ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

In the spirit of reconciliation, we acknowledge the traditional custodians of the lands in which the Catholic Parish of St John XXIII and the Diocese of Parramatta sits, the land of the Darug and Gundungurra people. We would like to pay our respects to the Aboriginal Elders past, present and future for they hold the traditions, memories and wisdom of Mother Earth on which we place our feet upon today.

Gospel Reflection

There is a tension in maintaining things in balance. We cannot consume everything as soon as it comes to hand, and it is prudent to set things aside for the future, so we harvest in summer and autumn, or at any time of plenty, and store the produce so as to have something to eat during winter or other times of want. It also frees us from having to search for food daily. In my childhood memories the pantries and cupboards of the extended family were filled each year with preserved fruits and vegetables of all kinds. Today's perennially stocked supermarkets are our pantries, and so the habit of lardering has diminished or vanished. After cyclones have destroyed shops and closed supply lines people suddenly remember, too late, the benefit of stocking at least a few days worthy of emergency supplies. Today little is left in larders or cellars upon death, though the bank account may be full.

Several bird species, and more famously squirrels, cache nuts and seeds, but inevitably the day comes when they die and whatever was stored is lost to them. Is their caching folly, and vain wastage? It is true that the store may then be pilfered by another who thus gains easy pickings from the other's hard work. But some troves are never found, especially those that are buried. Was the time spent doing it in vain? From the perspective of the individual alone, ves, but it could not be known when the activity would become superfluous-and in the case of buried seeds, trees have benefited in having the next generation more widely propagated. The system requires the creative tension of prudent storage for future survival against the inevitable superfluity. It would be a gift indeed to know the hour of death so precisely as to be able to cease working at the right time and to live off one's goods to leave the world with a balance of zero. But that is a very selfish view.

The first reading's "Preacher" laments the system's inevitable "wastage"—and that may be the book's weakness; it seems to have the selfish preoccupation that is prominent in modern times. When society and cultures focus more on the family or community than the individual, what is worked for and stored continues for the

benefit of the family or community after the death of the individual. In the gospel parable the focus is entirely on the wealthy man. But the given context for the parable is avarice, the disordered desire for goods beyond need, or purely for self-interest. This is not the same as the wise use of one's goods, which will appear later in the gospel to be read on Sundays 24C and 25C, indirectly in the parable of a division of a future inheritance (or the parable of "The Prodigal Son") and the parable misnamed as "The Rich Man and Lazarus", told in response to Pharisees mocking Jesus for his teaching on the use of wealth.

By coincidence, the little-used word for "avarice" in the gospel is also found in our second reading (Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11) translated as "greed", as Paul advises Christians in Colossae to put aside earthly qualities, "especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god". Just before that we hear "Let your hearts be on heavenly things" that a direct translation would read as "Consider (or ponder) things above (or on high)". When those two translations are considered together we may be reminded of the opening dialogue to the Eucharistic Prayer, "Lift up your hearts", though our Latin text's Sursum corda more literally reads "Hearts on high (or upward, or above)". The tone of this part of Paul's letter to the Colossians does indeed resonate with the impetus of the Eucharistic Prayer, the "Anaphora" or "Lifting up" of "Offering", which is most clearly spelled out in the dialogue and preface, culminating in the conscious joining of the song of the angels. What we express in the Eucharist and put before us as our model of right living is that selfless self-giving of Christ, the very quality missing from today's parable's rich man. This is true also for all who consider their material acquisitions to be their measure of wealth instead of treasuring the immaterial wealth that surpasses earth and the earthly.

Second Reading

But when Christ is revealed - and he is your life - you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and, in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.







Parables of Jesus: A Guide to Parables in the Bible, What They Are and Why Jesus Used Them

In His birth, Jesus changed the world with the incarnation: God became man. His death and Resurrection changed eternity, conquering death and securing a path for salvation for others.

In His short public ministry, Jesus's words also transformed humanity, challenging conventional wisdom, demonstrating servant leadership and calling on his followers to demonstrate a radical love to build God's kingdom on earth.

He often did this through parables.

