Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

The First Sunday in Lent each year presents Jesus in the wilderness confronting the reality of sin and evil. We hear of him fasting for forty days, and our season of Lent is our own forty-day journey into the wilderness, into the desert, into the outback of our own lives in imitation of his, just as his forty days was in imitation of the forty-year wandering of the people of Israel after their exodus from Egypt before reaching the Promised Land.

Commentators have debated how we are to understand the Greek peiradzo: is Jesus tempted into sin, or is his understanding of what it is to be the Son of God (remembering that the story of the baptism of Jesus is the one immediately before this one in all three Synoptic Gospels) being put to the test? Some have speculated about whether these three episodes are some kind of umbrella covering every form of sin. We seem to have gluttony (stone into bread), pride or hubris (jumping from the top of the temple), and greed or avarice (selling his soul to the devil for the kingdoms of the world). In terms of the seven deadly sins, catalogued by Evagrius Ponticus and John Cassian, this covers only three out of seven.

What had been proclaimed at the Jordan with the baptism of Jesus was that he was in a relationship with God, he was the beloved of God. Everyone who is baptised is proclaimed as the beloved of God also. An openness to the other, a concern for the wellbeing of others, is life, while being closed off from the other, being concerned only for the self, is death and sin. In the desert for forty days Jesus explored just what being in a relationship with God was all about. In the desert time of this Lent we are to explore what our being in a relationship with God is all about for us.

The tree in the middle of the garden, from which the serpent hung, brought death. In this story from Genesis we are given religious truth rather than literal truth, and the truth is that selfishness is sin. The tree on Calvary, from which Jesus hung, brought life. Writing to the Christians in Rome Paul understood this contrast between Adam and Christ. Sin came into the world through the first man, and righteousness came into the world through the last man. The first man brought death and condemnation, the last man brought life and justification.

The way through the temptations of our lives is to find strength and nourishment in the Word of God. St Augustine of Hippo said:

Do you think that the word of God is bread? If the Word of God, through whom all things have been made, were not bread, he would not say: 'I am the living bread that has come down from heaven.' You have learned, then, how to answer the tempter when you are in a bad way from hunger. [Footnote: Enarrationes in Psalmos 90/2. The excerpts from the translations of Augustine's homilies on the Psalms come from Augustine, Expositions of the Psalms, trans. Let us thank God that Jesus was sent to bring us life. Let us thank God that Jesus is the Word who nourishes us in our hunger. Let us thank God that the Spirit gives us strength to guide us through life's temptations. Let us thank God that the Spirit calls new members to our Christian family and pray that they soon join us in this eucharistic meal we share.

First Reading

A reading from the book of Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7

Creation of our first parents, and sin.

The Lord God fashioned man of dust from the soil. Then he breathed into his nostrils a breath of life, and thus man became a living being.

The Lord God planted a garden in Eden which is in the east, and there he put the man he had fashioned. The Lord God caused to spring up from the soil every kind of tree, enticing to look at and good to eat, with the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in the middle of the garden.



What Is Lent All About, and Why Is It Important?

Have you ever wondered what people are talking about when they say they're giving something up for Lent? Do you want to understand what Lent is and how it relates to Easter?

Lent is the 40 days (not including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to the Saturday before Easter. Lent is often described as a time of preparation and an opportunity to go deeper with God. This means that it's a time for personal reflection that prepares people's hearts and minds for Good Friday and Easter.

What Are the Key Days During Lent?

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. You may have noticed people with a smudged, black cross on their foreheads. Those are ashes from the Ash Wednesday service. The ashes symbolize our grief for the things we've done wrong and the resulting division of imperfect people from a perfect God.

Maundy Thursday is the day before Good Friday. It commemorates the night before Jesus died, when He shared the Passover meal with His closest friends and followers.

Good Friday is the day Christians remember Jesus' death. The "Good" reflects how Jesus' death was a sacrifice on our behalf so we can receive God's forgiveness for our wrongs, or sins.

Easter Sunday is the joyful celebration of Jesus rising from the dead to give us the opportunity of eternal life. While people still die, Jesus made the way for people to have a relationship with God in this life and to spend eternity with Him in heaven.

What Happens During Lent and Why?

The three main things people focus on during Lent are prayer, fasting (abstaining from something to reduce distractions and focus more on God) and giving, or charity.

Prayer during Lent focuses on our need for God's forgiveness. It's also about repenting (turning away from our sins) and receiving God's mercy and love.

Fasting, or giving something up, is a very common practice during Lent. The idea is that giving up something that's a regular part of life, like eating dessert or scrolling through Facebook, can be a reminder of Jesus' sacrifice. That time can also be replaced with more time connecting with God.

Giving money or doing something good for others is a way to respond to God's grace, generosity and love. For example, some people spend time volunteering or donate money they would normally use to buy something, like their morning coffee.

It's important to note that doing these things can never make us earn or deserve Jesus' sacrifice or a relationship with God. People are flawed and will never be good enough for a perfect God. Only Jesus has the power to rescue us from ourselves.

Jesus sacrificed Himself on Good Friday to bear the punishment for all our wrongdoings and offer us forgiveness. He was raised from the dead on Easter Sunday to give us an opportunity to have a relationship with God for eternity.

Spending time during Lent praying, fasting and giving can make Jesus' sacrifice on Good Friday and His resurrection on Easter even more meaningful.




