Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

The second discourse of Matthew's Gospel occupies chapter 10. We hear it proclaimed on this Sunday and the following. In Matthew's version, the mission of the Twelve is only to the people of Israel (10:5-16) and they are to preach the nearness of kingdom not only in word but in action, by healing the sick, raising the dead, cleansing lepers, and casting out demons. Jesus warns them of the opposition they would encounter (10:17-25), before moving to today's section, which speaks of the fearlessness the apostles are to need in the face of such opposition.

'Do not be afraid', is the exhortation of Jesus to his apostles and to us. We live in a church seemingly enmeshed in endless scandal; the good news of God's love seems imprisoned in the darkness of unending failure among those of us who seek to serve God's people through leadership and ministry. Our society has lost trust in the institutional church because of such inexcusable evil. The words of Jesus today promise that even such tragedy cannot overpower the message, even though it certainly seems that way at the moment. Jesus promises that God watches over those whom the rest of the world forgets, the sparrows among us. It does seem hard to believe in a God who cares for the small and insignificant when many of the most vulnerable among us suffer at our hands instead of being cherished.

So these words of Jesus are ever more pressing as things look darkest. More than ever, Jesus' call to bear witness to him needs to be taken up by every baptised person. The Spirit has been given to us and it is the Spirit who shines in the darkness, it is the Spirit who makes Jesus come to life within us, it is the Spirit who gives us strength in our weakness. We bear witness to him by the faithfulness we show to his gospel, by the life-affirming care we lavish upon the downtrodden and destitute, the helpless and the homeless, the vulnerable and the needy.

Augustine of Hippo advises his community: Let us fear, in order not to fear; that is, let us fear wisely, in order not to fear groundlessly' (Sermo 65). We would be wise to fear denying God by a life of sin that does not bear witness to the life and love promised us. We would be wise to fear complacency, which blinds us to the demands of constant reform and conversion.

While today's gospel calls us to action, it also calls us to give thanks. We must be thankful for those who do witness to what is true and right, even if their fidelity is overshadowed by the failings of others. We must be thankful that fear is not the final word, that failure will not extinguish the good news of God's love, no matter how much that flickering light of hope seems to be about to go out. We must be thankful that the grace of God, poured into our hearts through the Spirit who makes our gifts of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ given up for our nourishment, is about to be given once again to us in this sacred meal we share.

PARISH COUNCIL ELECTION

Parish Council will be composed of 5 elected members, 3 people appointed by the parish priest, the parish representative to the deanery council and the heads of all ministries and representative each from both our schools.

Nominate a person whom you think is best suited to do the job or nominate yourself, if you consider you can offer a service to the community.

Nominated names can be dropped in the box located at both entrances of the church.

Please include three qualities that you see in the person whom you recommend.

Parish council nominations will <u>close</u> on the **9th July**. <u>Election</u> will take place during the general assembly of the parish on the **16th July**, from **2.30pm to 4.30pm** in the Church.

The qualifications of the pastoral council member


- ♦ 18 years of age and above, practice the faith and be actively involved in the parish or willing to be involved.
- be able to discern, advice, cooperate and work with the parish priest and other members of the parish and be available for the parish meetings and able to respond if and when special need arises.

Parishioners are asked to come and attend the assembly. Attendance for all ministry members is compulsory.

DRIVEWAY/CARPARK SAFETY

For everyone's safety, please park <u>at least 1.8 meters</u> from the church's driveway entrance.

Your parked vehicle must <u>not block</u> the flow of traffic or impair the vision of other drivers getting into or out of the parking lot, basically impeding vehicles from entering, exiting or turning into or from the church's driveway.



Vehicle safety is more than just staying alert when parking your car. Let us not become a danger to other road users.

Remember to please always use the footpath on both sides of the church car park when walking around the church parking lot, again for safety reasons.



Please make sure when you come to Mass, let us consider our neighbours. Do not block the neighbours' driveway.

Statutes for Pastoral Councils

A parish is a community of Christ's faithful within the Diocese. The pastoral care of the parish is entrusted to a parish priest by the bishop.

The Second Vatican Council recommends that

In dioceses, as far as possile, councils should be set up to assist the Church's apostolic work, whether in the field of evangelization and sanctification or in the fields of charity, social laity in whatever way proves satisfactory. (Apostolate of the Laity, n.26)

By reason of the knowledge, competence or pre-eminence which they have the laity are empowered-indeed sometimes obliged-to manifest their opinion on those things which pertain to the good of the Church. If the occasion should arise this should be done through the institutions established by the Church for that purpose and always with truth, courage and prudence and with reverence and charity towards those who, by reason of their office, represent the person of Christ. (The Church, n.37)

In the Code of Canon Law (Canon 536) states that

#1. If the diocesan bishop judges it opportune after he has heard the presbyteral council, a pastoral council is to be established in each parish, over which the pastor presides and in which the Christian faithful, together with those who share in pastoral care by virtue of their office in the parish, assist in forstering pastoral activity.

