

Palm Sunday 10 April 2022



Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.



Each of the four gospels have points of divergence that are sometimes interesting to note. Luke has more points of departure than usual in today's texts. In the processional pericope he does not mention the people using leafy branches (cf. Matthew 21:8 and Mark 11:8) or palms (John 12:8) as they greet Christ, but only their mantles or cloaks. He alone does not include "Hosanna" in the people's greeting, and adds "Peace in heaven and glory" in place of Matthew's and Mark's second "Hosanna", thus both distancing the people's text from Psalm 117(118):26 that the others agree on, and linking it back rather to the angels' song at Jesus' birth (Luke 2:14).

In the Passion reading itself is an oddity too difficult to deal with here: there is great variation among the manuscripts, with Luke having at the Passover meal either two cups, or one in the order of cup then loaf. During the meal Luke alone has a dispute break out among the disciples about who is the greatest, which both Matthew and Mark place while still on the journey to Jerusalem. However, Jesus' response in teaching about the need for the leader to serve corresponds to the unique feature of John's gospel, that of Jesus washing the disciples' feet as a demonstration of service-leadership. The next unique feature in Luke is Jesus' reminding the disciples of when they were sent out without a purse or other things, but then he tells them to take them, and even to sell one's mantle to buy a sword if one currently has none. This is odd advice.

Now let us turn back to the gospel reading on the first Sunday of Lent, the temptations. Only Luke says that when the tempter had finished he left Jesus "until an opportune time". The only time the devil reappears in Luke, but then is named Satan, is to enter Judas before the Passover (or during the meal, according to John—the only other evangelist to mention this). Satan is also mentioned, uniquely to Luke, in a preface to the prediction of Peter's denial. Thus we have temptations continuing, but among the disciples. However, if we take the temptations seriously and remember that anything easily rejected is not a real temptation, or in other words that you can only be tempted with something you actually want, then we see signs that Jesus continued to face temptations. The references to the swords seem to point to his considering actually taking up arms in a rebellion. During prayer in Gethsemane this temptation is finally extinguished, but not without anguish, and he chooses complete submission to the Father's will. Then comes the time for swords, but he orders them put away - though not before one is used, and unique to Luke, Jesus heals the victim's ear. Jesus is then led away to trial.

The most obvious of Luke's remaining divergences can be summarised: 1) Jesus is sent by Pilate to Herod, whose soldiers, not Pilate's, dress and mock Jesus; 2) Jesus greets the women on the way to Calvary; 3) one of the criminals crucified with Jesus begs to be remembered in his kingdom, and he is promised paradise; 4) Jesus does not pray Psalm 21(22):1, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me", but rather Psalm 30(31):5, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit". There, at his last breath he affirms his choice: the rejection of temptations, and trusting submission to the Father's will.

Gospel

Luke 23:1-49

The passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

The elders of the people and the chief priests and scribes rose, and they brought Jesus before Pilate.

They began their accusation by saying, 'We found this man inciting our people to revolt, opposing payment of tribute to Caesar, and claiming to be Christ, a king.' Pilate put to him this question, 'Are you the king of the Jews?' 'It is you who say it' he replied. Pilate then said to the chief priests and the crowd, 'I find no case against this man.' But they persisted, 'He is inflaming the people with his teaching all over Judaea; it has come all the way from Galilee, where he started, down to here.' When Pilate heard this, he asked if the man were a Galilean; and finding that he came under Herod's jurisdiction he passed him over to Herod who was also in Jerusalem at that time.

Herod was delighted to see Jesus; he had heard about him and had been wanting for a long time to set eyes on him; moreover, he was hoping to see some miracle worked by him. So he questioned him at some length; but without getting any reply. Meanwhile the chief priests and scribes were there, violently pressing their accusations. Then Herod, together with his guards, treated him with contempt and made fun of him; he put a rich cloak on him and sent him back to Pilate. And though Herod and Pilate had been enemies before, they were reconciled that same day.

