ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

In the spirit of reconciliation, we acknowledge the traditional custodians of the lands in which the Catholic Parish of St John XXIII and the Diocese of Parramatta sits, the land of the Darug and Gundungurra people. We would like to pay our respects to the Aboriginal Elders past, present and future for they hold the traditions, memories and wisdom of Mother Earth on which we place our feet upon today.

Gospel Reflection

The Temple in Jerusalem figures significantly in three out of the four components of today's Liturgy of the Word – notably the First Reading, Responsorial Psalm and Gospel.

From the time of Solomon, the temple was the focal point of Jewish worship. The faith of the Jewish people was first tested when, in 587BCE, the Temple of Solomon in Jerusalem was destroyed by the Babylonians under Nebuchadnezzar. Having been rebuilt after the Jews returned from exile, the Second Temple lasted until its final destruction in 70CE by the Romans during the Jewish-Roman War, some 37 years after the time of Jesus. The temple in Jerusalem was never rebuilt. On the site of the temple today in Jerusalem stands the Dome of the Rock and the al-Aqsa Mosque, both buildings sacred to Islam.

In ancient Jewish times, the Temple was not only the spiritual centre – the 'home' wherein God dwelt – but also a place of pilgrimage. In today's First Reading, it becomes the home of Samuel who is gifted, as a child, by a grateful mother to God. In the temple, Samuel would grow up under the guidance of the priest Eli and would ultimately be called by God to be a Judge or spiritual leader over the Israelites.

The prayer of Hannah, mother of Samuel, after she had left him in the temple, begins with the words: My heart exults in the Lord, my strength is exalted in my God (1 Sam 2:1-10), words echoed over 1000 years later in the Gospel of Luke when Mary visits Elizabeth after becoming pregnant with Jesus: My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my saviour (Luke 1:39-55).

There is something both sad and poignant in the selfless act of Hannah who leaves Samuel, knowing that he will be forever belonging to the Lord, even as there is fear and anxiousness of Joseph and Mary who lose their son for several days and find him in the temple.

As Samuel was presented to the Lord, so too was Jesus as a baby as was the religious custom. Today's Gospel describes the incident when Jesus goes missing amidst the festival crowds in Jerusalem. When discovered, Jesus is found to be sitting among the elders and teachers in the temple, listening intently to their discussions and asking questions.

Luke's account of the incident is a 'stand-alone'. It is not mentioned in any of the other three gospels, and may have been an attempt to establish at this early stage and prior to such things as miracles and preaching, the relation of Jesus himself to the Father. In fact, Luke has Jesus uttering the words: Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house? (Lk 2:49). No longer were we reading what was said of who Jesus was or would become from the angel Gabriel, or Simeon, or even Mary. No, we are hearing this from the mouth of Jesus himself.

The richness of this encounter – what Pope John Paul II referred to as 'joy mixed with drama' in his apostolic letter on the Rosary in 2002 – is an insight into how even the closest of human relationships, he says, is challenged by the absolute demands of the Kingdom. With the anxiety of the parents – Joseph and Mary – contrasted with the growing self-understanding of a confident young son, the story is every family's story and every parent's experience.

The home wherein Jesus would become obedient to his parents and 'increase in wisdom and stature' under their guidance is mirrored in the temple wherein Jesus learns that he belongs to his Father in heaven and must needs be about his Father's business.

Little wonder then that in today's psalm we hear the beautiful words: How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord God of hosts! They are happy who dwell in your house, for ever singing your praise. They are happy, whose strength is in you; turn your eyes, O God our shield, look on the face of your anointed.

He then went down with them and came to Nazareth and lived under their authority. His mother stored up all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom, in stature, and in favour with God and men.

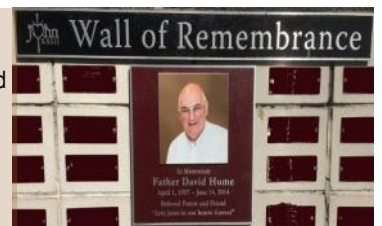

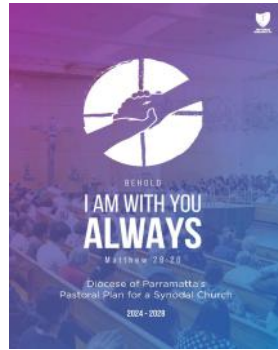
