Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

Have you noticed how some of our Scripture readings throughout the weeks of this Easter season are set on the day of Easter? And how some, like today's first reading from Acts of the Apostles, are set on the day of Pentecost? This is a powerful reminder to us that what we celebrate during this season is not the chronological unfolding of a story but various reflections upon the one mystery: Easter and Pentecost are interwoven realities and we celebrate both together each day of our fifty-day season.

The first letter of Peter sums up this Easter mystery, saying that Christ died 'so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness'. Easter is about living the new life of conversion. It echoes Peter's address in Acts of the Apostles about repentance: baptism is for the forgiveness of sins and receiving the Spirit. It is not a one-off event, but something that is lived out day by day. Just as Easter is the victory of life over death in the person of Jesus, it is the victory of belonging and purpose over being lost and alone. The first letter of Peter describes this new reality with a metaphor: 'You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd'.

The shepherd image is, of course, the constant and powerful image for this Sunday in Easter. I remember reading somewhere once that in the first half of the twentieth century, Psalm (129)130, the De profundis, 'Out of the depths', was the psalm with which most Christians identified. It is one of the psalms of lamentation that emphasises human helplessness and longing. Perhaps the experiences of the two world wars during those decades make this an understandable choice. In the second half of the twentieth century, the same account continued, Psalm (22)23, "The Lord is my shepherd', became more popular. It speaks of care and protection, of richness and fullness. Chapter 10 of John's Gospel, which we read over the three-year period of the lectionary cycle for this Sunday in Easter, takes up this pastoral image.

Today's particular extract from chapter 10 of John speaks more about the pen or enclosure, and Jesus speaks of himself as the gate of the pen. The proper way in or out is through him.

In early Christian catacomb art in Rome, the image of the shepherd with a sheep slung over his neck was a popular one. It was probably even a pre-Christian image that Christians adopted. Its use in funerary art is easy to explain. The last lines of the psalm say: 'In the Lord's own house shall I dwell for ever and ever. The idea of the shepherd leading us into eternity is clear. In chapter 10 of John the idea of eternal life was also found by early Christians. In one of his homilies on this gospel, St Augustine of Hippo noted some sixteen hundred years ago that the gospel says that Jesus leads the sheep in and out through the gate and that he has come to say that people may have life and have it to the full. Augustine could see two realities here. Coming into the gate was baptism and the pen was life in the church. Coming out of the gate was death and entry to the pastures of eternity, and the fullness of life. This is what Augustine said: 'For he seems to me to have meant that they may have life going in, and have it more abundantly going out. For no one can go out through the gate-that is by Christ-to that eternal life which shall be face to face, unless by the same gate-that is, by the same Christ-he has entered his church, which is his fold, to the temporal life, which is lived in faith' (In Euangelium Iohannis Tractatus 45).

So today we are thankful that God has called us to join this flock; we are thankful that, through baptism and the gift of the Spirit, we belong. We are thankful that Jesus is our shepherd who comforts us with crook and staff. We are thankful that the shepherd will one day lead us out into the eternity of the Lord's house. We are thankful to share in this meal of bread and wine, which is a foretaste of the banquet prepared for us in the sight of our foes. We are an Easter people and alleluia is our song. Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them.


So Jesus spoke to them again:

Formation and Training for Ministers at the Altar

We will be having formation and training to parishioners who wishes to serve at the altar in our liturgies and masses. This includes for the:

- Ministers at the Altar (a.k.a. Acolytes) who is responsible for the smooth flow of the liturgy celebrations, distribute Holy Communion and (sometimes) read the Scriptures. Open to all men and women age 18 and above, and must be able to secure a Working With Children Check.
- Ministers of the Word proclaims the Scriptures and commentate in Liturgies. Open to all men and women age 18 and above.
- Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Communion (a.k.a. Eucharistic Ministers) distribute the Holy Communion and is also called to give Holy Communion to the sick and homebound.
- Junior Servers assist the celebrant, Deacons and Acolytes in the Liturgy celebrations. Open to all boys and girls from age 10 years old, and must have received the Sacraments of Holy Communion and (preferably) Confirmation.

The schedules will be conducted in the church as follows:

- 1. Introduction to Liturgy Ministry at 7-9pm on Wed, 10th May
- 2. Practical Training on how to serve for your Ministry from 7-9pm on Fri, 26th May, and
- 3. Commissioning is during the 10.30am Pentecost Sunday mass on 28th May.