Pilate then summoned the chief priests and the leading men and the people. 'You brought this man before me' he said 'as a political agitator. Now I have gone into the matter myself in your presence and found no case against the man in respect of all the charges you bring against him. Nor has Herod either, since he has sent him back to us. As you can see, the man has done nothing that deserves death, so I shall have him flogged and then let him go.' But as one man they howled, 'Away with him! Give us Barabbas!' (This man had been thrown into prison for causing a riot in the city and for murder.)

Pilate was anxious to set Jesus free and addressed them again, but they shouted back, 'Crucify him! Crucify him!' And for the third time he spoke to them, 'Why? What harm has this man done? I have found no case against him that deserves death, so I shall have him punished and then let him go.' But they kept on shouting at the top of their voices, demanding that he should be crucified. And their shouts were growing louder.

Pilate then gave his verdict: their demand was to be granted. He released the man they asked for, who had been imprisoned for rioting and murder, and handed Jesus over to them to deal with as they pleased.

As they were leading him away they seized on a man, Simon from Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, and made him shoulder the cross and carry it behind Jesus. Large numbers of people followed him, and of women too, who mourned and lamented for him. But Jesus turned to them and said, 'Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep rather for yourselves and for your children. For the days will surely come when people will say, "Happy are those who are barren, the wombs that have never borne, the breasts that have never suckled!" Then they will begin to say to the mountains, "Fall on us!"; to the hills, "Cover us!" For if men use the green wood like this, what will happen when it is dry?' Now with him they were also leading out two other criminals to be executed.

When they reached the place called The Skull, they crucified him there and the two criminals also, one on the right, the other on the left. Jesus said, 'Father forgive them; they do not know what they are doing.' Then they cast lots to share out his clothing.

The people stayed there watching him. As for the leaders, they jeered at him. 'He saved others,' they said 'let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One.' The soldiers mocked him too and when they approached to offer him vinegar they said, 'If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself.' Above him there was an inscription: 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals hanging there abused him. 'Are you not the Christ?' he said. 'Save yourself and us as well.' But the other spoke up and rebuked him. 'Have you no fear of God at all?' he said. 'You got the same sentence as he did, but in our case we deserved it; we are paying for what we did. But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus,' he said 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.' 'Indeed, I promise you,' he replied 'today you will be with me in paradise.'

It was now about the sixth hour and, with the sun eclipsed, a darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour. The veil of the Temple was torn right down the middle; and when Jesus had cried out in a loud voice, he said, 'Father, into your hands I commit my spirit.' With these words he breathed his last.

All kneel and pause a moment.

When the centurion saw what had taken place, he gave praise to God and said, 'This was a great and good man.' And when all the people who had gathered for the spectacle saw what had happened, they went home beating their breasts.

All his friends stood at a distance; so also did the women who had accompanied him from Galilee, and they saw all this happen.


You can get family and/or friends to pool together or if you cannot afford to sponsor one full pew, any amount you donate will be a big addition to the cost of the pews.





What we are doing at Vinnies

The impact of the flooding in northern NSW has been devastating and is a further blow to a community that was adversely impacted by floods in 2021, bushfires in 2020 and the COVID pandemic.

NSW SES teams have received over 8800 calls for assistance, so far, with 300 flood rescues overnight alone. Further evacuations are in place today and you can check the affected areas here and access a list of current evacuation centres here.

A Flood Response group at Vinnies has been formed and will meet regularly over the coming days to coordinate our response – to both support our people in affected areas and provide the most appropriate care and assistance to communities impacted by the floods.

The Society has launched a <u>Vinnies NSW Flood Appeal</u>/(<u>St Vincent de Paul Society NSW - Flood Appeal (vinnies.org.au)</u> and is getting ready to support the community with financial payments as part of the recovery efforts. Members will lead this response on the ground, offering support at recovery centres and Society locations that are accessible. More information on this work will be shared as we establish our supports in key centres and as the floodwaters recede.