#2. A pastoral council possesses a consultative vote only and is governed by the norms established by the diocesan bishop.

In order fo the Church to have the fulness of God's light and guidance the people must be consulted. Thus a totally new ministry of the people of God is born: a special ministry of people and pastor reflecting on the parish's ministerial activity.

On the basis of that reflection a discernment of what needs to be changed or developed in the parish takes place. It is this ministry that is specifically the task of the parish pastoral council.

The parish pastoral council is a representative body of the whole parish, priests, religious and laity, working together to form a Christian community which seeks out and responds to the spiritual and material needs of all God's people.

A parish pastoral council, therefore, should be tryly pastoral and reflect the sharing of responsibility for the Church's mission so that the Church in this diocese may be more obviously the presence of Christ.

OBIECTIVES

- 1. To announce the Word of God, to instruct prople in the truths of the faith and to provide catechetical formation.
- 2. To foster works by which the spirit of the Gospel, including issues of social justice, will be promoted.
- 3. To provide religious education for children and young adults.
- 4. To bring the Gospel message to those who have ceased the practice of their faith and to those with no faith.
- 5. To provide for and to promote the celebration of the sacraments particularly the Eucharist and Penance, and see to it that the Eucharist is the centre of the parish assembly.
- To labour diligently so that spouses and parents are supported in fulfilling their responsibilities and to foster Christian family life
- 7. To encourage and sustain communion within the parish, the diocese and the universal church. This objective includes especially the promotion of Christian unity.

ROLE AND FUNCTION

The Parish Pastoral Council is a consultative body. As such it has the right and duty to provide wise and constructive assessment to the pastor. It is to be involved in prudent policy making, goal planning and setting objectives for the furtherance of the Christian ministry within the parish.

The mission of the Parish Pastoral Council, in cooperation with the pastor, is to see to it that every avenue is opened for all members of the parish to:

1. realise their call as disciples of Christ;

- develop the confidence and skills they need to carry out their mission;
- 3. find in the parish the structure they will need for their continuing growth and support;
- 4. review regularly individual parish goals and strategies to that everyone will have a sense of proceeding purposefully towards establishing God's reign.

In carrying out this role the Parish Pastoral Council will:

- 1. Provide for education and formation of parish councillors and parishioners in understanding the role of the council within the mission of the Church.
- 2. Initiate processes of pastoral planning in order to
 - Develop a vision for the parish
 - Plan appropriate goals and objectives for the spiritual, liturgical and apostolic life of the parish
 - Ensure regular evaluation of the parish's attempts to achieve these goals
- 3. Overview the workings of the parish groups and services and the sharing of services with other parishes so as to provide for
 - The efficient coordination of those services and
 - The initiation of new services where needed.
- 4. Ensure that lines of communication are kept as open as possible amongst parish administration, parish agencies and individual members of the parish and be a means of communication with other parishes, the deanery and the diocese.
- 5. Prepare the parish for the future, particularly through opportunities for future leaders of the parish to emerge and be trained.

COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP

- a. The Council shall consist of:
 - a) Pastor, other clergy and pastoral associates;
 - b) Elected parishioners in sufficient numbers to adequately represent the parish;
 - c) Such parishioners as may be co-opted by the pastor and council provided that these not exceed the number of elected members.
- 2. People who are active members of the Church community and have reached the age of 18 years are eligible for election.
- 3. Membership ofo the council shall be for a period of two years. A retiring member may be reelected provided that he/she has not served for more than six consecutive years. On completion of six years service a retiring member may again be eligible after a lapse of one year.
- 4. Should the position of an elected member become vacant the council shall have the power to appoint a replacement until the next election
- 5. Any member of the council may resign by giving written notice intention to the secretary. The resignation shall operate from its acceptance by the council.

COUNCIL MEETINGS

The Pastoral is ex-officio the president of the council.

Council members shall elect their own chair, vice chair and secretary. They may hold office for no more than two years.

The council shall normally meet once per month or as often as necessary.

Sub-committees may be appointed as required to which other presons may be co-opted. These groups report to the council.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETINGS

An annual general meeting of parishioners should be held on a date fixed by the council.


