Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

For those who have experienced depression it is easy to identify with Job's reflection in today's first reading (Job 7:1-4,6-7). If not depression, then at least boredom in a vapid life, like children in a hot classroom yearning to be free and wondering why clock's minutes take so long to change. But Job is not young. Rather, his life has been upended, through no fault of his, and he wonders what the point of it all was. He is experiencing dejection and despair, wondering if he has lived thus far in delusion. The psalm responds with the consoling "Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted".

A curiosity of the four Gospels, and the New Testament writings in general, is the scant attention given to the wives of the apostles. We presume, based on cultural studies, that most if not all of them were probably married, but there is little evidence of this for any of them. Today's gospel passage (Mark 1:29-39) definitely indicates that Simon Peter had a wife, but this deduced from the reference to Peter's having mother-in-law. But leaving that detail aside we find that it, and the preceding liberation of the man with the unclean spirit, instigates a procession of people bringing the sick and the possessed for healing—so many that the whole town crowds around the door. Capernaum was not a huge town, and the story makes it sound as if disease and possession were rampant. Could it be true that the population of this town, or of ancient towns in general, experienced more disease and spiritual harassment than normally might be expected? Both states were understood to be signs of the oppression of sin in the world, so it actually indicates the effectiveness and truth of the mission of Jesus; it is one of remission and redemption. The telling of it, however, also stresses that a consequence of the signs worked by Jesus, those demonstrations of the authenticity of his redeeming message, is that they so take people's attention that they start to crowd out his proclaiming the Good News. He is almost overwhelmed by his own success. Seeking temporary solitude and space to pray he left the house before dawn, and when the searching disciples find him he tells them they will depart so as to visit the neighbouring towns to preach there too—that is, after all, his purpose and mission.

Again, more by coincidence than design, there is a parallel in the second reading (1 Cor 9:16-19,22-23) in Paul's reference to the duty laid on him to preach the Good News. This work is not drudgery, as poor Job's life feels to him, but rather it is driven by a passion for it, and his conviction in its vision and goal. Paul, as we know, had been convinced of the rightness of his former life, but having had it upended he came to believe that it was one of self-delusion, and now that he was set free from it he had an invigorating vision of something more profound that gave his life true meaning, the Good News of Jesus. Paul himself then is like those set free from sickness and possession, but not from physical illness nor demons, but from delusion and self-obsession or self-justification.


Responsorial Psalm Ps 146:1-6

How do you prepare for Lent? How have you prepared in the past? What are your ideas about what should happen during Lent?

We have the traditional Catholic practices of praying, fasting, and almsgiving. So, we pray more than usual, or we pray with different emphases. We eat smaller or fewer meals or give up a favorite food or drink group. We give more of our resources or give them specifically to special works of mercy during Lent.

Prayer, fasting, and charitable giving continue to be quite good practices during Lent or at any time.

But, you might think, how do I prepare myself for this season? What needs to happen within so that I can practice with more integrity and intention whatever I'm doing on the outside? There are plenty of ideas for actions and practices during Lent; coming up with ideas usually is not the problem. But we don't want to do anything simply to be doing it, even if it's a good thing. We don't want to make a list of merciful works so that we can place a checkmark beside each one as we accomplish it.

It's good to have a plan for doing. It's also good to have a plan for being.

How do I want to be during Lent this year? More quiet and thoughtful? More open to God's desires? Better able to sit with people who need me? More attentive to sacred readings, whether in church or in private? Do I need to be more compassionate toward my own fears and failings? Do I need to become more courageous about using the gifts God has given me?



In the days prior to Lent, try one or more of these suggestions.

- Ask God, every day, "What does my soul need?" Just ask, and
 wait quietly. Because we're very good at fooling ourselves about
 how we're doing, it might take several days of praying this
 question before we're truly open and humble enough to know
 the answer.
- Ask God, every day, "What about my life makes you happy?" Yes, when God looks at your life, some parts of it—perhaps many aspects of it—bring joy to God's heart. Think of how your children or grandchildren or other people close to you make you happy. God is in relationship with you, which means that your sins grieve God's heart, but also that your growth and love and freedom and kindness bring joy to God of the universe. Again, you will probably need to pray this a few times before you are willing to consider that you give God pleasure, that you make God happy in any way. Stick with this little prayer and keep listening.
- Tell God, and yourself, every day, "I want to be open to the graces of this Lenten season." Maybe you're not open right now, or you're not as open and willing as you'd like to be or think you should be. What else is new? We can always open our lives a bit more, let go of more stuff, listen better, and do more quickly and passionately what we know helps nurture God's kingdom on earth.

This is a beginning: three short and simple prayer starters to ready yourself for the holy season.
