Our PARISH MISSION

The Parish of St John XXIII is a faith community with the Eucharist as its heart. Inspired by John XXIII's prophetic opening of the windows of the Church, we welcome the fresh air of the Holy Spirit, inviting every person to share in the responsibility of enriching the life and faith of our community by sharing their gifts and talents.'

Gospel Reflection

The feast of the Baptism of the Lord and this Second Sunday go very nicely together. The baptism of Jesus was all about the start of his mission, and the readings of today are all about our mission. To be a baptised person is to be a person on a mission.

Our gospel passage this Sunday is taken from John. It is rare to read from John during the Sundays in Ordinary Time. For all the other Sundays in Ordinary Time we shall be reading from Matthew. The mission of Jesus is well expressed in John's Gospel here when John the Baptiser calls him the lamb of God. He was to be the lamb of God and the lamb for God. The lamb was the number one sacrificial animal in Jewish worship. To sacrifice something is, technically, to dedicate it to God. With a living creature there was no fuller way of showing that it had been handed over to God than to take its life. Life is precious and to give a life is to give all that the creature has. Jesus was our lamb for God; he gave his life and shed his blood; he gave everything he was and everything he had to repair the damage done to our relationship with God in Adam. This is why in our eucharistic liturgy we repeat the words of John the Baptiser as we say 'Behold the lamb of God' with the broken bread that is his body and with the wine poured out that is his blood. The mission of Jesus was to have his body broken and his blood spilt. What is more, not only is Jesus the sacrifice humankind has offered to God but God indeed has given us Jesus in the first place as the gift to be that sacrifice. Jesus is both the lamb of God and the lamb for God.

Today we proclaim the second of the Suffering Servant songs of Second Isaiah (an anonymous prophet of the sixth century BC, while Israel was in exile), found in chapters 40 to 55 of the book of Isaiah. It speaks of the call by God of one who was not only to restore the survivors of the Jewish exile back to their homeland, but to be a light of the nations. Remember we heard at Epiphany that 'nations' is the code word for foreigners, for non-Jews, for us. The mission of the Suffering Servant was to bring God's salvation to the ends of the earth. This was the mission of Jesus. Following Jewish interpretation of the Suffering Servant songs, we can also say that it was not his mission alone. In the Jewish tradition these songs are given a corporate interpretation. As much as they apply to an individual they apply to a people. In baptism we become part of that people. Our mission is to be the servant of the Lord. Our mission is to call Israel back from exile. Our mission is to be the light of the nations. Our mission is to bring God's salvation to the ends of the world. To be a baptised person is to be a person of mission.

In response to God's call, in response to God's voice spoken not only to Jesus at his baptism, 'This is my Son, the Beloved', but to each one of us at our baptism, 'This is my son, this is my daughter', our mission is to join with the psalmist and say 'Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will' (cf. Ps 39[40]:7-8). God does not want sacrifice; Jesus was enough. What God wants is our open ear, our availability, our willingness to announce God's justice in the great assemblies of our lives. To be a baptised person is to be a person of mission.

From today until the start of Lent our second reading will be taken from Paul's first letter to the Christians of Corinth. At the very start of the letter Paul announces that he has been appointed by God, that he is an apostle, that he is to send greetings to the church, the people of God. Like Paul we are called by God to bring greetings, to bring good news to those whom we meet. To be a baptised person is to be a person of mission.

Brothers and sisters, let us give thanks to the Lord our God. Let us give thanks that our God believes in us. From our mother's womb God has called each one of us. God entrusts us with the mission of being light to the world, God nourishes us with the broken body of the lamb, with the blood of the lamb poured out, so that we too can allow our bodies to be broken and our blood to be poured out in the service of our world.







PARTS OF THE HOLY MASS IN ORDER

The Holy Mass in the Roman Rite is structured into four main parts: the Introductory Rites, the Liturgy of the Word, the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and the Concluding Rites.

1. Introductory Rites

These rites help the faithful assemble as a community and prepare to hear the Word of God and celebrate the Eucharist.

- **Entrance:** A procession of the priest and ministers accompanied by an entrance song.
- **Greeting:** The priest begins with the Sign of the Cross and a formal greeting.
- **Penitential Act:** A time for the congregation to acknowledge their sins and ask for God's mercy.
- **Kyrie (Lord, Have Mercy):** An ancient prayer for mercy, usually in three parts.
- **Gloria:** A hymn of praise sung on Sundays (outside of Advent and Lent) and feast days.
- **Collect (Opening Prayer):** The priest invites everyone to pray in silence before "collecting" these prayers into one spoken prayer.

2. Liturgy of the Word

The central focus is hearing the scriptures and the explanation of God's Word.

- **First Reading:** Usually from the Old Testament.
- **Responsorial Psalm:** A psalm is sung or recited typically in response to the first reading.
- **Second Reading:** Usually from the New Testament Letters, often omitted on weekdays.
- **Gospel Acclamation:** The Alleluia (or other verse in Lent) sung to welcome the Gospel.
- **Gospel Readings:** A reading from one of the four Gospels.
- **Homily:** The priest or deacon explains the readings and applies them to daily life.
- **Profession of Faith (Creed):** The congregation recites the Nicene or Apostles' Creed on Sundays and solemnities.
- **Universal Prayer (Prayer of the Faithful):** Petitions for the Church, the world, and local needs.

3. Liturgy of the Eucharist

This is the "center and summit" of the Mass, where the sacrifice of Christ is made present.

- **Presentation and Preparation of the Gifts:** Bread and wine are brought to the altar, often accompanied by a collection for the poor and the clergy needs.
- **Eucharistic Prayer:** The most solemn part of the Mass, including the Consecration, where the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.
- **Communion Rite:**
 - The Lord's Prayer (Our Father):** Recited or sung together.
 - Sign of Peace:** A ritual exchange of Christ's peace
 - Lamb of God: (Agnus Dei):** A prayer for mercy as the bread is broken.
 - Holy Communion:** The distribution of the Eucharist to the faithful.
 - Prayer after Communion:** The priest prays that the sacrament will be effective in the lives of the people.

4. Concluding Rites

- **Brief notices:** For the community a collection taken for the needs of the parish.
- **Greetings and Blessing:** The priest imparts a final blessing in the name of the Holy Trinity (Father, Son and the Holy Spirit.)
- **Dismissal:** The priest dismisses the congregation to go in peace and serve the Lord.
- **Recessional Hymn:** People leave singing with joy to continue the Lord's work.
