Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

The link between the first reading (Isa 40:1-5, 9-11) and gospel (Mark 1:1-8) is easily identified, for the latter ("A voice cries in the wilderness, 'Prepare a way...") borrows from the former ("A voices cries, Prepare in the wilderness a way..."). Our translations reveal some ambiguity here around the question: Is it the voice or the way that is in the wilderness? The position of the phrase "in the wilderness" is somewhat ambiguous in the Hebrew as well as in the Greek Septuagint, which Mark cites. However, the Greek lacks the Hebrew's concluding "in the desert" which clearly indicates that the highway is in the wilderness or desert. This suggests our Lectionary's current reading of Isaiah is correct, but there is no indication of where the crying voice is. The ambiguity of the Greek version allows for the application of the image to John the Baptist who lived in the wilderness, in which place he called people to prepare for the arrival of God's saving work. But in this linguistic confusion, another shift has taken place, revealed in the question: Who will use this highway? Since Isaiah refers to the Israelites being released from their Babylonian exile, it is they, God's people, who were to return home to Israel on the way God prepared for them. God does not need the way smoothed, nor does God pass along this way, but commands it to be made easier for the returning people to travel it; their being returned is the manifestation of the glory of the Lord. The "make straight" of our translation of Isaiah seems to refer to direction, that is, in a straight line, but the sense is in fact "level" or "smooth". Hence the mountains and hills are levelled and the valleys filled in, for it matters not whether the road meanders, but that it be smooth and easy for all to take, little lambs and nursing ewes alike.

John the Baptist too makes the way easier, not for God, but for God's people. He is the voice that speaks of peace for God's people. His ministry is that of calling people to repent, and of baptising them for the remission of sins; set free from the penalty for sin they are able to "come home" to the Lord, or are able to receive the Lord who comes. On this Sunday, then, Advent's meaning of "coming" or "drawing near" is somewhat ambiguous, for it is the sinner who comes home, who comes to the Lord. However, at the time of John's ministry it was preparatory to receiving Christ who would proclaim the Kingdom of God, or of Heaven, and provide the abiding remission of sins. Today it is a reminder to us each to cultivate a heart prepared to receive Christ. For we make a mistake if we restrict the references to Christ's arrival to their being a remembrance of past events (either of his birth or of his later emergence in public for his ministry) and a looking forward to his second coming at the end of time. Since we are each still being evangelized, still hearing the Good News, still growing deeper in knowledge of it, we need now to cultivate hearts that are open to receiving it, for it will come in ways unforeseen and unexpected. This means we must attend to the rough obstacles of mountains and valleys that form the metaphorical landscape of our own hearts. However, we are often blind to our own faults and so may not always identify those obstacles we make, be they mountains or hills, or rifts or rills.

How do we smooth what we do not perceive? Perhaps a way is to practise intentionally what we believe to be right and good. Following the images presented in Psalm 85(84), it is to practise compassion with truth or faithfulness, and to practice justice with peace. Christ comes as world healer, and the purgative message of John prepares the way to receive him. If we are Christ's ministers in the world, and thus participants in the work of healing, we need to be like doctors: to observe symptoms of illness, and seek compassionately to heal. In seeking to free others of debilitating conditions, which include the oppressions inflicted by others or society, we may help them to be free to receive the Christ.






