

Twenty Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 October 2022



Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

Today's first reading (Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4) sits oddly with the gospel; it is one of the few times when the two readings do not have an obvious connection. This is the sole reading from this prophet in the Sunday Lectionary, so with the pericope being composed of the opening of one complaint and the answer to a second and similar complaint it should perhaps be accepted as a sampler of this prophet, who proclaims trust in God's power to save, even though Israel is in the midst of woes and is surrounded by nations acting unjustly. Read in that manner it seems to have more correspondence with the second reading, 2 Timothy 1:6-8,13-14, the first of the series of extracts from this epistle to be read over four Sundays. Similarly to Habakkuk this epistle encourages steadfastness in the face of persecution. But this faith is not merely to be passively preserved; it is to be actively fostered, fanned into a flame. This then does find an echo in the apostles petitioning the Lord in the opening of the gospel pericope (Luke 17:5-10) to increase their faith. This section of Luke's gospel appears to be a collection of the Lord's sayings and of various encounters, and it is without an obvious narrative structure. The second part of today's passage has a sort of parable leading to a saying about servants doing their duty.

The gospel's first saying associates mustard seeds and mulberry trees, and contains a command that none in the world has ever accomplished. It leaves us perplexed, and wondering if something has been lost in translation. We may spend much time quibbling over which species of mustard is meant and what size its seed is, or whether the tree is really a mulberry or a sycamore (a very large fig with mulberry-like leaves), or about their uses or symbolic meanings in ancient Israel, but it is easier to settle for the less literal vet perhaps more obvious meaning: even only a little faith can accomplish surprisingly great things. A modern image that comes unbidden to my mind, though not on the face of it a matter of religious faith, is that of the unknown courageous man with his shopping bags who stopped the procession of tanks in Tiananmen Square in 1989. He, though small and fragile in comparison to the tanks, stopped for at least a while that which was insurmountably stronger than him, such that the images captured of his actions (which China can never eradicate from the internet) endeared him to the world as a symbol of the power of the apparently powerless. So too throughout Christian history the gospel was spread not through the demonstration of great wonders that would sweep all doubt before them, but through combined efforts of the constant demonstration of small things done to those in need and the witness of those martyrs crushed by an almighty empire in its vain attempt to stop the spread of the gentle gospel in its tracks.

WHY WE DO WHAT WE DO

CHAPTER 11 - II. THE DIFFERENT ELEMENTS OF THE MASS (GIRM 2012) con't

Gestures and Bodily Posture

42. The gestures and bodily posture of both the Priest, the Deacon, and the ministers, and also of the people, must be conducive to making the entire celebration resplendent with beauty and noble simplicity, to making clear the true and full meaning of its different parts, and to fostering the participation of all.⁵² Attention must therefore be paid to what is determined by this General Instruction and by the traditional practice of the Roman Rite and to what serves the common spiritual good of the People of God, rather than private inclination or arbitrary choice.

A common bodily posture, to be observed by all those taking part, is a sign of the unity of the members of the Christian community gathered together for the Sacred Liturgy, for it expresses the intentions and spiritual attitude of the participants and also fosters them.

43. The faithful should stand from the beginning of the Entrance Chant, or while the Priest approaches the altar, until the end of the Collect; for the Alleluia Chant before the Gospel; while the Gospel itself is proclaimed; during the Profession of Faith and the Universal Prayer; and from the invitation, Orate, fratres (*Pray, brethren*), before the Prayer over the Offerings until the end of Mass, except at the places indicated here below.

The faithful should sit, on the other hand, during the readings before the Gospel and the Responsorial Psalm and for the Homily and during the Preparation of the Gifts at the Offertory; and, if appropriate, during the period of sacred silence after Communion.

They should kneel, on the other hand, at the Consecration, except when prevented on occasion by ill health, or for reasons of lack of space, of the large number of people present, or for another reasonable bow when the Priest genuflects after the Consecration.

It is for the Conference of Bishops, in accordance with the norm of law, to adapt the gestures and bodily postures described in the Order of Mass to the culture and reasonable traditions of peoples.⁵³ However, attention must be paid to ensuring that such adaptations correspond to the meaning and character of each part of the celebration. Where it is the practice for the people to remain kneeling after the Sanctus (*Holy, Holy, Holy*) until the end of the Eucharistic Prayer and before Communion when the Priest says *Ecce Agnus Dei* (*Behold the Lamb of God*), it is laudable for this practice to be retained.

For the sake of uniformity in gestures and bodily postures during one and the same celebration, the faithful should follow the instructions which the Deacon, a lay minister, or the Priest gives, according to what is laid down in the Missal.

In Australia: The faithful should stand from the beginning of the Entrance Chant, or while the Priest approaches the altar, until the end of the Collect; for the Alleluia Chant before the Gospel; while the Gospel itself is proclaimed; during the Profession of Faith and the Universal Prayer; and from the completion of the Priest's invitation, Orate, fratres (*Pray, brethren*), before the Prayer over the Offerings until the end of Mass, except at the places indicated here below.

The faithful should sit, on the other hand, during the readings before the Gospel and the Responsorial Psalm and for the Homily and during the Preparation of the Gifts at the Offertory.

In the dioceses of Australia, they should kneel from the completion of the Sanctus (*Holy, Holy, Holy*) until after the Amen of the Eucharistic Prayer, except when prevented on occasion by ill health, or for reasons of lack of space, of the large number of people present, or for another reasonable cause. However, those who do not kneel ought to make a profound bow when the Priest genuflects after the Consecration. They are to kneel again after the Agnus Dei (*Lamb of God*) until the distribution of Holy Communion.⁵³ During the period of sacred silence after Communion, they may either sit or kneel.

For the sake of uniformity in gestures and bodily postures during one and the same celebration, the faithful should follow the instructions which the Deacon, a lay minister, or the Priest gives, according to what is laid down in the Missal.

44. Among gestures are included also actions and processions, by which the Priest, with the Deacon and ministers, goes to the altar; the Deacon carries the Evangeliary or Book of the Gospels to the ambo before the proclamation of the Gospel; the faithful bring up the gifts and come forward to receive Communion. It is appropriate that actions and processions of this sort be carried out with decorum while the chants proper to them are sung, in accordance with the norms laid down for each.

Silence

45. Sacred silence also, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at the designated times.⁵⁴ Its nature, however, depends on the moment when it occurs in the different parts of the celebration. For in the Penitential Act and again after the invitation to pray, individuals recollect themselves; whereas after a reading or after the Homily, all meditate briefly on what they have heard; then after Communion, they praise God in their hearts and pray to him. Even before the celebration itself, it is a praiseworthy practice for silence to be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred celebration in a devout and fitting manner.


