Second Sunday of Easter 24 April 2022



Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhop Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

Eastertide gives a certain pride of place to John's gospel, from which each Sunday's reading is taken except for the Seventh Sunday to which in Australia we move the celebration of the Ascension. But only on the first three Sundays are the pericopes from the post-resurrection section. Today's reading, like that on Easter Sunday, is read each year, and the two form a natural frame for these two Sundays since they encompass the eight days. In fact the first part of today's reading, the bestowing of the Spirit and the commission to forgive sins, is repeated at Pentecost, thus encompassing and identifying the whole season of Eastertide as one: the whole of the mystery of the resurrection and ascension of Christ and the commissioning inbreathing of the Holy Spirit into the community of disciples, the Church.

One of the themes threaded throughout John appears in today's account of the episode of the doubting apostle, Thomas. It had come to the fore on Easter Tuesday with Mary Magdalene announcing to the disciples "I have seen the Lord", and now they say to Thomas "We have seen the Lord". Thomas' response is interesting, for after stating "Unless I see..." instead of saying him or the Lord he uses a pars pro toto figure of speech mentioning only the crucifixion-inflicted wounds, "... the nail holes... his [pierced] side". There is something odd about this, which we will turn to shortly. Thomas' response sets up the extraordinarily intimate encounter on the eighth day, when he is invited to probe the wounds, or like the nails and spear to penetrate the flesh. John does not say if Thomas actually probes the wounds, which leaves the scene open to many and varied artistic representations. John only mentions Thomas' uttering "My Lord and my God." The Lord's response literally translates, "Since you have seen me, you have believed. Blessed they who have not seen, yet have believed."

Now here is what strikes me as odd: in referring to the wounds of the body, did Thomas mean the dead body, or the living person? What do we see when we look at anyone? We see their body, or identifiable parts of it; but is seeing the body to see the person? If we see a dead body we do not say it is the person, but that we have seen his or her body. A person is somehow more than a body, and a dead body is not a person. Our common-sense approach is to say that when we see a living body we have seen the person, and when he or she is dead we say we have seen his or her body. As the dead body of Jesus was deposited in the tomb the wounds could have been probed, but that could not have prompted the statement "*I have seen the Lord*" nor led to belief beyond believing that he was dead.

John, in his unique and richly literary manner, is pointing back through the gospel to the threaded references to seeing Jesus and believing in him (e.g., 6:40; 9:37-38; 20:8). There were those, blessed indeed, who saw him in the flesh and who saw his body, yet some of them never believed. Blessed indeed too are those who saw him risen, and believed; yet there are those who cannot see him, neither alive in the flesh nor his dead body (for that time and opportunity have passed), but who believe—these can see and hear him in a different way. One way is within the liturgical gathering itself, for it is his body, living in the members gathered to him, and in this body his greeting is heard again, "*Peace be with you.*"

Gospel John 20:19-31

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John *After eight days Jesus came in and stood among them.*

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord,' he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you,' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.
