

PENTECOST 5th June 2022



Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

"There appeared to them tongues as of fire... and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit" (Ac 2:3-4). The feast of Pentecost is distinguished from all the other feasts of the Church, due its importance. It announces the very purpose of Jesus' mission. "I came to cast fire upon the earth; and would that it were already kindled!" (LK 12: 49). The real fire, the Holy spirit, was sent to the earth by Jesus. He accomplished it and obtained this gift for us through his death on the cross. He wants to continue giving this fire of love to every person from generation to generation. It is his free gift and he continues to give it to us through the mystical Body of Christ which is his Church. Jesus exercises his mission through the Church. "Receive the Holy Spirit", the lord said to the Apostles after his Resurrection and breathed on them. God's communication continued with and through Apostles. The disciples prepared for the Pentecost and to receive the gift of the Holy spirit by being together in one place and they devoted themselves, all that time in prayer. It was in prayer that the disciples experienced the Holy spirit and were filled with the spirit. The same situation applies to each of us today. It is in prayer the Church today can be filled with the Holy spirit. It is through this silent listening to the words of Jesus that we receive the gift of God. The Biblical images used for the holy spirit is the image of the wind and of the fire. The air is important for us to be alive and without the air we breathe, we will be dead. The Holy spirit gives us the spiritual air that keeps us spiritually alive. In the modern world, science tells us how pollution can destroy life. The pollution of heart can kill us spiritually. We know many things in our physical world that contaminate the nature, the same way there are many things that corrupts and contaminate our minds and hearts and make our hearts closed to the works of the spirit in us. Many times, our corrupt minds and polluted hearts intoxicate Our whole being. It is through deep prayer that we gain the freedom to be open to the spirit and experience his divine love. When we are filled with the spirit of prayer, we gain the power to use our personal freedom in the proper way. When God's energy fills us, it renews the face of the earth. When this fire of love is in us and in the Church, it can Undertake the very work of Christ, the renewal and reconciliation of the world with its creator. The fire of love eliminates fear, and the Holy spirit enables us to proclaim the Good News of the risen Christ. Then the mystery of God becomes immanent to us. The ultimate concern of the Bible is the Good news that God is unconditionally loving and forgiving. In the end, each of us are invited to become part of the Good News. The holy spirit means life-in-fullness. God shares his love and life with us gratuitously, without any preconditions, without price. The Holy spirit continuously communicates His life to us in various forms and in a variety of ways. God has created us with so many capacities and gifts, such as intelligence, will, emotions, feelings, imagination, memory and our body. Through these gifts we recognize the special seven gifts that the Holy spirit has given to the church and to each of us individually. (Wisdom, knowledge, counsel, fortitude, understanding, piety and fear of the lord). But the pity is that very few of us live our lives fully. We only use a tiny part of our capacities. We close down many beautiful facets . Pentecost invites us to live our lives to the fullness and use all those gifts given to us as a community and as individuals for the glory of God as partners in God's mission of establishing his kingdom.

Entrance Antiphon

First Reading A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike -Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God.

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live.

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.


