

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe 20 November 2022



Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

For the sake of precision, the common designation of a character in today's gospel (Luke 23:35-43) as "the Good Thief" is oxymoronic; if he were good at being a thief he would not have been caught. Luke does not say that he is a thief, but refers to him as an "evil doer". It is Mark and Matthew who the two crucified alongside Jesus robbers or thieves, but they both deride him. John refers to them simply as "two others", so they neither deride nor repent. So Luke's character's later appellation is a result of cross-pollination or of the harmonisation of the separate gospels in people's minds. What are we to make of Luke's unique account?

Back on Sunday 24C we read what the Lectionary's introduction calls the "Gospel within the Gospel: the message of pardon and reconciliation—the parables of God's mercy". Mercy is not mentioned directly in any of the three parables; the concept they do clearly share is the rejoicing that takes place on retrieving what had been lost. To speak of mercy, which is to put aside retribution and to release from punishment, makes no sense concerning the lost coin or missing sheep, for what punishment could either deserve? A stupid and bad shepherd might indeed punish a reclaimed sheep for having strayed, but what could be done to punish a retrieved coin, and who would try it? The wayward son of the third parable may merit censure, but he meets instead the compassion of his father, who does not treat the son as he himself thinks he deserves—that is mercy. Again, however, it is not mercy that is common to all three parables, but God's rejoicing, which is a grace, the bestowal of a good thing undeserved. God's rejoicing over the redeemed and regained is a manifestation of God's merciful grace.

It is worth thinking about some simple definitions. A penalty is the punishment deserved for a bad thing, reward the bestowal of a good thing earned, grace the good thing undeserved, and mercy the undeserved release from the penalty deserved.

Those parables, two of which are unique to Luke, were told in the middle of the journey to Jerusalem, on the way of the cross; at its beginning Jesus had invited his disciples metaphorically to take up their cross and follow him (Sunday 12C); here on the last Sunday in Ordinary Time, on the feast commonly called Christ the King, we are at that journey's end, at Jerusalem and on the cross. Here we are presented with Luke's unique account of one who echoes those parables, the one crucified with him though he had not taken up the cross of discipleship to follow him, who acknowledges his own wrongdoing and asks to be remembered in the kingdom, and who is promised welcome in paradise that same day. He is not rewarded for any good thing he has done. Rather here is the lost sheep brought home by the shepherd, here we find not so much a lost coin unearthed but perhaps a rough diamond, and here the errant brother is welcomed by the elder brother, "the first born from the dead" (NRSV, Colossians 1:18), who invites him on the Father's behalf into heaven's celebration of the lost and restored.



He is before all things, and in him all things hold together.



Liturgy is always an action, something we do. It is a public action, a ritual action, and a symbolic action. It is the proclamation of the word that God speaks to us; it is in the breaking of the bread that we recognise Christ. We participate in the action of the liturgy by responding, singing, listening and joining the gestures.

Liturgical seasons

The worship of the Catholic Church follows a calendar that is based on a cycle of liturgical seasons plus saints' days celebrated throughout the year.

Just as we mark our lives by anniversaries, the Church celebrates the mysteries of Christ's life in a recurrent pattern. Within the cycle of a year the Church remembers and celebrates Christ's conception, birth, death, resurrection and sending of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

During the course of the year we bring to mind past events and people to keep the mystery of faith alive today and we look forward to Christ's return in glory at the end of time. As pilgrim people, we are constantly nourished by the story of Jesus and guided by the saints, our ancestors in the faith, living witness of God's unchanging love.

In some respects the church's way of keeping time conflicts with the secular calendar. The new liturgical year begins on the first Sunday of Advent at the end of November, just as many other things like the academic year are coming to an end. The seasons of the liturgical year are:

- **†** Advent a period covering the 4 Sundays before Christmas during which we prepare to celebrate Christ's birth and anticipate his coming again at the end of time. The liturgical colour for Advent is violet.
- † Christmas the season of Christmas celebrates Christ's birth and early manifestations. It runs from 25th December to until the feast of the Baptism of the Lord on the Sunday after 6th January. The liturgical colour for the Christmas season is white.
- † Lent the 6-week time of preparation for the celebration of Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday and finishes on the evening of Holy Thursday. The liturgical colour for Lent is violet.
- † Easter the heart of the liturgical year is the Easter Triduum (three days) celebrated from the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday evening. The Easter Vigil is the high-point of the celebration. The joyful celebration of Christ's resurrection continues for the 50-day Easter season from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. The liturgical colour for Easter is white.

Apart from these seasons, there are 33 or 34 weeks of the year that do not celebrate a particular aspect of the mystery of Christ but are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This period of the Church calendar is called Ordinary Time because the weeks are numbered in order. The liturgical colour for Ordinary Time is green.
