Gospel Reflection

The comforting proclamation of the readings for All Souls Day, is that God wills that all people be saved and this has already been accomplished in Christ. The challenging and prophetic aspect of this gospel proclamation is that our eternal life isn't guaranteed only by God's good will and Jesus' dying and rising; it is guaranteed by seeing Jesus and believing in him.

The gospel assurance that God wills all people to be saved is complemented by the second reading which pronounces that our salvation has already been accomplished in Christ through whom we are dead to sin and alive with new life.

This feast day reminds us that God is faithful to God's promise to save and that the victory of

salvation is possible for all. We begin our life by belonging to the Father who wills that not one of us be lost. God's will that we gain everlasting life is so strong that God sent the only-begotten Son to unite with us in our weak humanity so that we might be raised to a share in divine life. But temptations abound. We make choices selfishly to serve ourselves rather than serve others and God. Truly, there is a choice to be made and the choice to live in grace is a constant one. On All Saints Day yesterday, we celebrated the victory of those who were faithful to their commitment to Christ. On All Souls we celebrate God's faithful promise that this victory is possible for all.

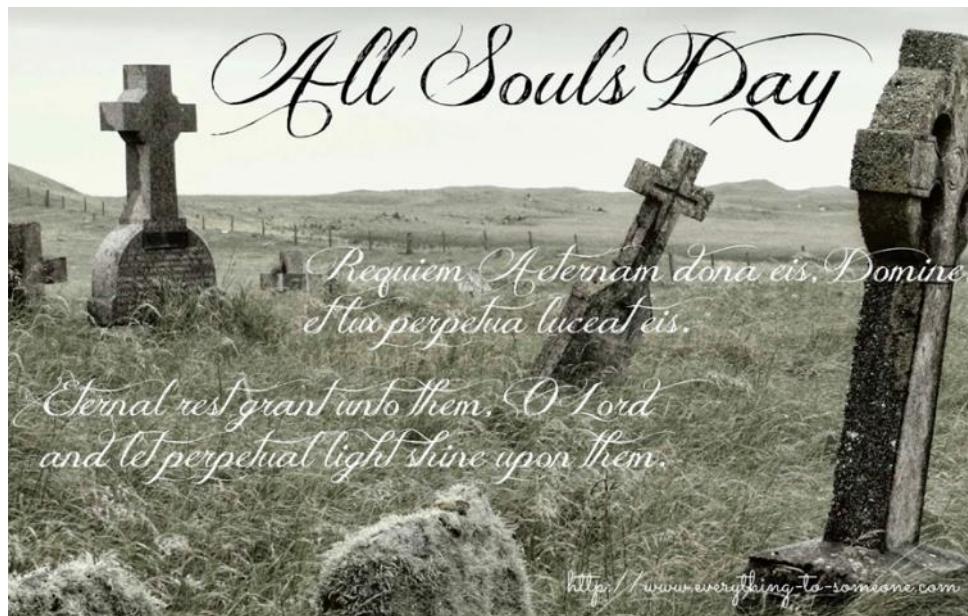

If it is certain that death reigned over everyone as the consequence of one man's fall, it is even more certain that one man, Jesus Christ, will cause everyone to reign in life who receives the free gift that he does not deserve, of being made righteous. Again, as one man's fall brought condemnation on everyone, so the good act of one man brings everyone life and makes them justified. As by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by one man's obedience many will be made righteous. But however great the number of sins committed, grace was even greater; and so, just as sin reigned wherever there was death, so grace will reign to bring eternal life, thanks to the righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ our Lord.

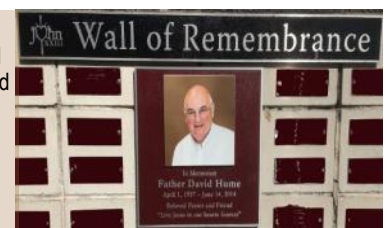

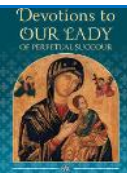

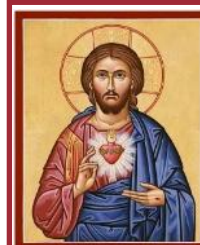

Our Parish Extension Project Is Underway!

This year continues to be a time of great blessings for our parish and our homes. We are nearing the tender process for our long-awaited Parish Extension Project!

