ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

e traditional custodians of the lands in which the Catholic Parish of St John XXIII and the Diocese of Parramatta sits, the land of the Darug and Gundungurra Aboriginal Elders past, present and future for they hold the traditions, memories and wisdom of Mother Earth on which we place our feet upon today.

Gospel Reflection

The accounts of the birth of Jesus by Matthew and Luke reflect different perspectives: in Matthew we see things from Joseph's point of view, while in Luke we see from Mary's. Matthew tells us of Joseph's response to the information that his betrothed, Mary, "was found to be with child, through the Holy Spirit", and later we read of his actions to take care of her and the child in the face of peril; Mary is neither spoken to nor speaks in the entire work. In Luke it is Mary who is spoken to and speaks, while Joseph is silent, though he is also active. Matthew and Luke agree that Joseph was a descendant of David, and neither report any further role of Joseph past the childhood narratives. Both approaches are catered for in today's Collect, for the observation that "the Incarnation... was made known by the message of an Angel" fits equally with both gospels. So too does the Prayer over the Offerings, referring to Mary's womb being filled with the power of the Holy Spirit; this is the first Prayer over the Offerings in Advent to have a specific reference to the season and coming feast. This is true also of the Prayer after Communion. Thus at all levels this Sunday marks a decided turn in the emphasis of Advent away from Christ's future return towards celebrating the mystery of the Incarnation in history. In fact this turn manifests first on 17 December (unless it is the 3rd Sunday of Advent), and is seen on all the weekdays of this time, with the exception that in these days the "O" antiphons for the Magnificatat Vespers, deployed also in variant forms for the Gospel Acclamations at Mass, continue the theme of looking forward to Christ's second coming, even urgently begging for that day and Christ to come. This incessant request always highlights the joyful anticipation of his coming with salvation, and thus is not an end to be feared. We read from Luke's gospel on this Sunday in Years B & C, so Year A is the only one in which we reflect on Joseph's role; of importance is that Joseph is the descendant of David, and through him Jesus is also David's heir. This reading is accompanied by the famous prophesy in Isaiah for the coming birth of the one who will be called Emmanuel-literally, God-with-us. The responsorial Psalm, Ps 24(23) is of particular importance; it follows the same reading on 20 December (when not a Sunday) and is in the entrance antiphon on 22 December (when not a Sunday)-and so it appears at least once every year in the days before Christmas. Historically it is associated with the Ark of the Covenant being taken into its new abode in the first Temple; though it is Solomon who takes the Ark in, it is David's song that opens the way, and thus it came to have an important place in Jewish thought and liturgy: it is morning prayer's Psalm of the Day on Sundays, and it is sung daily in Ashkenazi synagogues as the Torah scroll is taken back to the "ark", the scroll's special storage place. In our liturgies it has a similar role as we prepare to celebrate the Lord's "entrance" into the world in the Incarnation, and it is used on the feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, and for his entry into Jerusalem on Passion Sunday. The Ark was celebrated not for its own sake, but for what it contained and signified; it contained the summary of the Law (the 10 Commandments carved on the stone tablets) and the Mercy Seat, the golden lid with its two carved cherubim that together delineated the empty space designating the invisible presence of God who cannot be be held by creatures. Christ is giver of the new commandment, establishing the New Covenant, also embodies God's mercy. In consequence, though it sounds a little odd to us at first, for bearing him Mary has been called the Ark of the New Covenant. Merging all the imagery, the readings present Joseph in the place of David, leading the new Ark to its new abode, leading Mary who bears the embodied Law and source of mercy.

Through him we received grace and our apostolic mission to preach the obedience of faith to all pagan nations in honour of his name. You are one of these nations, and by his call belong to Jesus Christ. To you all, then, who are God's beloved in Rome, called to be saints, may God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send grace and peace.

Gospel Matthew 1:18-24

Jesus was born of Mary, the betrothed of Joseph, a son of David.

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, and said 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.' Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel,



Parish Hall/Office Project Plan









Hall Floor Plan



Dear Brothers and Sisters.

The tragedy at Bondi Beach yesterday has shocked and deeply saddened our entire community, with many carrying fear, grief and unanswered questions.

Such violence is a grave assault on human dignity and can never be justified. We condemn this act unequivocally and reject all hatred that seeks to harm innocent people. There is no place for antisemitism, especially in Australia.

Together with all people, and with the wisdom of the Holy Spirit, we stand in solidarity with the Jewish community and pray for all those affected – those who have lost their lives or been injured, and the many individuals, families and communities whose lives have been changed in an instant.

We also pray for the first responders, healthcare workers, and members of the public who acted with courage and compassion in the face of danger – protecting others, offering help and bringing calm and support amid uncertainty. These acts of self-giving love and care reflect the very best of our humanity, our shared values, and our hope for each other.

Let us continue to offer our care, compassion and prayers, calling on Mary, our Mother and Queen of Peace, to intercede for us.

At times like this, it is vital that we do not allow fear or anger to divide us. Violence, retaliation and discrimination are never the answer, even in the face of terrorism and antisemitism.

As Pope Leo XIV reminds us, peace is "an unarmed peace and a disarming peace, humble and persevering. It comes from God, God who loves us all unconditionally." This is the peace to which we are called, even when the path is difficult.

I invite our Diocesan community to pray for healing, for comfort for all who mourn, and for a renewed commitment to unity, mutual respect and peace across our diverse faiths and cultures. May we continue to stand together against violence in all its forms. May God be close to all who are suffering, and may His peace rest upon our community.