Parables compose a large share of Jesus's words captured in the Gospels. He delivered some of his most memorable lessons through parables. Terms like "Good Samaritan" and "Prodigal Son" have transcended religion and become terms people of all faiths recognize.

For Catholics and other Christians, parables are not simply a collection of Bible verses or stories we learn in school. They are dynamic lessons that continue to take on new significance and meaning in an ever-changing world.

What Is a Parable?

According to the dictionary, parables are short allegorical stories designed to teach a truth, religious principle, or moral lesson.

They are often engaging stories that contain few details but are ripe with meaning.

Parables have a place in the tradition of Jewish storytelling. Jesus's parables used elements of everyday life to illustrate a more profound message. In modern times, parables are almost always associated with Jesus.

The Number of Parables

The precise number of parables in the Bible varies based on different definitions of what a parable is.

By some counts, Jesus gave us more than 30 parables in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. Others suggest the total number of parables by Jesus totals more than 50.

The number of distinct parables Jesus offers us is less important than the message they bear.

The Purpose of Parables-Why did Jesus Use Them?

Jesus encountered so many different groups of people during his public ministry.

He spent time with his disciples, with Pharisees, with large crowds of strangers who were listening to him for the first time.

Jesus needed to engage wildly different groups of people, so he told stories that were able to draw in diverse crowds with different points of view.

With parables, Jesus told stories that revealed the truth about God's kingdom while simultaneously challenging the commonly held world views of many of those to whom He spoke.

Just as Jesus addressed crowds years ago, he speaks to all of us today, challenging us to open our hearts to his message.

Common Themes in Parables

Jesus made references to the ordinary that would resonate with his followers, using everyday concepts to draw in his audiences.

He taught lessons to followers through images of plants, vines, seeds and sowers. He shared parables about family dynamics, dinner parties and weddings.

Many of the parables Jesus shared touched on familiar themes, including:

- Love
- Forgiveness
- God's Kingdom
- Prayer
- Redemption
- End times

The Gospel of Matthew and the Gospel of Luke contain the most parables; no parables are found in John's Gospel.

One other commonality with parables is that they often challenge the way we view the world.

"By shattering the structures of our accepted world, parables remove our defenses and make us vulnerable to God," Catholic theologian Barbara E. Reid writes.

Popular Parables

Parables resonate differently with each of us, and we all may have our favorites. Here are some that stand out as well-known and oft-cited parables of Jesus:

- Parable of the Sower
- Parable of the Talents
- Parable of the Prodigal Son
- Parable of the Good Samaritan
- Parable of the Mustard Seed

Why We Should Pray with Parables

Jesus does not always explain in-depth the parables He shares. He often omits many details, rarely mentioning people by name.

The lack of explicit explanation and detail prompts us to prayerfully consider the meaning of parables for us in our time and circumstance.

"Over the ages each community of Christians has had to work out their responses to the challenges of Jesus' teaching," according to Barbara E. Reid. "This task is no less incumbent upon believers today."

Parables are as important now as they were when the followers of Jesus heard them. When we spend time in prayer with the parables, we open our hearts to God's message and what it means for us in our lives.

Since the parables rarely celebrate the status quo, praying with the parables can help us consider how might better help to build God's kingdom here on earth.

Common Questions About Parables

How many parables of Jesus are there? There is no official number of exact parables from Jesus. Sometimes, Jesus explicitly called something a parable; other times, he shares parables without explicitly saying so. In other instances, he shares a single line or two that feels like a parable.

Why did Jesus speak in parables? Parables allowed Jesus to challenge conventional wisdom and encourage His audience to consider a deeper meaning to His words.

Why did Jesus not interpret all of His parables? The parables call us to consider how God wants us to live and act. They call people across time periods, cultures and geographies to reflect on their meaning.

How do parables and fables differ? Parables feature people in everyday situations. Fables often center around animals or other non-humans

What did Jesus say about parables? In Matthew 13:13, Jesus says, "This is why I speak to them in parables: "Though seeing, they do not see; though hearing, they do not hear or understand."