With our parish community growing and our ministries flourishing, this project will provide much-needed space to support parish our mission. The development includes the construction of a new parish office and a multipurpose hall, which will not only expand our church's capacity when required but also serve as a welcoming centre for fellowship, meetings, youth gatherings, family and faith formation programs, and community outreach. The new hall will comfortably accommodate up to 180 people.

The total project cost is approximately \$4.2 million. Through your generosity and careful financial stewardship, our parish has \$3.1 million in savings. We have received Bishop Vincent's blessing and approval with completion anticipated by October 2026.

We are inviting everyone to join us in bringing this vision to fruition. Our goal is to raise \$1 million, and with your generous support, we can make this dream a reality. We are the stewards of our parish and we are not just building a hall, we are building the heart of our thriving parish Community. Every contribution, every prayer, and every act of cooperation helps us build not only new facilities but also a stronger, more connected parish family rooted in faith and service.

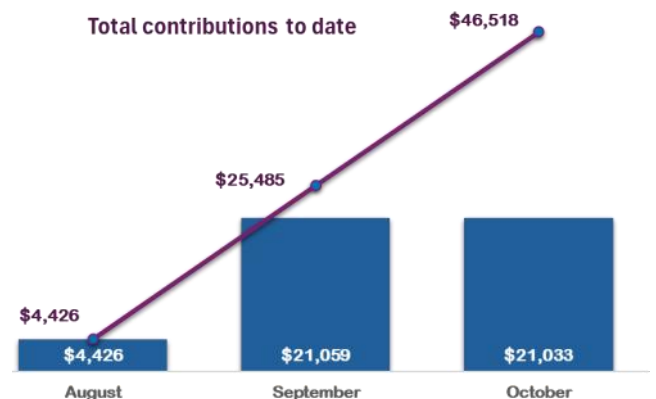

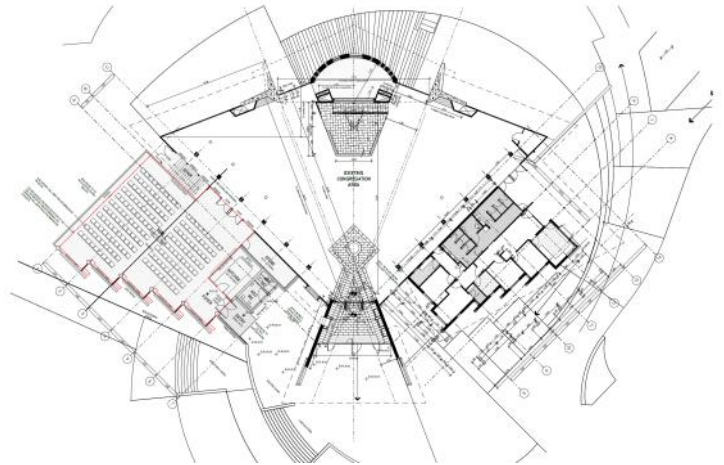
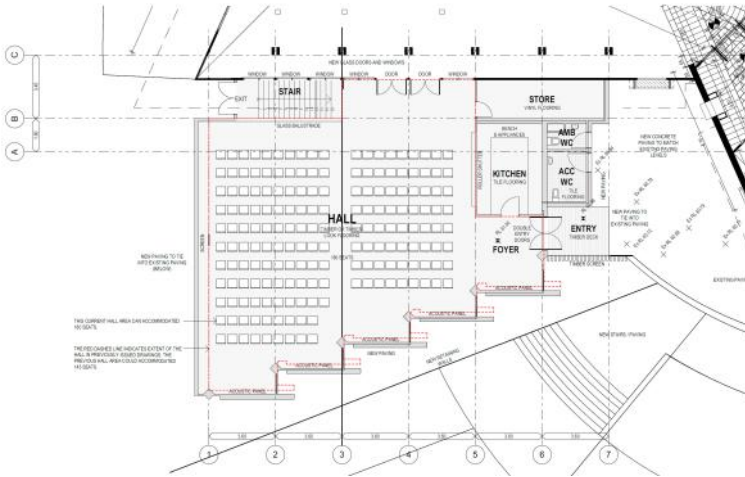


