern of changes of each of Christ's key words, and John uses these two words for love interchangeably, fileō also of the Father for the Son (5:20), of Jesus for Lazarus (11:3, 36), of the Father for the disciples and them for Jesus (16:27), and of Jesus for the unnamed Beloved Disciple (20:2); thus suggestions of particular implications in the change in this scene are unconvincing. On the other hand, Peter's response is constant. There is merit in imagining it as the antidote for Peter's earlier denial, both scenes taking place near a charcoal fire, the New Testament's sole instances of the word. The scene also has an often overlooked feature: Jesus took the loaf and gave it to them, and he does the same with the fish. Lacking only a verb for blessing, this is a direct parallel to the feeding in John 6:11. My extensive research also reveals that John reflects a dialectic construction that uses one verb to cover both breaking and giving. It fits with the curious mention by Justin Martyr (c. AD 150) that Christ taught the Eucharist after the resurrection.

The second reading (Revelation 5:11-16) is the first in a series of four excerpts of heavenly visions read over four Sundays. Here the visionary, traditionally held to be John the Evangelist, hears the heavenly throng's loud praise of the Lamb, with all creatures of the earth joining in. These visions are frequently filled with the downright weird, and are read too literally by too many, but we can see in them images that correspond to the eucharistic liturgy as it later developed, suggesting the likely influence of Johannine texts not only in trinitarian theology but also in ritual evolution; the eucharistic prayers and rites of fraction and distribution are indeed punctuated with phrases and images borrowed from Johannine texts, not the least being the choirs of singing angels and all the references to the Lamb. This points to the power of the Johannine school-that its poetic, mystical, literary and theological complexity that can make it so hard for preachers to work with is what so wonderfully feeds liturgical texts and rites, and art. One might even imagine the composer Handel having shared this vision, borrowing the song to form the magnificent conclusion to his oratorio, Messiah.

It is in the first reading that we find the reference to the mission of the Church: to witness to Christ who was exalted, literally translated, "to grant repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins". The conclusion does not properly fit due to the omission of Gamaliel's advice against further persecuting the disciples and their being given a mere flogging. Even their



joyfully going from their flogging witnesses to the primacy of their message of forgiveness.



# **First Reading** *Acts 5:27-32, 40-41*

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

We are witnesses of these words, and so is the Holy Spirit.

The high priest demanded an explanation of the apostles. 'We gave you a formal warning,' he said 'not to preach in this name, and what have you done? You have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and seem determined to fix the guilt of this man's death on us.' In reply Peter and the apostles said, 'Obedience to God comes before obedience to men; it was the God of our ancestors who raised up Jesus, but it was you who had him executed by hanging on a tree. And so they left the presence of the Sanhedrin glad to have had the honour of suffering humiliation for the sake of the name.

# Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish.

Jesus showed himself again to his disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night.

It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No,' he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' At these words 'It is the Lord,' Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land.

As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'who are you?'; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead.

After the meal Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these others do?' He answered, 'Yes Lord, you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He replied 'Yes, Lord, you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Look after my sheep.' Then he said to him a third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter was upset that he asked him the third time, 'Do you love me?' and said, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep.

'I tell you most solemnly, when you were young you put on your own belt and walked where you liked; but when you grow old you will stretch out your hands, and somebody else will put a belt around you and take you where you would rather not go.'

In these words he indicated the kind of death by which Peter would give glory to God. After this he said, 'Follow me.'

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

### Re: COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Update

The NSW Government recently announced changes with regards to restrictions and isolation rules. Close contacts of a confirmed COVID-19 case will no longer be required to isolate, provided they comply with NSW Health guidelines.

The seven-day isolation requirement remains in place for anyone who has recorded a positive RAT or PCR result.

From 6pm on Friday, 22 April 2022, the following will apply:

- Close contacts (defined as a household contact or an individual deemed by NSW Health to be a close contact) will not have to isolate, as long as they have no symptoms and comply with the following guidelines: They
  - Do not visit aged care, hospitals, disability, and correctional facilities unless a special exemption applies;
  - Wear a face mask in indoor settings outside the home;
  - Undertake daily RAT tests before coming into close contact with people outside their household, where practicable;
  - Avoid contact with elderly and immunocompromised persons where possible;
     Work from home where practical; and
  - Notify their employer/ educational facility that they are a close contact, and that
    they are not required to isolate as long as they comply with the above.
- 2. Close contacts will need to comply with the above guidelines for 7 days from the time a person in their household tested positive for COVID-19.

Please consider which of the above guidelines apply in relation to specific activities being undertaken in your community e.g. sacramental preparation, etc.

The basic rules of hand hygiene, wearing a mask when you cannot socially distance and staying at home if you have symptoms still apply as we are still in a pandemic. Individuals still need to exercise extra caution to protect vulnerable members of our community.


You can get family and/or friends to pool together or if you cannot afford to sponsor one full pew, any amount you donate will be a big addition to the cost of the pews.


