Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

We are presented today with another parable of a vineyard (Matt 21:33-43), and it is accompanied by a source of some of its elements in the first reading (Isa 5:1-7). The elements that help identify it as the text alluded to in today's gospel parable are digging a press and building a tower in it-both of which are irrelevant within the parable itself and so are not referred to again; they serve only to point to the book of Isaiah, where the people of Israel and Judah (the two kingdoms) are judged not to have done what was expected of them, producing injustice and bloodshed instead of justice and integrity. In Isaiah, the planted vines are identified with the people; they themselves have failed to produce good fruit and so are at fault. The threatened destruction is consistent with the deportation to Babylon that they were soon to endure. A different representation is followed in the gospel parable, where the vineyard itself is faultless and the vines appear to produce good grapes, but the tenants (who therefore do not own it) refuse to give what is owed to the owner; they disrespect him and do not act towards him as they should. Furthermore, they mistreat the servants he sends (commentary on the earlier treatment of prophets), and in the end they kill even his very son (commentary on the coming crucifixion). In Isa God asks a rhetorical question: What more could I have done for my vinevard? After the parable, Je posed a question to the chief priests and elders: what will the vineyard's owner do when he com Their answer is not that he will destroy the vineyard, as promised in Isaiah, but that he will evict tenants to install a new one who will do what is expected and give what is owed. Thus, contrary Isaiah and the responsorial psalm (Ps 80(79)), the parable's vineyard and vines are not identified with people; the vineyard and its fruit remain good, but the tenants are bad. Instead, the vineyard represe the Kingdom of Heaven, or of God, and although the people of Israel and Judah were chosen installed to work in it, can they presume to have a particular or perpetual claim to it unless they do w is required?

The raises the ugly supersessionist idea, the claim that the people of the Covenant were to be replaced by another people – an idea finally formally rejected in the Second Vatican Council. In this parable we do in fact hear the early Church reflecting on the question: Who are the true people of God, the descendants of Abraham in the flesh (the Jews), or those who act rightly, like Abraham did (Christians, of any nation)? In other words, who are the heirs to the Kingdom? We have already encountered this questioning in the readings and reflections for the nineteenth to twenty-first Sundays in Ordinary Time. It was also raised last Sunday. The difficulty of these questions is that they can be misconstrued to feed a virulent anti-Jewish sentiment, but it should be noted that it is specifically directed at the chief priests and elders, not at the people. The missing verses (v.45-46) also indicate that these last two parables were directed not at Jews as a whole but only at the chief priests and the Pharisees. To disagree with first Century Jewish religious leadership, or with the leadership of any particular group, is not the same as rejecting a people.

The anti-Jewish interpretation is also contrary to the advice of the second reading (Phil 4:6-9) to fill your mind with what is good, and noble, and true; for then God's peace will preserve you in Christ. Peace here is the good fruit, and the produce that is owed. The fact that what was essentially intra-faith polemics between the pro- and anti-Temple parties as the early Church was being established could give rise to the hatred and persecution that produced last century's Holocaust is truly sad. That modern horror clearly demonstrated alienation of the perpetrators (and enablers) from the Kingdom that the Lord Jesus proclaimed. It emphasises membership of a particular group, whether to a positive or negative end, rather than stressing doing of the work of the Kingdom, the constant emphasis in the Lord's parables themselves.

That is not the way of the Kingdom; the way of the Kingdom requires doing the things of the Kingdom.

First Reading

The vineyard of the Lord God of hosts is the House of Israel.

He leased his vineyard to other farmers.

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son," he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures:

It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see?

'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'




BLIEBURG: MASSACRE OF The croation people 1945