CHURCH AND HALL EXTENSION - WESTERN FACADE

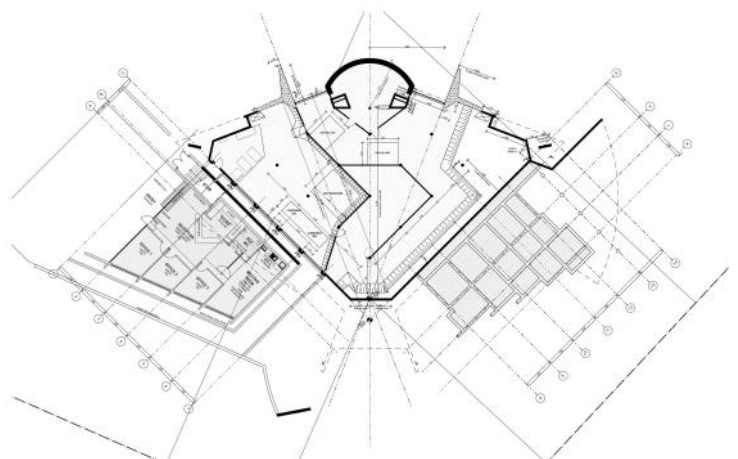
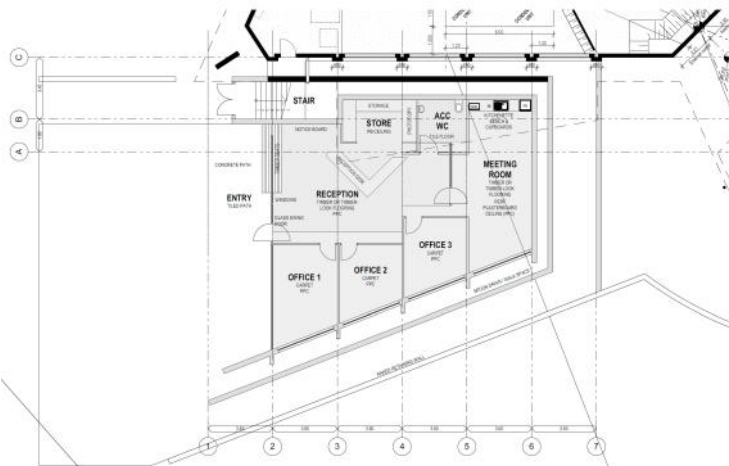


HALL EXTENSION - OFFICE NORTH ENTRY

COMMEMORATING ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

Today, November 2nd, we celebrate the feast of All Souls. On the day after All Saints, the Church reminds us of those who have not yet achieved the goal of their pilgrimage, the Kingdom of Heaven. As part of the communion of saints, they need our prayers. Today's feast is an opportunity for us to pray in unity for our relatives and friends and for those who have no one to pray for them.

The feast of All Souls developed along side the feast of All Saints. The Church has consistently encouraged prayers for the faithful departed. In the early years, a list of the names of the dead was placed in the church so that the community would remember them in prayer.



In the 6th century, Benedictine monasteries held a solemn commemoration of their deceased members on the day after Pentecost. Similar services soon came to be held in other religious communities.

In the first half of the 11th century, St Odilo of Cluny decreed that the Office of the Dead was to be offered for all the souls in purgatory in all monasteries of the order on November 2nd, the day after All Saints. Other orders followed this custom, and soon November 2nd was adopted as the Feast of All Souls for the whole Church.

Various local customs have become attached to the celebration over the years.

In the Middle Ages, many believed that the souls in purgatory appeared on this day, in the form of witches, goblins, and so on, to those who had wronged them during their lives on earth, and special foods were prepared to feed and appease the spirits. Some ethnic groups continue this tradition today.

In the 15th century, the Dominicans instituted the offering of three Masses by every priest on All Souls. This practice quickly became popular in Spain, Portugal and Latin America. During World War I, Pope Benedict XV, in acknowledgment of the vast numbers killed in the war and the number of churches that had been destroyed, granted all priests the privilege of offering three Masses on All Souls.

The new edition of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal once again allows priests to celebrate three Masses on All Souls Day, albeit at different times of the day. Any second Mass must be offered for the souls of all the faithful departed, and a third Mass for the intentions of the pope.

Three sets of Mass texts are given for the celebration of All Souls. The prayers in the first set are more for the worshippers than the departed, with a strong plea for consolation and hope. The second contains imagery of the purgation of souls, but through gentle terms like washing, cleansing, purification. The third set emphasises the victory of Jesus over sin and death. Baptismal imagery is strongly evident in the latter two Masses.

Every celebration of Mass includes prayers for the dead. A particular feast like All Souls gives a special focus to the basic Christian instinct and traditional Catholic practice of remaining in communion with those who have gone before us 'marked with the sign of faith'.
