ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

In the spirit of reconciliation, we acknowledge the traditional custodians of the lands in which the Catholic Parish of St John XXIII and the Diocese of Parramatta sits, the land of the Darug and Gundungurra people. We would like to pay our respects to the Aboriginal Elders past, present and future for they hold the traditions, memories and wisdom of Mother Earth on which we place our feet upon today.

Gospel Reflection

If read literally, today's gospel (Luke 14:25-33) contains a troubling saying that suggests the need to hate others, even family. Idioms rarely translate easily, and here we have an idiomatic Semitic hyperbole translated literally into Greek and then equally literally into English; the idiom, not just the words, needs translation. Rather than hating as we understand that term, the construction refers to preferring someone over another, or a willingness to renounce or forsake someone or something in favour of another. This becomes clearer when the passage is compared to an earlier parallel in the last unit we read from the previous narrative section of the Galilean ministry (Luke 9:18-24, read on Sunday 12C). There we heard Jesus say, "If anyone would come after me, let him renounce himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (9:23), and today, "Whoever does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple" (14:27). The two sayings that accompany it today, one before (the troubling one) and one after the following two parables on counting the cost, can be more flexibly translated and merged to form one, "Whoever will not renounce family and self for me, and whoever does not forsake all possessions, cannot be my disciple" (cf. 14:26,33). Both references to the cross point to an early use of the image of the cross beyond the literalness of the artefact the Romans often used for executions: it is a metaphor for total commitment; just as Jesus commits himself totally to the proclamation of the good news of the kingdom of God, even unto death on the cross, so must his followers be completely committed to him, the kingdom, and its proclamation.

The first reading (Wisdom 9:13-18) has no immediately apparent connection to the gospel. Its personified Wisdom, similarly to the first reading on Trinity Sunday (Proverbs 8:22-31), may be interpreted as referring to either Christ or the Holy Spirit. Wisdom's opening suggests an association with the Spirit, but today's Lectionary pericope is more likely intended to be read christologically due to its combination of incarnational imagery, reference to the teaching role Christians see fulfilled primarily by Jesus, and the final reference to Wisdom saving. But it also evokes Paul's teaching that the cross, a folly in human eyes, reveals God's incomprehensible wisdom (1 Corinthians 1:18-25). Paul did not use "wisdom" as a personification of divine activity, as Wisdom literature does, but as a reference to the human branch of learning called philosophy, which he considered specious. Those consumed by a purely materialistic approach to the world will understand neither the cross of Christ nor the invitation to take up one's own cross to follow him.

Wisdom's image of the body of clay as a weighty oppressor of the soul appears at a surface reading to be a negative view of the material body, a view that would deny the incarnation, but that is a misreading. Rather, it points to an interpretation of the reference to the human being as made in the image and likeness of God, recognising that to be human is to be both a limited physical body, like the earth form which it is made, and rational like God, a facility that therefore, like God, has no bounds; humans are mentally able in some extraordinary capacity to transcend the body's confines so as to perceive the ordering wisdom that founds the cosmos and makes it inherently comprehensible. This understands the created order as reaching a certain high point in the human being, the creature open and drawn beyond itself to the divine. In turn this understands human nature to be a most suitable vessel for the incarnation of the rational Word; he who as uncreated God contains all things now takes to himself that created being that is of its nature open to all things, humanity. The Word of God does not cling to divinity, but empties himself to assume our nature, and in the flesh likewise forsakes himself, even to death on the cross (cf. Philippians 2:6-8). His disciples, and indeed all people, are invited to model themselves on him, the icon of true humanity, thus letting go the self so as to become fully the image of him in whose image we are made.



I am sending him back to you, and with him - I could say - a part of my own self. I know you have been deprived of Onesimus for a time, but it was only so that you could have him back for ever, not as a slave any more, but something much better than a slave, a dear brother; especially dear to me, but how much more to you, as a blood-brother as well as a brother in the Lord. So if all that we have in common means anything to you, welcome him as you would me.

If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.'

Dear Parishioners,

Many beautiful things happened in our community and our homes this year. Now we are thrilled to share another exciting plan for the future of our parish. With our growing community and expanding needs, we are undertaking a vital extension project, to build a parish office and a new multipurpose hall. This new space will not only increase our church capacity when needed but also serve as a center and space for fellowship, meetings, youth activities, family and faith formation events and outreach.

The Hall will be able to accommodate around 180 people. The total cost of this project is approximately around \$4.2 million. We have made some effort to find the money needed and we will have a saving of \$ 3.1 million by the end of August 2025. We hope to finalize the needed documentation process and DA permission by the middle of this October and begin the actual construction by November. If all goes according to plan, we expect completion of the project by October 2026. Recognizing our need, Bishop Vincent has given us his blessing and approval for our parish to go ahead with our initiative.

We are inviting you all to be partners in making this vision a reality. We cannot do this without each of us being generous to our maximum. Every contribution and cooperation bring us closer to building a stronger, more connected parish. Our target is to raise \$1 million.



CHURCH AND HALL EXTENSION - MAIN ENTRY




HALL EXTENSION - SOUTH ENTRY


