Welcome to the community of the Catholic Parish of St John 23rd Glenwood-Stanhope Gardens where the love of Christ is shining in so many ways.

Acts 1:1-11 is read each year since it is the sole account to give the post-resurrection appearances a time frame of forty days; however, it does not have Jesus ascend (intransitive verb), for he is borne (transitive) to heaven. Luke's briefer gospel parallel likewise has him borne, not ascend, but has no time reference; and Matthew has the same locus and commission but no time frame and no explicit departure (Jesus neither ascending nor being borne); while John alone refers to ascending (John 20:17) it is not witnessed but is implied on the day of the resurrection, as also was the bestowing of the Spirit. While being taken up and going up are not the same thing, Luke's narrative in Acts provides the primary depiction that shaped the tradition, but our name for it is derived from John's verb, ascend (also in John 3:13 and 6:12).

Another use of that verb is found in Paul's letter to the Ephesians, in the pericope offered as the alterative second reading this year (Ephesians 4:1-13) to replace that which may be used each year (Ephesians 1:17-23). Both options have particular mentions of Christ raising the dead, but it is the alternative reading that mentions ascension, though with a rather different meaning emerging from his adapted citation of Psalm 68(67):18 that refers to a triumphal procession in which those captured by the victor are paraded before him as he returns in procession to his city. In this Jewish context the ascending reference is found because that is the usual term for going "up" to Jerusalem, the king's city. The Hebrew is another instance of the verb 'alah (offer, raise, exalt; ascend) already mentioned in the reflections for the Second and Fourth Sundays of Lent this year. The Hebrew and Greek forms of that verse also allow for an ambiguity: the victor leads either those he has captured, or those previously captured by the one whom he has just now conquered. Paul interprets the reference to ascending not as being to Christ's post-resurrection departure from earth, but rather to his departure from where he had descended, the dark abode of the dead (Sheol, Hades, Hell) from which he plunders the former conqueror, Death, rescuing the captives there imprisoned. This is what is depicted in the Eastern icon called the Harrowing of Hell, and is also referred to in that line of the Apostle's Creed that still perplexes people in the new translation, "he descended into hell". Paul's use is, however, somewhat more complex, for the following verses point less to the dead being led thence to heaven, and more to those doomed to death being set free now and appointed as apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers—here and now. This is a similar sense to that found at the end of today's gospel reading (Mark 16:15-20), generally accepted as a later addition; in it Christ is at the Father's right hand yet he is with those sent throughout the world to proclaim his Good News. This unity of the head (Christ in heaven) with his body (his members on earth) is expressed in the first Collect for Mass during the day, yet its inverse form is expressed in the alternative, where those on earth dwell already in heaven. These are not contradictory, but rather are two facets of the same mystery: in Christ is healed the division between God and humankind, heaven and earth, sacred and secular, life and death. This is what empowers those who proclaim Christ Jesus to all peoples, for they know the victory is already won.

First Reading

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Acts 1:1-11

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'.

- c. 1 child to represent the cross (the Apostle's Creed)
- d. 6 children (2 for the tail of the rosary and 4 between each decade) to represent the Our Father Beads.

THE FEAST OF PENTECOST

Seized with the SPIRIT

The Jewish Feast of Weeks, referred to in the books of Exodus and Leviticus, celebrated the completion of the grain harvest. Because it was held 50 days after Passover, it was given the name "Pentecost" (the 50th day) in Greek. The feast came to be regarded both by Jews and Christians as also commemorating the Giving of the Law to Moses on Mt Sinai.

According to the account of Luke in the book of Acts, the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples 50 days after the resurrection day, so the same title "Pentecost" was given by the Church to the feast celebrating the coming of the Spirit. Another popular name for the feast is "Whitsunday". The Whitsunday Islands off Queensland's tropical north coast were so named by Captain James Cook because they were sighted on that day of the Church's calendar.

Originally the term Pentecost was used to refer to the whole of the Easter season, that 50-day period of great rejoicing following Easter, during which no fasting was allowed, prayer was always said while standing (kneeling was forbidden), and the "Alleluia" was sung frequently. During the 4th century, this unified season was divided into separate commemorations, with the ascension being celebrated 40 days after Easter day and Pentecost 10 days later. Egeria, the Spanish nun who visited the Holy Lands at the end of the 4th century, describes a celebration of the feast of Pentecost in her travel diary. The feast had its own octave, like Easter, from early times. In the Roman Rite the octave was removed when the liturgical calendar was revised in 1969.

Pentecost was celebrated with a vigil which, almost from the beginning, became strongly associated with the administration of baptism. In around the year 205 Tertullian, the great leader of the Church in north Africa, wrote: "After Easter, Pentecost is a most joyous time for conferring baptisms, because during that time the resurrection of the Lord was repeatedly proved among the disciples."

The feast of Pentecost commemorates two things: the gift of the Spirit that enables us to praise and proclaim, and the birth of the Church as an active community. The gift of the Spirit, especially when visualised as tongues of fire, may be seen as a prototype for a universal mission and a multicultural society.

The symbol of a dove, commonly found on Pentecost vestments and decorations, does not adequately capture this sense of mission and ministry enabled by the Spirit. Of the 331 direct references to the Spirit in the Bible, only three liken the Spirit to a dove. More common descriptions are of "fire" and "wind". The Spirit "seizes", is "poured out", "lifts up". These dynamic references reflect the sense of excitement and zeal for mission of the early disciples.

The feast of Pentecost celebrates and enriches the sense of community renewal (birth) of the Church, the Church that proclaims salvation through the birth, ministry, passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and the coming of the Holy Spirit.

"Father of light, from whom every good gift comes, send your Spirit into our lives with the power of a mighty wind, and by the flame of your wisdom open the horizons of our minds.

Loosen our tongues to sing your praise in words beyond the power of speech, for without your Spirit we could never raise our voice in words of peace or announce the truth that Jesus is Lord."