\Rightarrow VINNIES VAN



When Christians pray for nine days for a special occasion or intention they are participating in novena prayers. The first novena ever prayed occurred immediately after Jesus ascended to heaven. The Sacred Scriptures tell us, "When they entered the city [of Jerusalem] they went to the upper room where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers." (Acts 1:13-14)

The Apostles and other disciples gathered in the upper room together with Mother Mary and prayed for the descent of the Holy Spirit as Jesus had promised. For nine days, they prayerfully gathered until the feast of Pentecost. Certainly, this must have been a powerful nine-day experience as many present-day novenas are. Novena prayers also offer us some extra good news. In addition to obtaining a particular favor by praying a novena, there are five benefits of doing novena prayers that we gain and that I would like to share with you.

1. Gift of Hope...

Our decision to pray a novena is often the result of an urgent impulse of our soul, which longs for God's presence and intervention in our lives. This longing develops into a hope that convinces us that the Almighty God will favor us with His divine assistance. Truly, the words of the psalmist describe this growing hope within the person praying: "Wait for the LORD, take courage; be stouthearted, wait for the LORD!" (Ps. 27:14). When we pray a novena, we grow in the virtue of hope because we learn to "wait for the Lord" in prayer. Certainly, we can appropriate the beautiful words of hope found in Psalm 130 (vs 5-7), "I wait for the LORD, my soul waits and I hope for his word. My soul looks for the Lord more than sentinels for daybreak. More than sentinels for daybreak, let Israel hope in the LORD, for with the LORD is mercy, with him is plenteous redemption..."

MAY - Month of Mary our Blessed Mother

The month of May is especially dedicated to our Blessed Mother. All honour and devotion that we give to Mary our Mother lead us to Jesus.

"Flowers for Mary" – For this month of May, we invite children to bring flowers to be offered to the Blessed Mother at mass. This gift of flowers is a sign of our love and thanksgiving for through her "Yes," Jesus came to us.

"Living Rosary" – We will conclude our Marian Celebration with a Living Rosary on Saturday, 27 May 2023, at 5:00 pm at St Mark's Square to be followed by a procession that leads us to church for the Vigil Mass. We invite school-age children preferably from 8 years old up to come and participate in this exciting and special way of praying the rosary. This will be the second Living Rosary in our parish, and we would like to make this another memorable event. We remain hopeful that this will become an annual tradition. So please encourage your children/grandchildren to come and/or participate.

What is a Living Rosary?

A living rosary is when people are used to represent each bead of the rosary. What we need:

- a. **50** children (10 per decade) to represent the Hail Mary beads
- b. **3** children (for the tail of the rosary) to represent the Hail Mary beads
- c. 1 child to represent the cross (the Apostle's Creed)
- d. 6 children (2 for the tail of the rosary and 4 between each decade) to represent the Our Father Beads.

2. Gift of Prioritization...

Taking up a novena can sometimes help us learn to put things in life in their correct order. We are reminded that our relationship with God takes precedence over other people, situations, activities and things that occupy our time and energy. Our Savior says, "Seek first the kingdom [of God] and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides." (Mt 6:33) A novena can help us understand that we must make time for God and prayer with Him. When we place God first in our lives, schedule several moments of prayer throughout the day, and regularly visit His House (i.e. church on Sundays and holy days of obligation), everything else falls into place sooner or later.

3. Gift of Commitment...

Novenas cannot be prayed without a willingness to engage in prayer until the end. When we start a novena, we are making a solemn promise or agreement to pray for nine days for a particular intention. This process requires commitment. Certainly, we are living at a time in which there is a deep crisis when it comes to commitment. Novenas can potentially teach us the importance of commitment – to God, to prayer, to work and to service.

4. Gift of Perseverance...

An exhortation from the book of Ephesians offers a glimpse of the importance of perseverance: "With all prayer and supplication, pray at every opportunity in the Spirit. To that end, be watchful with all perseverance and supplication for all the holy ones." (verse 18) Saint Paul encouraged the Ephesians to live praying and begging to God at all times. When this is done at every opportunity in the Spirit, the Christian is persevering in prayer. Hence, novenas can potentially instruct us in the art of persevering in prayer and Christian discipleship until the end.

5. Gift of Devotion...

Father John A. Hardon, S.J. defined devotion as "the disposition of [the] will to do promptly what concerns the worship and service of God... Essential to devotion is readiness to do whatever gives honor to God, whether in public or private prayer (worship) or in doing the will of God (service)." (Pocket Catholic Dictionary – Abridged Edition of Modern Catholic Dictionary) Novena prayers have been known to increase devotion among the faithful. Furthermore, praying a powerful novena can transform our faith and prayer life so profoundly that our primary task gradually becomes glorifying God wholeheartedly whenever we pray or serve. A preference for God's will and things saturates the heart of the Christian that develops this virtue of devotion through the regular rhythm of novena prayers.


